Reduce the threat of new fires within the Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR) corridor by providing for coordinated initial attack on federal, state and local lands. 5. Firing operations may be used where appropriate. 3. Implement structure protection strategies for WUI along Highway 410. 4. Scout and implement direct and/or indirect perimeter control lines, as resources are available, focusing on the North and East flanks of the fire to protect values at risk. Full implementation of these control lines will be attempted when weather conditions become more favorable to perimeter control and resources are available.

Discussion:

*****Slight threat of showers and thunderstorms Friday*****

A northwest flow aloft will continue over the region again today as an upper ridge remains off the Pacific Northwest Coast. Warm and dry conditions prevail for another day before the next cold front pushes into the region Friday afternoon and evening bringing a small threat of showers and thunderstorms. At this time a wetting rain is not expected, but some light precipitation is possible. The system is expected to drop a little further south than the last one, therefore some easterly winds are expected as the system pushes through the area.

SKY/WEATHER: Mostly sunny.
Max Temperature: 80 to 85 lower elevations and near 75 ridges.
Min RH: 20 to 30 percent.

Noxious Weeds – Here's how you can help

Noxious weeds can be a huge problem for a local District after a fire. As wildland firefighters, we are focused on the action at hand, fighting the fire in front of us. However, we rarely see some of the impacts left on the land from our suppression actions. One of those impacts is disturbed soil, often along dozer lines and similar areas is an invasion of noxious weeds. Years after the fire, a District will return to these dozer lines and pushouts to treat weed infestation, season after season. The main issue with noxious weeds is that they can take over large areas and change the ecology of the system. We're doing what we can to fight this scourge, but we need your help.

On the Naches District of the Okanagan-Wenatchee National Forest the invasive weeds we are fighting include bull thistle, Canada thistle, chicory, common mullein, common St. Johnswort, dalmatian toadflax, houndstongue, oxeye daisy and several species of knapweed. Some of the most common and easiest to recognize are dalmatian toadflax, houndstongue and knapweed.

These invasive plants are present:

- Along road corridors
- In road pull offs
- At old logging landings
- In dispersed campsites

- Invasive plants are spread on
 - Clothing and shoes
 - Undercarriage, bumpers and other hidden pockets of vehicles
 - In the tire tread of vehicles
 - In soil carried in pockets on heavy equipment

Unfortunately, there are lots of vectors for the spread of noxious weeds. We don't want to be one of those!

To protect Native plants from being overrun with invasive species, here's what you can do to help:

- Learn to recognize the common species of noxious weeds
- Avoid parking over areas with invasive plants
- Check shoes and pants for seeds
- Rather than flicking houndstounge burs (seeds), collect them and throw in a trash.

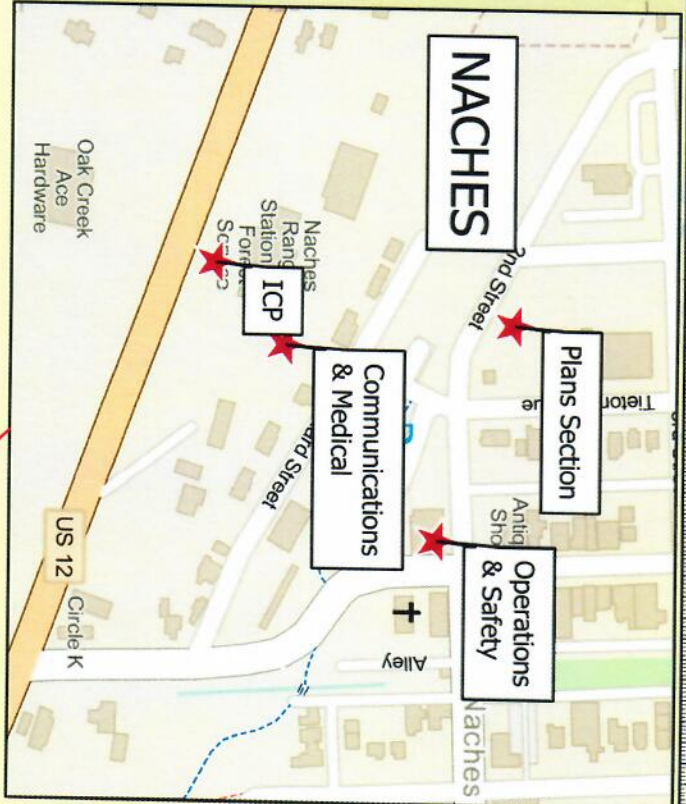
Facilities Map


