WEATHER SUMMARY: Cooler: Max temp 81, Min RH 30%. Winds- west 10-15 with gusts to 25 mph.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Fuels consist of grass and sage brush on the lower slopes with scattered to heavy of timber overstory over a mix of grass, regeneration and timber litter. Timber present on the upper slopes with areas about 10-year-old regeneration in areas of 2008 fire scar.

Live and dead fuel moistures very low and available to readily burn which contributes to a high resistance to control.

Expect continued fire spread in unlined area on both fires. Overall tendency is for easterly fire spread. Fire behavior should moderate to high but in areas exposed to afternoon wind gusts, expect more active fire behavior with torching and spotting in spite of cooler weather. Potential exists for torching runs where there's alignment of wind and slope

Head fire rates of spread in the grass and brush fuels will approach 50 chains/hour (about 50 feet/minute) with about 7-8 feet flame lengths. With the wind gusts, expect greater rates of spread and flame lengths.

Spotting distance will approach about 1000 ft although with periodic wind gusts to 25 mph, watch for spots up to 0.4 miles.

Probability of Ignition will approach 60% unshaded in the afternoon and decreasing as temps decrease and humidity increases.

AIR OPERATIONS: Watch for turbulence in the complex terrain. Smoke haze may impact visibility.

SAFETY

Pay attention to the very dry light and flashy fuels, Fire intensity can exponentially increase and quickly change directions with increases of wind and or slope.

Burnout – watch for wind directions and speed. Pay attention to smoke drift... spotting. Smoke haze may impact your ability to timely see new spot fires.

Smoke haze over the fire may modify how active fire behavior may become. In the event there is a thicker layer of smoke, and it clears, watch for significant increase in fire activity.

NW Team 12 has assumed command of the fire as of 0600. Transition of Overhead and personnel will continue through the duration of the incident. Transition is a time that can be marred by extreme success or failure. Ensure positive relationship building and open lines of communications. Take a few extra minutes to get to know new personnel and provide a good briefing of actions taken up to the transition. Make sure you know who is working in your area and maintain accountability of your people.

HYDRATION/NUTRITION

- * Drink fluids throughout operational period (water and Gatorade) not energy drinks. Begin hydration well before your shift and continue after.
- * Follow work / rest guidelines
- * Set a reasonable work pace and allow adequate rest breaks
- * Use buddy system to monitor personnel of heat related and fatigue issues
- * For Heat Related Injuries refer to IRPG.
- * Ensure adequate caloric intake.

INCIDENT COMMUNICATIONS

Incident communications will be developing throughout the day. Avoid engagement if positive communications are not in place with Overhead or ICP. Check throughout the day for communication coverage as you change locations. Take a tactical pause If needed to fully allow incident transition to occur. Letting the transition develop allows for a solid and safe foundation to move forward in a lower risk environment.



Pro Tip: Map Download

How to resolve troubles with downloading maps into Avenza.

Note: These directions were written for Apple, but the steps are roughly the same for Andoid.

Start Here:

- Connect to Wi-Fi as the local area's cellular network is not fast enough for large file downloads. This may result in a browser timeout and error message about the map not being able to download to be displayed. The Community Center has a guest Wi-Fi that can be utilized.
- For either method below, START BY SCANNING THE QR CODE on the front of the IAP to get to the FTP site and 'Current_Maps' folder.



Method 1: From a browser


- 1. Tap on the desired map link and wait for the preview.

- 3. Choose the Avenza app





Method 2: From Avenza direct

- 2. Launch the Avenza app
- 3. When not in any map... Tap the + (plus) icon at the top of the screen

- 5. Paste the direct URL to the map
- 6. Tap 'Done'; the map will begin downloading

- Observe 6ft Distancing whenever possible.
- Conduct daily verbal screening checks within crews, report any COVID-like symptoms to your direct supervisor. Supervisors should report any positive symptoms to the Medical Unit for next steps.
- Observe "Module as One" practices the only close contact you should have is with the crew (engine, handcrew, etc.) that you live and work with all summer. Observe social distancing and masking around everyone else. Do not co-mingle with other crews or "modules" in camp or on the line.
- Send crew representatives to pick up meals.
- No entry to ICP building except Incident Management Team members
- Wash hands frequently and disinfect high-traffic areas on a regular basis.
- Limit close contact between firefighters and the public to prevent exposure and spread.

EMERGENCY PLAN

INCIDENT WITHIN AN INCIDENT

ON SCENE SUPERVISOR

In the event of an accident or medical incident of any size, your primary responsibility is to ENSURE that the victim(s) receive prompt and effective Triage, Treatment and Transportation.

- Conduct size-up of the incident (nature of accident, number type of resources involved, latitude and longitude location): notify incident communications center and supervisor, request assistance as needed.
- Order and coordinate medical and support response to the accident.
- Evaluate special needs (law enforcement, haz mat, etc.).
- Clear the command frequency if medical emergency; coordinate with incident communications and air attack for air medical transportation needs
- Preserve and photograph the scene for accident investigation.
- Remain aware of surroundings and the status of the main incident (delegate personnel to monitor the main fire) to ensure safety of medical treatment personnel.
- Until relieved, supervise and manage all personnel involved at the incident scene.
- ENSURE THE MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORT IN THE INCIDENT ACTION PLAN IS BEING USED AND FOLLOWED.
