Leader's Intent:

- Professional responders are expected to conduct themselves in a professional manner at all times. We shall foster an environment that

Management Objectives:

 tactics that have a high probability of success, 2) on actions that meaningfully contribute to your objectives or protection of high value
 resources (responders, public, communities, etc.), and 3) minimize exposure to incident responders.
- Ensure proactive communication and coordination occurs regarding the incident's status and strategy with agency administrators, cooperators, communities and the public through timely press releases, informational updates, social media, meetings and other informational sharing platforms.
- Protect private lands in the community of Imnaha, the Imnaha River corridor, Freezeout Creek drainage, Imnaha River Woods and Pallette Ranch to prevent loss of highly valuable resources such as residences and infrastructure.
- Work with the Resource Advisors and minimize suppression impacts in the Imnaha River and tributaries to protect salmon, steelhead and Bull Trout habitat.
- Protect known historic and pre-contact cultural sites by minimizing fire spread to the sites where possible, minimize suppression impacts
 and work with the resource advisors.
- Keep fire from impacting Forest Service infrastructure and values at risk, including on Double Creek Fire: Memaloose Campground and Guard Station; Hat Point Lookout, picnic area and trailhead; Five Mile and Granny View Viewpoints; and Sacajawea and Saddle Creek Campgrounds. On Sturgill Fire: Minam River Lodge; Reds Horse Ranch; and Standley and Bear Creek Guard Stations. On Nebo Fire: Lick Creek Guard Station and campground; Salt Creek Summit warming hut and groomer shed; and Wing Ridge and Redmont Shelter ski huts.
- Provide initial attack to new unplanned ignitions within the designated geographic area and requests for assistance from the local
 agencies with jurisdiction. Prioritize response to ignitions that threaten infrastructure, recreational sites and private lands.
- Implement and maintain effective COVID-19 prevention and mitigation measures that follow CDC guidelines and interagency protocols.
- Maintain fiscal accountability and cost effectiveness as an important component of the decision-making process for the incident.
- Triage and assess structural protection needs. Provide structure preparation equivalent to risk.
- Support suppression operations as requested within delegation.

Control Objectives

- <u>Double Creek:</u> Keep fire east of Imnaha River, west of the Hells Canyon NRA, and south of the Snake River and Imnaha River confluences. Protect values along the Imnaha corridor.
- Nebo: Keep fire west of 39 Cloverdale Road. Limit spread north toward values outside of the wilderness.
- Sturgill: Protect values in Minam Lodge and Reds Horse Ranch by monitoring fire growth and using firing and suppression actions on Big Sheep Ridge to minimize growth to the northwest. Monitor spot fires in Goat Creek and Goat 1 & 2.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Hot, dry, and unstable conditions with breezy south to southwest winds will begin the period. The threat transitions into a shower and thunderstorm threat mid-afternoon through early evening with virga showers and a few dry thunderstorms. With a very dry sub-cloud layer, gusty and erratic outflow winds gusting to 50 mph are likely across parts of the fire areas.

WEATHER FORECAST:

...Red Flag Warning remains in effect until 2000 hrs this evening...

WEATHER: Partly Cloudy becoming Mostly Cloudy in the afternoon and early evening. A chance of virga showers and dry thunderstorms producing gusty and erratic outflow winds possibly exceeding 50 mph. Small pea-size hail and brief heavy rain is possible with the stronger storms.

TEMPERATURES: 78 to 87 around 6000-ft and higher, 85 to 98 valley bottoms.

HUMIDITY: 9 to 17 percent.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP (6,000-ft and higher) – South to Southwest 4 to 9 mph increasing to Southwest 10 to 15 mph with gusts to 25 mph by 1200 hrs. Winds becoming more West and then Northwest through the afternoon into early evening.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Upslope/Upvalley 3 to 7 mph becoming South 7 to 13 mph. Winds become more gusty and erratic gusting 20 to 30 mph out of the West and Northwest in the afternoon with the potential for stronger outflow winds from showers and thunderstorms.

HAINES INDEX: 5/6 (High/Very High)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversions lifting between 1000 and 1400 hrs depending on aspect & sheltering.

MIXING HEIGHT: Around 12,500 ft agl.

OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT: Mostly cloudy becoming mostly clear by midnight. A chance for virga showers and thunderstorms until around 2000 hrs producing gusty and erratic outflows up to 50 mph. Smoke. Lows 49 to 64 valleys, 60 to 72 higher elevations. Maximum humidity 35 to 50 percent mid-slopes and ridges, 50 to 70 percent valley bottoms. North to Northwest winds 6 to 12 mph with gusts to 20 mph diminishing after midnight. Locally higher winds possible on steepest slopes and channeled valleys especially in the evening.

OUTLOOK FOR THURSDAY:

WEATHER: Mostly Sunny and breezy. Cooler yet still dry. Smoke.

TEMPERATURES: 70 to 80 around 6000-ft and higher, 80 to 90 valley bottoms.

Assumptions: Potential-for-a "fire spread day" - we have all the ingredients that may combine to produce very active-to-extreme fire behavior today through tonight — RFW, chance of thunderstorms, steep slopes, dry fuels, and peak of season conditions (97th percentile ERC). Aligned ridges, and southwest aspects are exposed to winds - lower slopes/river areas have wind channeling and localized effects; expect downslope winds in the late evening. Expect active burning conditions between 0600-2100. Persistent burning may be expected in grasses until humidity reaches 50% during late night/early morning hours. Live fuels and cured grasses are contributing to fire behavior producing rapid spread rates. * Last night had a strong thermal belt with poor RH recovery.

Fire Behavior Summary

<u>Fuels in the fire area</u> are primarily composed of *Grass/Shrub*, *Grass*, *Timber Litter*, and *Timber with Understory*. Primary tree species include mixed sizes of Douglas Fir, Ponderosa Pine, sub-alpine fir, with scattered True Fir. Local timber litter is compact to fluffy. Brush and understory species include ceanothus, shrub-form Maple, and dog-hair conifer thickets. Abundant snags and heavy fuel concentrations are common throughout all areas. Most harsh/dry/lowland site grasses are fully cured. Fuel conditions change by elevation, and aspect. Low crown base height (ladder fuels) and lichen/moss are present in high elevation timbered areas.

Today's potential fire activity may include very active to extreme fire behavior including wind/slope aligned torching runs/wind driven fire spread on slopes and ridges. Group torching with profuse short-range spotting may accelerate rate of spread. Primary spread mechanism includes wind, secondary to backing/flanking, and upslope runs. Winds shift from S-SW to W-NW during the afternoon — monitor for fire effect. Fire activity may continue into the evening as upslope/down slope wind transition to diurnal down valley sundowner winds. Dangerous rates of spread in grass and grass/shrub fuels may develop with wind/slope alignment. Timber fuels will produce high intensity fire behavior Expect localized (squirrely) wind effects to influence fire behavior in drainages, and on lee-side of ridges.

* Fine fuel moisture= 2-5%, 1000hr. moisture=10%, Woody fuels 120%, Probability of Ignition-80-100%

Specific Assignments: All Branches and Divisions — monitor S-SW winds becoming West then Northwest in the afternoon.

Br.I (Div. A/Z, Q) — Wide range of backing gulches/draws along Imnaha River that may become active. Expect robust spread along ridges to north. Expect squirrely winds in Freezeout Creek, monitor Imnaha river wind channeling throughout the operational period.

BR. II (Div. S, E) — Lots of uncharted territory and broken terrain — vulnerable to rapid fire spread and Snake River influence.

Br. III — Nebo fire -N. Fk. Sheep Cr. active flanking/head fire in Wing Ridge area. Lick Cr. likely to have active flare-ups. Sturgill fire — Active backing toward Minam River between Three Mile Cr. and Chaparral Cr. Fire slopped over the ridge into Bear Cr.. Continued backing/flanking in N. Fk Minam River on the south end of the fire. Goat 2 remains sheltered. Monitor Huckleberry Ridge.

Air Operations: Thunderstorms and/or virga outflow winds exceeding 50 mph. Ridge/canyon transition winds could be bumpy. Hail?

Safety

FINE FUELS are VERY responsive to the effects of temperature and humidity...monitor your conditions. Anticipate current conditions to continue for the next several days.......anticipate fire behavior before you observe it, anticipate your actions before need to act. Remember: fine fuels + wind = rapid rate of spread; timber litter + wind = high intensity fire with torching and spotting; moss + ladder fuels= torching and spotting.

**Critically low Relative Humidity may be the trigger for rapidly escalating fire behavior today. Think of Probability of Ignition as if you were standing in the woods and dropped 100 matches...........80% means 80 matches would ignite the surface fuels....how many "matches" fall out of a torching of tree??.

Short-Haul Operations

CAPABILITIES

- During an operational Short-Haul the helicopter is capable of inserting Short-Haulers into an area with tight canopy cover and/or technical terrain.
- Haul line lengths range from 100 feet to 350 feet.
- Short hauler and/or medical gear can be delivered to the medical scene even if extraction by short-haul is not necessary.


ORDERING


- EMT or Medical Incident IC determines medical extraction is required.
- Follow local established procedures and/or Medical Incident Report (MIR) in the IRPG.
- Confirm aircraft type, call sign, estimated time of arrival and frequency.
- Give site selection information when ordering: hazards (i.e. ash, smoke, snags, aerial), tree height, terrain, and patient transport configuration (supine or seated position). Repeat hazards and give updated weather conditions as well as brief patient update to responding helicopter.

PROCESS: The helicopter will fly to the coordinates provided. They will make contact with ground personnel on scene with the patient using an identified air-to-ground frequency. The helicopter will complete a short-haul recon and size up, gather patient update information and then fly to a landing zone (LZ) to configure for short-haul operations. The helicopter will be monitoring the appropriate air-to-ground, air guard and victor frequencies. From this point, ground resources should only contact the helicopter in case of an emergency. During the insertion and extraction process ground personnel must be clear of the area.

ON SCENE: EXPECT THE FOLLOWING

- 1 or 2 rescuers (at least one qualified as an EMT or higher)
- Backboard (if needed and not already on scene)
- All equipment necessary for patient extraction

Small Changes Make a Big Difference

Watch Out #18: "Taking a nap near the fire line".

OLD Watch Out #13 (prior to 1987): "You feel like taking a nap near the fire line".

Fatigue effects your ability to Make Good Decisions, Recognize Hazards, Physically React, Communication Skills and Mood!!!

Compromised Decision Making Process:

The CDC reports that being awake for: 18 hrs is equivalent to a blood alcohol level of .05%

20 hrs is equivalent to a blood alcohol level of .08%

24 hrs is equivalent to a blood alcohol level of .10%

Recognizing Hazards: Fatigue slows your brain's ability to focus on situational awareness. The ability to process what you do see also slows down! Until you process what you see or hear you cannot react physically to it.

Physically Reacting to Hazards: This part is pretty obvious to most of us, we all move slower when we are tired from a long day or physically exhausting work. This occurs gradually, less noticeably, due to long term fatigue!

Communication Skills: Active listening skills and the ability to give good, focused instructions are out of the window when we reach the point of exhaustion!

Mood: Have you noticed that after a long hard day or later in the fire season that you start to feel abnormally "happy" or "moody"? Fatigue has a strong influence on our mood, and we often communicate in the same tone, giving/hear what we want to hear (just the positive or just the negative).

SO, DO YOU FEEL LIKE YOU COULD TAKE A NAP NEAR THE FIRE LINE?
