### \*\*\*Minor Frontal Passage – Winds West and Breezy\*\*\*

A weak cold front will push across North Central Washington today, but it won't bring cooler weather, any precipitation, or a sudden shift in winds. Just variable clouds and sun, more breezy winds from the southwest and west, and continued warm and dry conditions. Today's highs may drop a degree or two, but expect the afternoon highs to top out in the 70s. The relative humidity will rise a bit, but still be considered relatively low. Monday and Tuesday a flat ridge of high pressure forms over the Pac NW. This will keep a dry southwest flow over the region. Temperatures will warm, and humidity will fall, with moderate afternoon breezes.

Sub-alpine fir, white bark pine, and lodgepole pine occur above 6,000'. All timber types have ladder fuels with black moss/lichens that make for an easy transition to crown fire. Dead fine fuels, grass (where not heavily grazed), and slash can increase surface fire spread. Most live fuels, except for red alder, are available to carry fire and fuel moistures will continue to drop with seasonal drving. Live fuels are still drought stressed. **GENERAL:** Fire behavior potential continues to be slightly above average for this time of year. Generally, expect smoldering and creeping fire behavior on both fires. Areas of heavy needle cast will also see smoldering and creeping fire behavior. Potential for isolated torching remains due to abundant ladder fuels. Some limited areas will have backing and flanking fire behavior with torching. Expect a notable increase in fire behavior potential as the humidity drops to 30% or lower. Additionally, in locations where fire edges are exposed to afternoon winds, an increase in intensity and at times moderate fire spread. Unshaded surface fuels will be more available to carry fire. SPECIFIC: Chickadee: Continued smoldering and creeping fire behavior in scattered areas of the fire. In limited areas of unburned islands and areas of dirty burns, expect periodic backing and flanking fire spread. Still potential for torching and short-range spotting with the abundant ladder fuels. Areas exposed to winds have potential to see an increase in intensity. Fuel Moistures- Aeneas LO WIMS data from yesterday were- 10-hour 10%, 100-hour 13%, 1000-hour 13%. ERC 47. Chickadee IRAWS on Cecil Creek Road, yesterday's minimum 10-hr fuel moisture was 6%. Probability of Ignition will approach 60% unshaded and 40% shaded. Walker: Scattered smoldering and creeping fire behavior today with continued potential for isolated torching where ladder fuels are above and surface fire. In DIV Q, where much of the fire edge is interior to control lines, backing and flanking in heavy surface fuels will continue along with periodic torching. West to southwest winds channeling through saddles will increase fire intensity so potential also exists for limited short upslope runs. #### Walker Creek/Chickadee Fires COVID-19 Information

#### Who should be PCR tested for COVID-19?

• Based on the number of positive COVID-19 cases on the Walker Creek/Chickadee Fires, Okanogan County Public Health has advised ALL firefighters assigned to the fires to be tested.

#### How can I get tested?

• If you missed the opportunity to get a COVID-19 PCR test at your assigned branch location, OR if you develop COVID-like symptoms/are made aware of close contact with someone who tests positive for COVID-19, contact the NW Team 12 Health Liaison at 509-675-3504 to make testing arrangements.

#### What happens if I test positive?

- If you test positive for COVID-19 but have mild or no symptoms, NW Team 12 has a plan in place to keep firefighters working while safely isolated from other crews. A positive test does not automatically mean you will be isolated and unable to work. It is imperative that you notify your supervisor of positive test results if you are tested somewhere other than our designated locations on the fire, so that we can manage your working isolation away from other resources.
- If you test positive and your symptoms are more severe, NW Team 12 will work with Okanogan County Public Health to find the best solution for your isolation and recovery in coordination with your home unit.

#### What happens if I choose not to be tested?

- Firefighters who are not tested and have NO COVID-19 symptoms will be allowed to keep working, but will be isolated from other crews to prevent further spread from unidentified cases.
- Firefighters who choose not to be tested but ARE displaying COVID-19 like symptoms will be required to isolate according to Okanogan County Public Health recommendations and will not be allowed to continue working.

#### When and how will I get my test results?

• With the current backlog of tests at area labs, your test results may not be available for 24-48 hours, or in some cases longer. There will be no change to your work status while we await results. You will be able to access your results online as soon as they are available. Details will be provided to you when you are tested.

#### Is rapid testing available?

Rapid testing is available at all times, however these tests are most accurate for symptomatic patients and might not catch someone who is asymptomatic but still carrying COVID-19, which is why we recommend PCR testing for firefighters who might have been exposed but are not showing symptoms.

#### WALKER CREEK/CHICKADEE FIRE COVID-19 MITIGATIONS

Supervisors are required to go over this list each morning with assigned resources- report any symptoms to medical unit. \*take temperature with no touch thermometer, if available\*

In the last 24 hours have you experienced:

- Cough more than expected?
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
- Fever? Chills?
- Sore throat?
- New loss of taste or smell?

- Fatigue, outside your normal for firefighting?
- Headache, outside your normal for firefighting?
- Congestion or runny nose?
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- All personnel are required to wear a mask at all times, whether indoors or outdoors, unless working alone or actively engaged in firefighting on the fireline.
- $\circ$   $\:$  Use radio or Zoom link provided to join briefings remotely.
- Observe 6ft Distancing at all times.
- $\circ$   $\;$  Send crew representatives to pick up meals masks must be worn in food lines.
- Wash hands frequently and disinfect high-traffic areas on a regular basis.

#### Incident Maps How to Download Maps in Avenza

If you're cell signal is poor you may need to connect to a wifi to download maps. However sometimes being connected to a wifi can slow map downloads. You'll just have to find out what works best.


Method 1: From a browser - If you have a good cell or wifi signal

- 1. Tap on the desired map link and wait for the preview. *If it fails to load, use method 2 instead*
- 2. Tap the 'send to' icon (square with up arrow)
- 3. Choose the Avenza app

Method 2: From Avenza direct – if you don't have a good cell or wifi signal

- 1. Tap and hold on the desired map link, then choose 'copy' to copy the direct URL to the map
- 2. Launch the Avenza app
- 3. When not in any map... Tap the + (plus) icon at the top of the screen
- 4. Choose the load from URL option (last choice)
- 5. Paste the direct URL to the map
- 6. Tap 'Done' ; the map will begin downloading




#### How to Send Map Updates to the Situation Unit


- 1. From within the map in Avenza, click the pin with three lines near the lower-right corner.
- 2. *iPhone:* In the lower right, click the square with up arrow. From the pop-up menu, choose Export to Others.

Android: In the lower right, click the circle with three lines. Click the pop-up circle with up arrow.

- 3. Set these options:
  - a. Filename leave alone
  - b. Export Format choose SHP, GPX or KML
  - c. Data all features
  - d. Image size no image
- 4. Click the Export button in the upper-right corner.
- 5. When the export is ready, choose your Mail application.
- 6. Email the update to <u>2021.walkercreek.situation@firenet.gov</u> for the Walker Creek Fire map updates or <u>2021.chickadeecreek.situation@firenet.gov</u> for the Chickadee Fire map updates.
- 7. If you have questions, call or text the Situation Unit at 360-584-3373.
- 8. Your email needs to include an explanation of the data and a contact phone number.

### EMERGENCY PLAN INCIDENT WITHIN AN INCIDENT

### ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER

In the event of an accident or medical incident of any size, your primary responsibility is to ENSURE that the victim(s) receive prompt and effective Triage, Treatment, Extrication and Transport.

- ENSURE THE MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORT IN THE INCIDENT ACTION PLAN IS BEING USED AND FOLLOWED- \*<u>IF DETERMINED TO BE A</u> <u>GREEN, DO NOT DECLARE EMERGENCY TRAFFIC AND ONLY COMPLETE</u> <u>LINE 1-4 ON MIR\*.</u>
- Conduct size-up of the incident nature of accident, number type of resources involved, latitude and longitude location (DD°MMM.MM format): notify incident communications center and supervisor, request assistance as needed.
- Order and coordinate medical and support response to the accident.
- Evaluate special needs (law enforcement, haz mat, etc.).
- Clear the command frequency if medical emergency, coordinate with incident communications and air attack for air medical transportation needs.
- Preserve and photograph the scene for accident investigation.
- Remain aware of surroundings and the status of the main incident (delegate personnel to monitor the main fire) to ensure safety of medical treatment personnel.
- Until relieved, supervise and manage all personnel involved at the incident scene.
