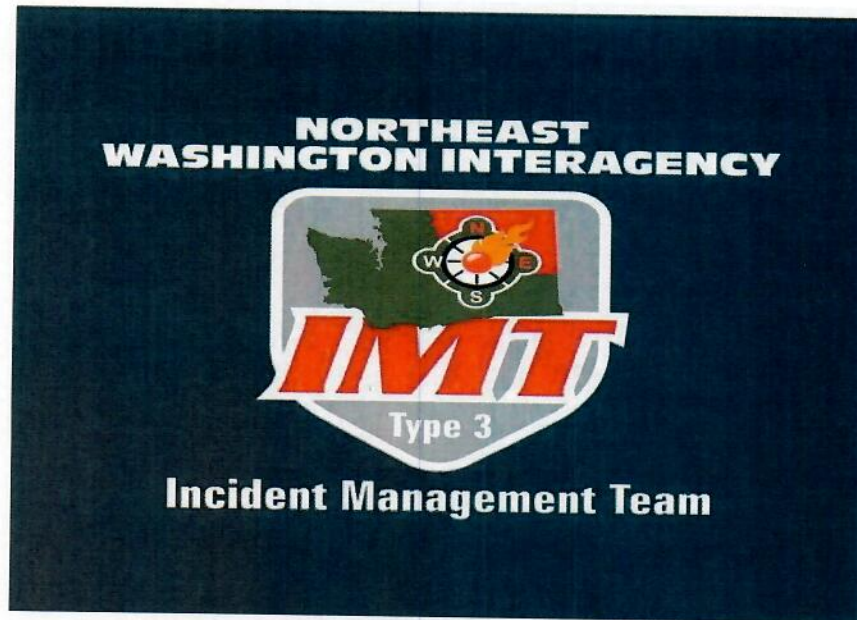

A storm system enters the Pacific NW Friday and shifts through
the region this weekend. This will bring clouds and increasing
rain chances, starting later Friday and continuing through the
weekend. Downslope flow off the Cascades may result in only light rain
amounts for the Muckamuck Fire through Saturday with low confidence in
a wetting rain.

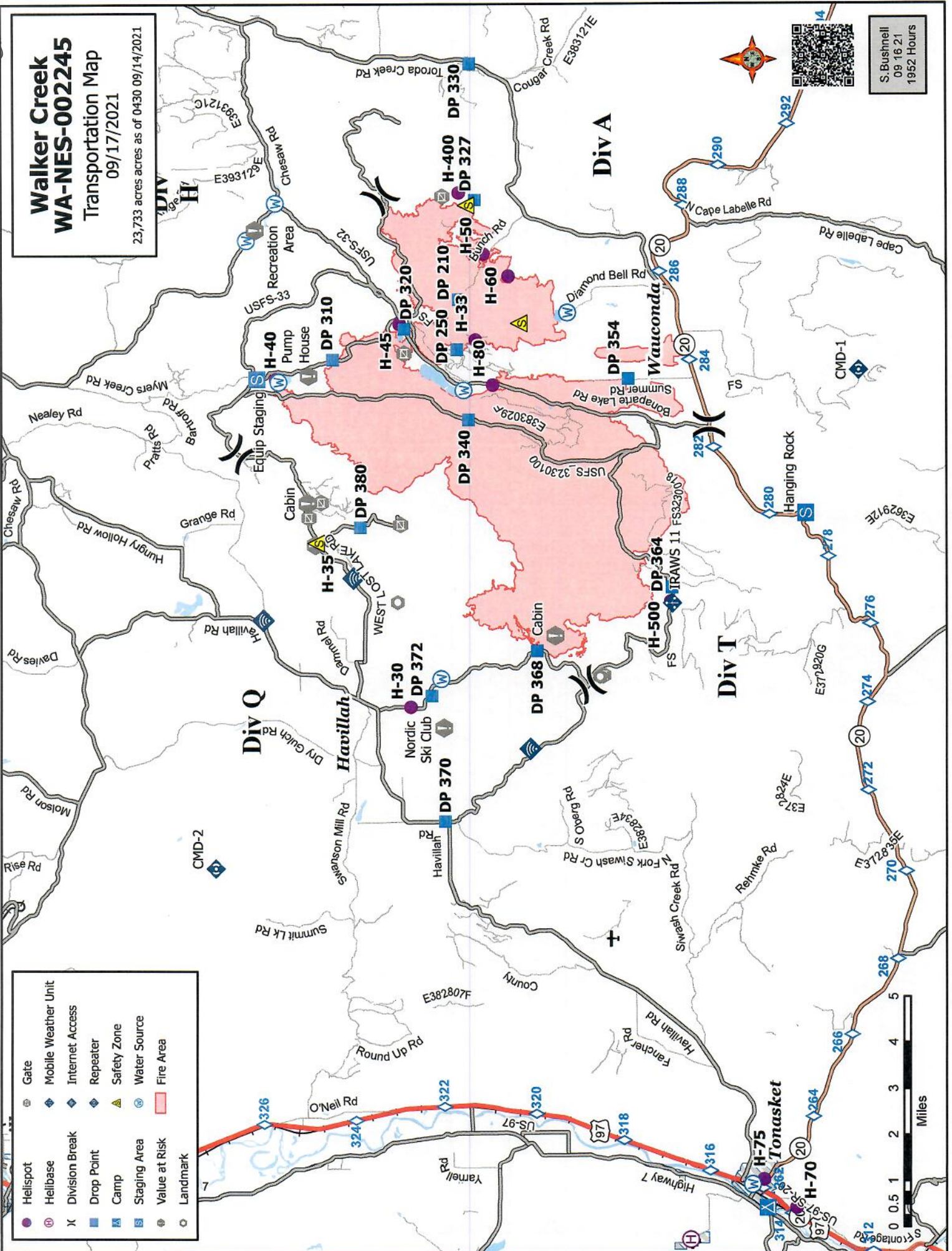

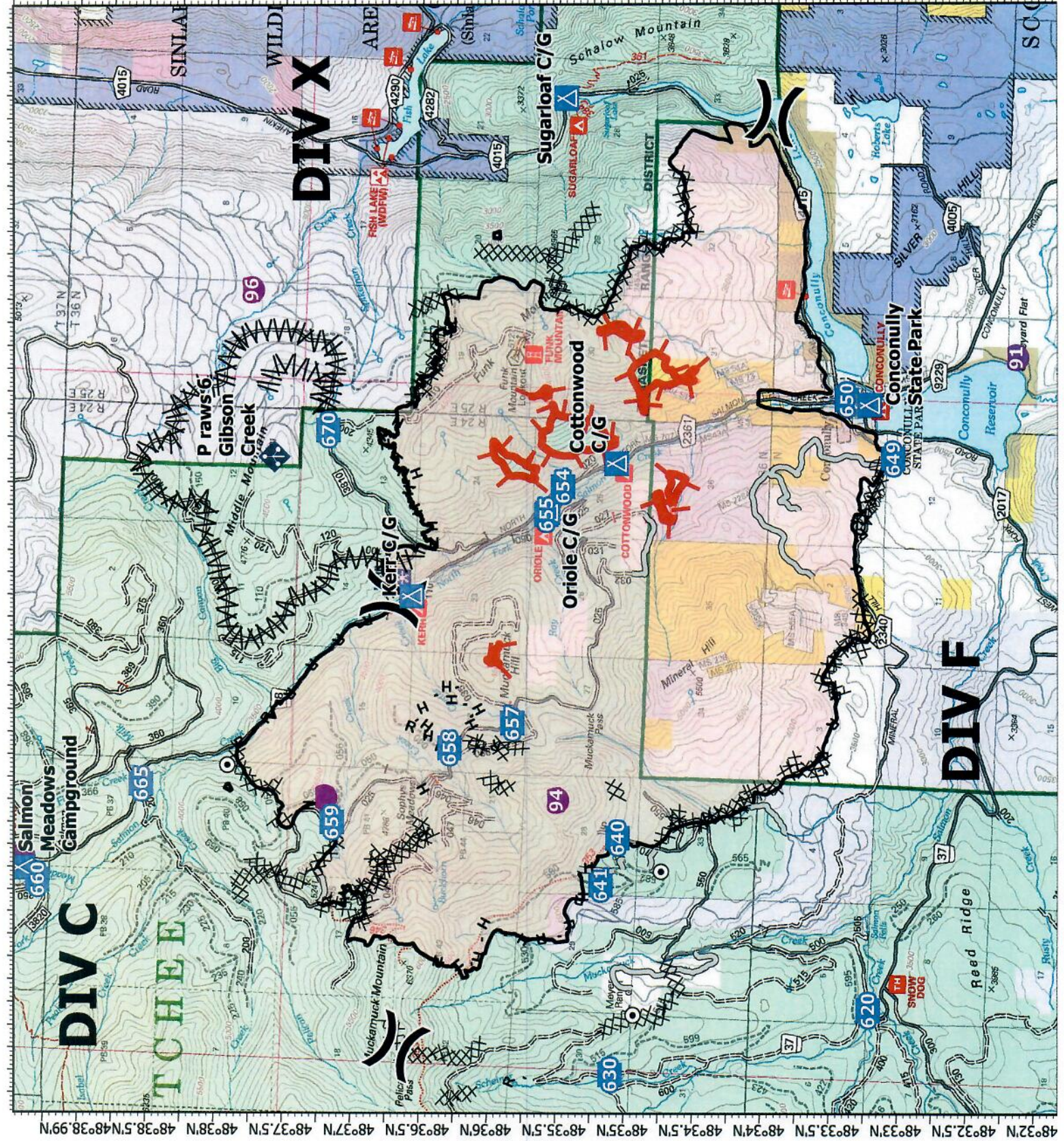

Weather Change and Conditions



- Some things to think about when it is raining/wet:
- Working & Camping – Set up tarps and make sure water cannot get into your tent or supplies. Dress in layers and use rain gear when working in the rain. Have a dry change of clothes to change into at end of shift. Remove mud from boots so that they will dry quicker. Eat hot meals whenever possible. Know the symptoms for hypothermia and look for them in yourself and others.
- Hypothermia Symptoms – Signs of beginning hypothermia are:
 - Shivering; slow, shallow breathing; a slow, weak pulse; drowsiness; memory loss
 - Slurred speech; confusion and loss of coordination
- Hypothermia Treatment – Warm the Individual by:
 - Removing all wet clothing and getting them in dry clothes, sitting them by a fire or in a sleeping bag.
 - Use other people’s body warmth to help warm the chilled individual.
 - Eat or drink warm foods and fluids which are high in carbohydrates.
 - Protect the person against wind, drafts, and further heat loss with warm, dry clothes and blankets.
 - Move gently to a warm, dry shelter as soon as possible.
- Hazard trees - the rain softens the ground making snags and green trees less stable. Scout areas ahead of engaging, especially for mop-up operations. Flag and avoid hazardous trees or fall them if it can be done safely.
- Footing – Be extra careful walking on wet surfaces. Watch where you place your feet. Step over logs if you can to avoid slipping.

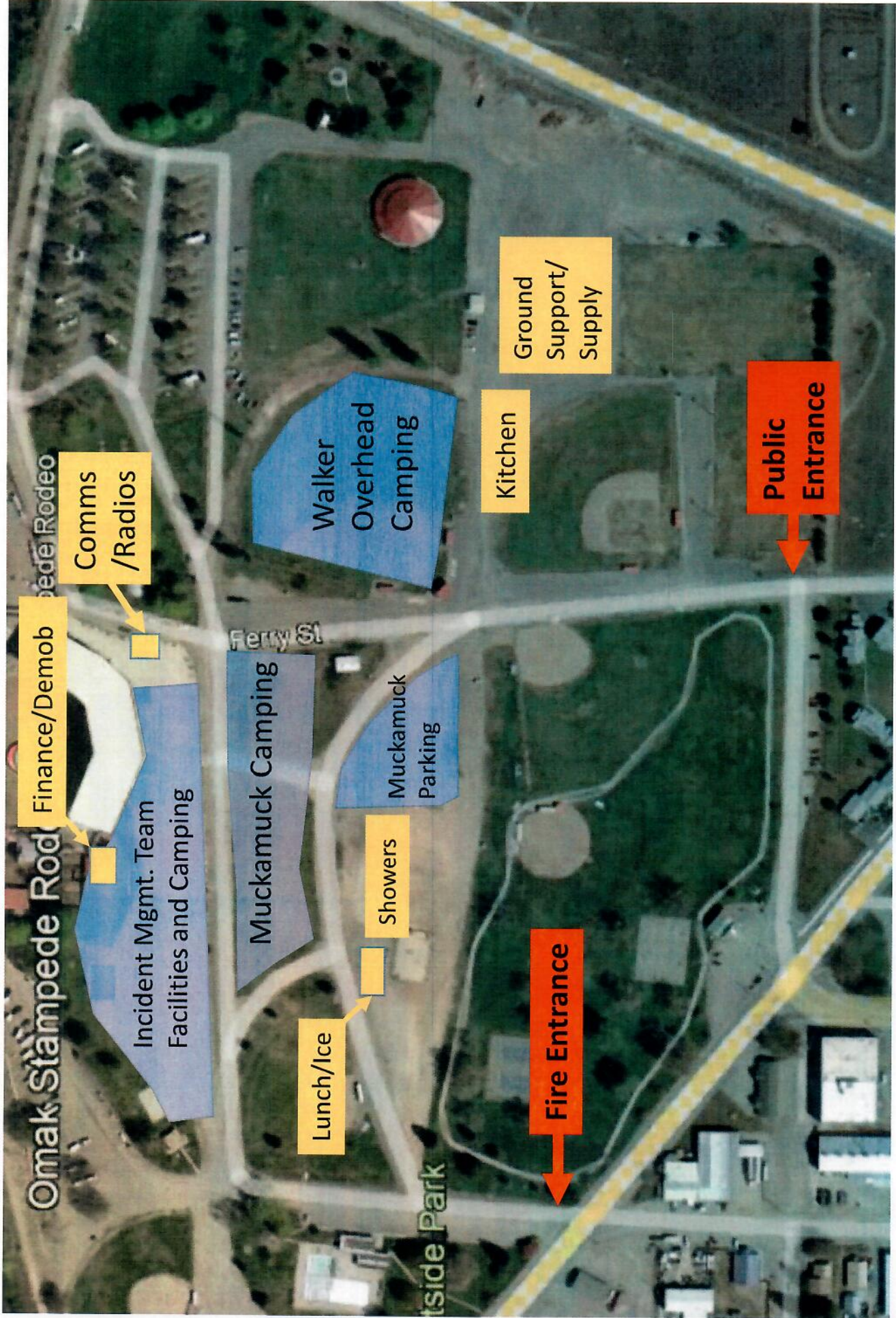
