FUELS: The fires are burning mostly in mixed conifer timber consisting of Douglas-fir, western larch, Engelmann spruce, and lodgepole pine below 6,000'. Sub-alpine fir, white bark pine, and lodgepole pine occur above 6,000'. All timber types have ladder fuels with black moss/lichens that make for an easy transition to crown fire. Dead fine fuels, grass (where not heavily grazed), and slash will increase surface fire spread. Most live fuels, except for red alder, are available to carry fire and fuel moistures will continue to drop with seasonal drying. Live fuels are still drought stressed.

GENERAL: Cooler, slightly higher humidity and breezy northerly winds today. Continued elevated fire behavior potential today as a result of the breezy conditions. Expect smoldering and creeping fire behavior in available fuels. As the humidity drops and winds increase, potential for isolated areas of surface fire transitioning to torching with spotting exists. In areas where there is wind/slope alignment along with available surface and ladder fuels, a short upslope run could occur. Continue to watch for hold over spots from previous fire activity. Pitchy/punky wood and fine fuels still will be receptive fuel beds. Any spotting will be short range.

SPECIFIC:

Chickadee: Expect continued active fire behavior potential with the breezy conditions. Smoldering and creeping fire behavior with areas of backing and flanking. In areas where wind/slope alignment exist, expect higher fire activity with potential for torching and spotting. Winds will be northerly today in the Sinlahekin.

Probability of Ignition will approach 50% unshaded and 30% shaded.

COVID-19 DEMOB MESSAGE

Our concern for your health and safety doesn't stop when you leave the incident. In addition to driving safely, it's important to continue monitoring your health. The amount of energy you spent while fighting this fire will limit your body's ability to fight off an infection. A process is in place to provide appropriate care for fire personnel who have been determined to have been exposed to, developed symptoms of, or have a confirmed diagnosis of COVID-19. This process includes evaluation, testing as appropriate, quarantine and/or isolation, including working isolation for cases with mild or no symptoms, and patient care as deemed necessary following CDC guidelines and guidance from the local health jurisdiction. The responsible agencies and NW Team 12 have offered COVID-19 PCR testing to all resources assigned to the Walker Creek and Chickadee Fires. We strongly encourage everyone assigned to these incidents to avail themselves of this testing before departing the fire. If you choose not to be tested, it is imperative that you remain vigilant in monitoring for symptoms moving forward.

As you travel to your next destination, please:

- Limit the number of stops between the fire and your destination. If you do stop, remember to wear a face covering to avoid exposure. Please document any location where you stopped for contact tracing purposes;
- If there are two or more people in the vehicle, please remember to wear a face covering to create social distancing and limit exposure to someone who may be sick;
- Continue to monitor yourself and your co-workers for signs and symptoms of COVID-19. These include:
 - Sudden shortness of breath or trouble breathing;
 - o Muscle pain that goes beyond what you would normally feel after fighting a fire;
 - o New and sudden loss of taste or smell;
 - o Unusual fatique;
 - o Fever or chills;
 - o Headache that is different than what is normal after firefighting; or
 - o Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea

If you experience any of these symptoms, please proceed to your home destination avoiding any further stops. After arriving home, immediately contact your doctor, an urgent care clinic, or your local health department to receive further instructions for care and testing. You should avoid contact with others until you receive further instruction.

Continue to practice frequent hand hygiene, washing frequently with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds and using hand sanitizer frequently. Avoid touching your face, eyes, and mouth with your hands. Remember to thoroughly wipe down your vehicle with appropriate disinfectant upon arriving at your destination. Upon arriving at your destination, please contact your individual agency to determine if they have separate infection and exposure control procedures when returning from an assignment and follow their guidance. We wish you a safe and healthy trip home or to your next destination.



NW Team 12 cares about the health and safety of all of our firefighting resources. We understand that many of you will go from this assignment home to your families or on to other assignments. We appreciate the effort you all have put into maintaining the COVID mitigation standards while here on the incident. This will help prevent viral spread in camp and on the line. To support and continue this prevention, NW Team 12 is providing COVID-19 PCR testing for all resources assigned to the Walker Creek/Chickadee Fires. These tests will be provided at designated stations near camps and spike locations for the convenience of firefighting resources free of charge.

Forms to sign up for the PCR testing at your location will be distributed ahead of testing date. In the event of a positive test, there are plans in place to keep firefighters working while safely isolated from others if they have mild or no symptoms. We encourage everyone assigned to the fire to sign up for testing so you can travel home or on to your next assignment without worry of spreading the virus. We thank you for your service on these and other fires and wish you continued good health and productivity this fire season.

We will start offering testing Monday in a scheduled format. Branch 2 will be the first location that will have testing available to you. Tuesday Branch 1 will have testing available followed by Chickadee (formerly Branch 3) on Wednesday. You will need to fill out the paperwork one day prior to testing this will streamline the process. Support personnel in the Tonasket camp will also be scheduled.

We are doing our best to minimize risk and exposure to you and your families as well as the firefighters. Please consider being tested to protect your self's and others. NW IMT 12 will be testing also.

Walker Creek/Chickadee Fires COVID-19 PCR Testing Frequently Asked Questions:

Who should be PCR tested for COVID-19?

Based on the number of positive COVID-19 cases on the Walker Creek/Chickadee Fires,
 Okanogan County Public Health has advised ALL firefighters assigned to the fires to be tested.

What happens if I test positive?

- If you test positive for COVID-19 but have mild or no symptoms, NW Team 12 has a plan in place to keep firefighters working while safely isolated from other crews. A positive test does not automatically mean you will be isolated and unable to work.
- If you test positive and your symptoms are more severe, NW Team 12 will work with Okanogan County Public Health to find the best solution for your isolation and recovery in coordination with your home unit.

What happens if I choose not to be tested?

- Firefighters who are not tested and have NO COVID-19 symptoms will be allowed to keep working, but will be isolated from other crews to prevent further spread from unidentified cases.
- Firefighters who choose not to be tested but ARE displaying COVID-19 like symptoms will be required to isolate according to Okanogan County Public Health recommendations and will not be allowed to continue working.

When and how will I get my test results?

 With the current backlog of tests at area labs, your test results will not be available for 24-48 hours, or in some cases longer. There will be no change to your work status while we await results. You will be able to access your results online as soon as they are available. Details will be provided to you when you are tested.



- 6. Tap 'Done'; the map will begin downloading











- Sore throat?
- New loss of taste or smell?
- Fatigue, outside your normal for firefighting?
- Headache, outside your normal for firefighting?
- Congestion or runny nose, outside your normal for firefighting?
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

- All personnel are required to wear a mask at all times, whether indoors or outdoors, unless working alone or actively engaged in firefighting on the fireline.

- Send crew representatives to pick up meals masks must be worn in food lines.
- Wash hands frequently and disinfect high-traffic areas on a regular basis.

EMERGENCY PLAN INCIDENT WITHIN AN INCIDENT

ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER

In the event of an accident or medical incident of any size, your primary responsibility is to ENSURE that the victim(s) receive prompt and effective Triage, Treatment, Extrication and Transport.

- ENSURE THE MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORT IN THE INCIDENT ACTION PLAN IS BEING USED AND FOLLOWED- *IF DETERMINED TO BE A GREEN, DO NOT DECLARE EMERGENCY TRAFFIC AND ONLY COMPLETE LINE 1-4 ON MIR*.
- Conduct size-up of the incident nature of accident, number type of resources involved, latitude and longitude location (DD°MMM.MM format): notify incident communications center and supervisor, request assistance as needed.
- Order and coordinate medical and support response to the accident.
- Evaluate special needs (law enforcement, haz mat, etc.).
- Clear the command frequency if medical emergency, coordinate with incident communications and air attack for air medical transportation needs.
- Preserve and photograph the scene for accident investigation.
- Remain aware of surroundings and the status of the main incident (delegate personnel to monitor the main fire) to ensure safety of medical treatment personnel.
- Until relieved, supervise and manage all personnel involved at the incident scene.
