3. Objective(s):

Leader's Intent:

- Professional responders are expected to conduct themselves in a professional manner at all times. We shall foster an environment that
 promotes teamwork, respect and is free from discrimination and harassment. A "zero tolerance" policy will apply to behavior determined
 to be inappropriate.
- Ensure the Medical Plan, 8-line and short haul operations are well understood and all assigned resources are confident in the
 application.

Management Objectives:

- Human life is the most valuable resource to be protected, consequently accept no unnecessary risk. The only acceptable risk in 1) tactics that have a high probability of success, 2) on actions that meaningfully contribute to your objectives or protection of high value resources (responders, public, communities, etc.), and 3) minimize exposure to incident responders.
- Ensure proactive communication and coordination occurs regarding the incident's status and strategy with agency administrators, cooperators, communities and the public through timely press releases, informational updates, social media, meetings and other informational sharing platforms.
- Protect private lands in the community of Imnaha, the Imnaha River corridor, Freezeout Creek drainage, Imnaha River Woods and Pallette Ranch to prevent loss of highly valuable resources such as residences and infrastructure.
- Work with the Resource Advisors and minimize suppression impacts in the Imnaha River and tributaries to protect salmon, steelhead and Bull Trout habitat.
- Protect known historic and pre-contact cultural sites by minimizing fire spread to the sites where possible, minimize suppression impacts
 and work with the resource advisors.
- Keep fire from impacting Forest Service infrastructure and values at risk, including on Double Creek Fire: Memaloose Campground and Guard Station; Hat Point Lookout, picnic area and trailhead; Five Mile and Granny View Viewpoints; and Sacajawea and Saddle Creek Campgrounds. On Sturgill Fire: Minam River Lodge; Reds Horse Ranch; and Standley and Bear Creek Guard Stations. On Nebo Fire: Lick Creek Guard Station and campground; Salt Creek Summit warming hut and groomer shed; and Wing Ridge and Redmont Shelter ski huts.
- Provide initial attack to new unplanned ignitions within the designated geographic area and requests for assistance from the local
 agencies with jurisdiction. Prioritize response to ignitions that threaten infrastructure, recreational sites and private lands.
- Implement and maintain effective COVID-19 prevention and mitigation measures that follow CDC guidelines and interagency protocols.
- Maintain fiscal accountability and cost effectiveness as an important component of the decision-making process for the incident.
- Triage and assess structural protection needs. Provide structure preparation equivalent to risk.
- Support suppression operations as requested within delegation.

Control Objectives

- <u>Double Creek:</u> Keep fire east of Imnaha River, west of the Hells Canyon NRA, and south of the Snake River and Imnaha River confluences. Protect values along the Imnaha corridor.
- Nebo: Keep fire west of 39 Cloverdale Road. Limit spread north toward values outside of the wilderness.
- Sturgill: Protect values in Minam Lodge and Reds Horse Ranch by monitoring fire growth and using firing and suppression actions on Big Sheep Ridge to minimize growth to the northwest. Monitor spot fires in Goat Creek and Goat 1 & 2.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Elevated fire weather conditions will occur under moderate northwesterly flow. Though temperatures will be cooler, dry conditions will remain across the fires. Near-surface smoke will likely clear smoke from the north sides of the fires for much of the period.

WEATHER: Mostly Sunny and breezy. Cooler yet still dry. Smoke.

Evening gusts up to 15 mph on ridgetops. Northwest wind becoming Downslope/Downvalley wind 3 to 8 mph with locally higher gusts. Locally stronger winds possible as Downslope/Downvalley winds first develop during the night.

Assumptions: We have all the ingredients that may combine to produce very active fire behavior today through tonight — elevated fire weather conditions, steep slopes, dry fuels, and peak of season conditions (97th percentile ERC). Aligned ridges, and northwest aspects will be exposed to winds - lower slopes/river areas have wind alignment localized effects with northerly flow; expect downslope winds in the late evening. Expect active burning conditions between 1200-2000. Persistent burning may be expected in grasses until humidity reaches 50% during late night/early morning hours. Live fuels and cured grasses are contributing to fire behavior producing rapid spread rates. Potential for initial attack from yesterdays lightning.

Fire Behavior Summary

<u>Fuels in the fire area</u> are primarily composed of *Grass/Shrub*, *Grass, Timber Litter*, and *Timber with Understory*. Primary tree species include mixed sizes of Douglas Fir, Ponderosa Pine, sub-alpine fir, with scattered True Fir. Local timber litter is compact to fluffy. Brush and understory species are variety of shrub types, and dog-hair conifer thickets. Abundant snags and heavy fuel concentrations are common throughout all areas. Most harsh/dry/lowland site grasses are fully cured. Fuel conditions change by elevation, and aspect. Low crown base height (ladder fuels) and lichen/moss are present in high elevation timbered areas.

<u>Today's potential fire activity</u> may include very active fire behavior including wind/slope aligned fire spread on slopes and ridges. Group torching with short-range spotting may accelerate rate of spread. Primary spread mechanism includes backing/flanking, and upslope runs. Fire activity may continue into the evening as upslope/down slope wind transition to diurnal down valley sundowner winds. Dangerous rates of spread in grass and grass/shrub fuels may develop with wind/slope alignment. Timber fuels will produce high intensity fire behavior Expect localized (squirrely) wind effects to influence fire behavior in drainages, and on lee-side of ridges.

* Fine fuel moisture= 4-6%, 1000hr. moisture=10%, Woody fuels 120%, Probability of Ignition-60-80%

Specific Assignments:

Br.I (Div. A/Z, Q, R) — Wide range of backing gulches/draws along Imnaha River that may become active. Expect robust spread in grass. Expect squirrely winds in Freezeout Creek, monitor Imnaha river wind channeling throughout the operational period.

BR. II (Div. S, E) — Lots of wind aligned broken terrain and ridges. Northerly wind provides new alignments for rapid spread in grass.

Br. III — Nebo fire -N. Fk. Sheep Cr. active flanking/head fire in Wing Ridge area. Lick Cr. likely to have active flare-ups. Sturgill fire — Active backing toward Minam River between Three Mile Cr. and Chaparral Cr. Fire slopped over the ridge into Bear Cr.. Continued backing/flanking in N. Fk Minam River on the south end of the fire. Goat 2 remains sheltered. Monitor Huckleberry Ridge.

Air Operations: Good day to fly, northerly air flow will provide view into areas previously obscured by smoke.

Safety

Changing conditions require re-evaluation of actions. If the conditions are changing ask "how fast, how much, when, where".

Consider the effects of change on your planned action – it may require adjusting your actions to mitigate changing conditions.

Verify forecast values...consider "will our situation get better or worse, will it get worse before it gets better?" *ALWAYS EXPECT CHANGE – EXCEPT FROM A VENDING MACHINE.

Be alert to changing conditions – don't be lulled into the "same old/same old"......fire behavior and weather processes are dynamic and ever changing throughout the day, week, season...

Short-Haul Operations

CAPABILITIES

- During an operational Short-Haul the helicopter is capable of inserting Short-Haulers into an area with tight canopy cover and/or technical terrain.
- Haul line lengths range from 100 feet to 350 feet.
- Short hauler and/or medical gear can be delivered to the medical scene even if extraction by short-haul is not necessary.

ORDERING

- EMT or Medical Incident IC determines medical extraction is required.
- Follow local established procedures and/or Medical Incident Report (MIR) in the IRPG.
- Confirm aircraft type, call sign, estimated time of arrival and frequency.
- Give site selection information when ordering: hazards (i.e. ash, smoke, snags, aerial), tree height, terrain, and patient transport configuration (supine or seated position). Repeat hazards and give updated weather conditions as well as brief patient update to responding helicopter.


PROCESS: The helicopter will fly to the coordinates provided. They will make contact with ground personnel on scene with the patient using an identified air-to-ground frequency. The helicopter will complete a short-haul recon and size up, gather patient update information and then fly to a landing zone (LZ) to configure for short-haul operations. The helicopter will be monitoring the appropriate air-to-ground, air guard and victor frequencies. From this point, ground resources should only contact the helicopter in case of an emergency. During the insertion and extraction process ground personnel must be clear of the area.

ON SCENE: EXPECT THE FOLLOWING

- 1 or 2 rescuers (at least one qualified as an EMT or higher)
- Backboard (if needed and not already on scene)
- All equipment necessary for patient extraction

The <u>Patient Extraction Bag</u> accommodates most backboards.
-A patient on a backboard, TRS, SKED or litter will be inserted into the bag.

Firefighter Stress Management (IRPG page xii)

Wildland firefighting is often stressful and sometimes traumatic. It can take a toll on mental health. It is normal to feel overwhelmed sometimes and vital to address these thoughts before they become a mental health issue. Mental fitness for duty is just as essential as physical fitness for duty.

AWARENESS-Stress Injuries can be caused by:

- A Life Threat: Due to an experience of death-provoking terror, horror, or helplessness
- A Loss Injury: A grief injury due to the loss of cherished people, things, or parts of oneself.
- A Moral Injury: Due to behaviors or the witnessing of behaviors that violate moral values.
- Cumulative Stress: Due to the accumulation of stress from all sources over time without sufficient rest and recovery.

RECOGNITION-Stress Sizeup monitor yourself and others for:

- Hazardous attitudes and stress reactions (IRPG page xi).
- Behavior changes (not talking, isolating, outbursts, increased use of substances, making mistakes).
- Troubling feelings (fear, anger, anxiety, sadness, guilt, shame).
- Thoughts or mention of self-harm or suicide.

MITIGATION-Stress First Aid:

- Shrink the stigma talk about it!
- Provide opportunities to calm:
 - Take a tactical stress pause.
 - Refocus; identify what really matters.
 - o Try tactical breathing or similar techniques.
 - Get additional time off if needed.
- Get help: just like in a medical incident, a higher level of care may be necessary.
- Reach out to friends, peers, loved ones, etc., for support.




