- Implement and maintain effective COVID-19 prevention and mitigation measures that follow CDC guidelines and interagency protocols.
- Maintain fiscal accountability and cost effectiveness as an important component of the decision-making process for the incident.
- Plan for a safe and effective transition and transfer of command to Southern Area Blue Team by sharing critical information and working collaboratively to prioritize and provide for safety of incident personnel and the public.

#### 4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:

Control Objectives

- Double Creek: Hold and secure east containment lines along the Imnaha River, west of the Hells Canyon NRA, and south of the Snake River and Imnaha River confluences. Protect values along the Imnaha corridor.
- Nebo: Keep fire west of 39 Cloverdale Road. Limit spread north toward values outside of the wilderness.
- Sturgill: Protect values in Minam Lodge and Reds Horse Ranch by monitoring fire growth and using firing and suppression actions on Big Sheep Ridge to minimize growth to the northwest. Monitor spot fires in Goat Creek and Goat 1 & 2.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Isolated showers and thunderstorms are possible through the day. The strongest of these storms may contain brief heavy rainfall and strong wind gusts. Otherwise, expect seasonable

temperatures under partly cloudy skies and light northwest winds.

#### WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy and cool. 30% chance of showers and thunderstorms. Rainfall totals will generally be less than a tenth of an inch, though isolated higher amounts are possible.

TEMPERATURES: 55 to 70 around 6000-ft and higher, 65 to 80 valley bottoms.

**HUMIDITY:** 35 to 45 percent

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP (6,000-ft and higher) - Northwest wind 5 to 10 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light and variable 3 to 6 mph

HAINES INDEX: 3 (Very Low)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversions lifting between 0900 and 1100 hrs depending on aspect & sheltering.

MIXING HEIGHT: Around 4,000-ft agl.

OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT: Very good relative humidity recovery will occur Wednesday night w/ RH increasing above 60 percent. Isolated showers and a thunderstorm are possible. Rainfall amounts will be less than a tenth of an inch, but isolated heavier amounts are possible. Wind will be out of the northwest at less than 5 mph. Lows will be in the 40s.

Assumptions: Stating the obvious – precipitation has occurred in sufficient quantity and duration to significantly reduce today's potential fire behavior – especially if we get continuing rain showers. We still have some of the ingredients for some low-end fire behavior today/ tonight – steep slopes, dry heavy fuels, and temporarily reduced seasonal conditions. Aligned ridges, and south facing aspects will be exposed to light winds - lower slopes/river areas may have localized channeling effects; expect downslope winds late evening. Even without additional rain, favorable conditions for fire spread will be unlikely. Fire spread in grass fuels is unlikely until solar drying with humidity less than 30% for several hour occurs. Live fuels and cured grasses are available fuel in the future. Our fires cover a very large geographic area – watch for localized moisture influences, some areas did not get wet.

#### Fire Behavior Summary

<u>Fuels in the fire area</u> are primarily composed of *Grass/Shrub*, *Grass, Timber Litter*, and *Timber with Understory*. Primary tree species include mixed sizes of Douglas Fir, Ponderosa Pine, sub-alpine fir, with scattered True Fir. Local timber litter is compact to fluffy. Brush and understory species are variety of shrub types, and dog-hair conifer thickets. Snags and heavy fuel concentrations are common throughout all forested areas. Most harsh/dry site grasses are fully cured. Fuel conditions change by elevation, and aspect. Low crown base height (ladder fuels) and lichen/moss are present in high elevation timbered areas.

Today's potential fire activity may include minimal fire behavior. Keywords include "smoldering" and "creeping under timber canopy". Isolated torching with short-range spotting is unlikely to occur. Primary spread mechanism includes stationary in-place consumption of heavy fuels, with some creeping and smoldering. Fire activity may increase with sustained and prolonged direct sunshine. Rates of spread in grass and grass/shrub fuels will be non-existent-to-very low. Timber fuels will retain heat in deep duff and rotten logs. Expect localized (squirrely) wind effects to influence fire behavior in drainages, and on lee-side of ridges.

#### Specific Assignments:

Br.I (Div. A/Z, Q, R) — Wide range of smoldering in gulches/draws along Imnaha River N&S that may show creeping. Expect no rate of spread in grass. Expect variable winds in Freezeout Creek and south. Div. R — expect smoldering to the south on ridge to Neil Cyn. BR. II (Div. S, E) — Lots of wind aligned broken terrain and ridges. Southerly wind alignments for low spread rate in grass on ridges. Br. III — Nebo fire -N. Fk. Sheep Cr. smoldering fire in Wing Ridge area. Lick Cr. may have isolated creeping. Sturgill fire — smoldering and creeping toward Minam River in Chaparral Cr. Fire slopped over the lip ridge of Lostine drainage. Continued smoldering/creeping in N. Fk Minam River on the south end of the fire. Monitor southwest wind effect activity on Huckleberry Ridge and Goat2.

Air Operations: Broken cloud layer with potential cumulus over smoke layer. Possible focused rain showers.

#### Safety

Varying amounts of moisture in the fire area, some fuels were sheltered from moisture. Drying rates may accelerate with wind and warming. Fuels that have consumed leave hot ash pits. Fire weakened snags and trees are not to be trusted......maintain situational awareness of your surroundings at all times – the situation may change.

# **Short-Haul Operations**

#### CAPABILITIES

- During an operational Short-Haul the helicopter is capable of inserting Short-Haulers into an area with tight canopy cover and/or technical terrain.
- Haul line lengths range from 100 feet to 350 feet.
- Short hauler and/or medical gear can be delivered to the medical scene even if extraction by short-haul is not necessary.

#### ORDERING

- EMT or Medical Incident IC determines medical extraction is required.
- Follow local established procedures and/or Medical Incident Report (MIR) in the IRPG.
- Confirm aircraft type, call sign, estimated time of arrival and frequency.
- Give site selection information when ordering: hazards (i.e. ash, smoke, snags, aerial), tree height, terrain, and patient transport configuration (supine or seated position). Repeat hazards and give updated weather conditions as well as brief patient update to responding helicopter.

PROCESS: The helicopter will fly to the coordinates provided. They will make contact with ground personnel on scene with the patient using an identified air-to-ground frequency. The helicopter will complete a short-haul recon and size up, gather patient update information and then fly to a landing zone (LZ) to configure for short-haul operations. The helicopter will be monitoring the appropriate air-to-ground, air guard and victor frequencies. From this point, ground resources should only contact the helicopter in case of an emergency. During the insertion and extraction process ground personnel must be clear of the area.


#### ON SCENE: EXPECT THE FOLLOWING

- 1 or 2 rescuers (at least one qualified as an EMT or higher)
- Backboard (if needed and not already on scene)
- All equipment necessary for patient extraction

The Patient Extraction Bag accommodates most backboards.

-A patient on a backboard, TRS, SKED or litter will be inserted into the bag.

#### Maka'ala

We get to meet a lot of great people working on large fires across the nation. We sometimes refer to this as the "The Green Pants Nation." Together we are all fire fighters and the community doesn't know the difference between Cooperators, Federal, State, County, Municipal, or Contractors. On Pacific Northwest Team 2 we were fortunate to have a Safety Officer from the Hawaiian Islands for several years. He taught us a new word, Maka'ala. Which means "eyes wide open" or to "be aware". It's what the local Hawaiian's tell their children when they go down to the ocean to surf. Maka'ala, "Be aware of the surf, be aware of your surroundings."

#### Situational Awareness

Situational awareness is depicted as a cycle because the situation and people's perceptions are constantly changing. This internal cycle continues as long as people are awake. Everyone starts with an initial perception of any given situation and then continuously updates it with new information. People gather information through both observation (which includes input from the senses) and communication (which includes face-to-face conversation, written communication, and radio or telephone exchanges).

Simply paying attention is an important part of maintaining good situational awareness, but even more important is determining what to pay attention to. All perceptions are subject to filtering and focusing: people constantly filter information and shift focus. People also produce a lot of internal inputs such as thoughts about what to do next, stress, memories of similar experiences, fear.

Those with more experience in an environment often can more easily filter out distractions and unimportant details and focus on the most salient information.

#### Don't let the concept of situational awareness become cliché.

A cliché is a saying, or idea that has become overused to the point of losing its original meaning or effect, even to the point of being trite or irritating, especially when at some earlier time it was considered meaningful or novel.

#### Is it possible to lose situational awareness?

No, it is not possible to "lose" situational awareness if you are awake. The only way you can "lose" your situational awareness is if you are incapacitated or asleep.

## Does your situational awareness match reality consistently?

Your situational awareness never matches reality perfectly. The key is to learn what to pay attention to in order to best inform the next decision and what to filter as noise.





If your Demob method of <u>travel is by air</u>, contact DMOB at (206) 718-0358 <u>72 hours in advance</u> of your last work day.

#### On Your Last Work Day:

- > Turn in any outstanding or travel CTR/Shift Ticket. Make sure they are SIGNED.
- > Confirm no missing financial documentation

#### Day of Demob STEP 1:

Contact DMOB at (206) 718-0358 to activate your virtual Check-Out and to determine your specific next steps since we are pre-clearing personnel that do not have any supplies or communications equipment checked out.

#### **STEP 2:**

Have your vehicle "weed washed" near Ground Support.

#### STEP 3 (if directed by DMOB):

SUPPLY - see in person to return issued gear and leftover supplies

**COMMUNICATIONS** – see in person to return any communications equipment

**GROUND SUPPORT** – see in person to return incident rental vehicles, get an inspection, etc.

**WEED WASH** - All vehicles and equipment must use the weed wash before demob to prevent the spread of noxious invasive weeds.

#### Other Considerations:

- > Turn in any Unit Logs and Evaluations to Plans (Documentation Box)
- > If you have an I-Pad issued on the fire, return it to the Situation Unit

- > Two options exist for virtual crew swaps: you can call Double Creek Check-in at (206) 795-6379 or DMOB at (206) 718-0358, to provide the crew swap information verbally; or utilize the QR code on the IAP cover to electronically provide the crew swap information.
- > A signed Extension Request Form is required to extended existing resource crew members on the fire and is initiated through your supervisor on the incident
