
**Major Hazards and Risks: FLASH FLOODING IN FIRE SCARRED AREAS.**

**Do you know the difference between a Flash Flood Watch and a Flash Flood Warning? A Flash Flood Watch means a Flash Flood is possible in your area. A Flash Flood Warning means Flash Flooding is already occurring or will occur soon in your area. Move immediately to higher ground or stay on high ground.**

## Narrative:

- Keep informed on local weather reports. Listen to the advice of local officials.
- Keep an Emergency Kit and check it before an emergency. Replenish any items missing or in short supply.
- Turn around, don't drown. If driving, turn around and go another way. If you are caught on a flooded road and waters are rising rapidly around you, get out of the car quickly and move to higher ground. Most cars can be swept away by less than two feet of moving water.
- Stay away from flood waters. If you come upon a flowing stream where water is above your ankles, stop, turn around and go another way.
- Be especially cautious at night when it is harder to see flood danger.
- After a flood, do not attempt to return to the affected areas until officials say it is safe to do so.
- If power lines are down, stay away and do not step in puddles or standing water.
- Have an evacuation plan and review the plan regularly to minimize confusion and fear during the event.
