Develop and implement plans to protect identified values including private structures, communities, utility infrastructure, transportation corridors, and watersheds.</li> <li>3. Maintain and enhance relationships with local partners, cooperators, the public and stakeholders through timely and accurate information exchange.</li> <li>4. Reduce the threat of new fires within the Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR) corridor by providing for coordinated initial attack on federal, state and local lands.</li> <li>5. **Discussion:**                      **\*\*\*Cooler temperatures but continued gusty winds\*\*\***

The upper low and associated cold front has moved into the eastern portion of the state and Idaho Panhandle Region this morning. This low remains stalled east of the fire through today then push out of the region Wednesday. Any showers and thunderstorms should remain east of the fire area but strong and gusty northwest winds are expected along with cool conditions Tuesday. Temperatures once again warm Wednesday and Thursday along with less northwest wind.

## Wildland Urban Interface Watch Outs

- ≈ Wooden construction and wood shake roofs;
- ≈ Poor access and narrow one-way roads;
- ≈ Inadequate water supply;
- ≈ Natural fuels 30 feet or closer to structures;
- ≈ Extreme fire behavior;
- ≈ Strong winds;
- ≈ Evacuation of public (panic);
- ≈ Bridge load limits.

## Powerline Safety

- ≈ Downed wire on vehicle – don't leave vehicle until power company arrives. If vehicle is on fire, or fire is near, don't hang on to door. Keep feet together and bunny hop away;
- ≈ Don't operate heavy equipment under powerlines;
- ≈ Don't make water drops on live powerlines;
- ≈ Don't drive with long antennas under powerlines;
- ≈ Don't fuel vehicles/equipment under powerlines;
- ≈ Don't stand near powerlines during water drops or retardant drops;
- ≈ Don't park under powerlines;
- ≈ Don't apply straight streams to powerlines;
- ≈ Thick, heavy smoke can cause arcing.
