GENERAL:

- Suppression efforts have been very successful but continued slight potential for isolated areas of smoldering heat near fire lines that could flare up with slight potential to spot across lines.
- Fuels consist mixed conifer and pine with grass and brush. Logging slash is in scattered locations. There are some areas of regeneration from past timber harvest and 5 to 10-year-old fire scar regen with grass and brush understory. Much of the lower elevations are covered with grass and sagebrush with timbered stringers in the deep draws.
- If any spotting occurs, it will be short range.
- Probability of Ignition will be near 70% unshaded and 40% shaded during the warmest part of the day. ERCs' for Kramer yesterday dropped well below average and will slowly climb the next few days.

SPECIFIC:

DIV M/A/Z/W/P: Expect smoldering and limited creeping fire on the edge of green islands in the area north of Mount Whitmore lookout.

DIV C: Isolated smoldering and creeping fire behavior.



If you're cell signal is poor you may need to connect to a wifi to download maps. However sometimes being connected to a wifi can slow map downloads. You'll just have to find out what works best.


Method 1: From a browser - If you have a good cell or wifi signal

- 5. Paste the direct URL to the map
- 6. Tap 'Done'; the map will begin downloading








How to Send Map Updates to the Situation Unit

WHITMORE FIRE COVID-19 MITIGATIONS

Supervisors are required to go over this list each morning with assigned resources- report any positive symptoms to medical unit.

In the last 24 hours have you experienced:

- Cough more than expected?
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?

Wear a mask in fire camp regardless of vaccination status, unless outdoors and able to maintain at least 6ft of distance at all times, alone in an enclosed space or actively engaged in firefighting on the fireline.

Use the Zoom link provided to join briefings remotely.

Observe 6ft Distancing whenever possible.

Observe "Module as One" practices – only close contact with crew (engine, handcrew, etc.) that you live and work with all summer. Observe distancing and masking around everyone else. Do not co-mingle with other crews or "modules" in camp or on the line.

Send crew representatives to pick up meals - masks must be worn in food lines.

No entry to ICP building except Incident Management Team members

Wash hands frequently and disinfect high-traffic areas on a regular basis.

Limit close contact between firefighters and the public to prevent exposure and spread.

EMERGENCY PLAN INCIDENT WITHIN AN INCIDENT

ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER

In the event of an accident or medical incident of any size, your primary responsibility is to ENSURE that the victim(s) receive prompt and effective Triage, Treatment, Extrication and Transport.

- ENSURE THE MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORT IN THE INCIDENT ACTION PLAN IS BEING USED AND FOLLOWED- *IF DETERMINED TO BE A GREEN, DO NOT DECLARE EMERGENCY TRAFFIC AND ONLY COMPLETE LINE 1-4 ON MIR*.
- Conduct size-up of the incident nature of accident, number type of resources involved, latitude and longitude location (DD°MMM.MM format): notify incident communications center and supervisor, request assistance as needed.
- Order and coordinate medical and support response to the accident.
- Evaluate special needs (law enforcement, haz mat, etc.).
- Clear the command frequency if medical emergency, coordinate with incident communications and air attack for air medical transportation needs.
- Preserve and photograph the scene for accident investigation.
- Remain aware of surroundings and the status of the main incident (delegate personnel to monitor the main fire) to ensure safety of medical treatment personnel.
- Until relieved, supervise and manage all personnel involved at the incident scene.
