

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Cooler, cloudy, and stable conditions are expected with high humidity under westerly onshore flow as a cold front approaches the region. Rain chances will increase through the day and be most prevalent from near sunset into early Thursday morning, with a chance of showers through the remainder of Thursday. The most likely rain amounts are 0.10-0.15".

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly Cloudy. A 50% chance of rain in the afternoon. Areas of smoke.

TEMPERATURES: Mid-50s on ridges; 65 to 75 degrees otherwise.

HUMIDITY: 50 to 70 percent, highest on ridges.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West 5 to 10 mph with gusts 15 to 20 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - West 3 to 6 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 3 (Very Low)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion lifting between 1000 and 1400 hrs.

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



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 **HEALTH AND SAFETY MESSAGE** 

Incident: Bolt Creek	Date: 9/28/2022	Operations: ALL
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Major Hazards and Risks: Driving, Hazard Trees, Steep Terrain, Rolling Materials, Rugged Access, Heavy Equipment Operations, Cumulative Fatigue.

- **Trains-** Heads up when working next to trains tracks, when you hear or see a train call it out.
- **Hazard Trees-** are a common issue on the fire line where we work hard to keep up our situational awareness and mitigate those hazards. *Situational Awareness* doesn't stop at the edge of the fire!
- **Powerlines-** Fire activity near high voltage electrical lines can cause serious injuries to a firefighter. Be aware of your surroundings, lookup and communicate any identified powerlines to your crewmembers. Contact your supervisor or the local power company when lines are threatened or involved. Review your IRPG on powerline safety.
- **Night Operations-** Make sure you know the country you're working in before engaging, best practice is to see the ground during the day. Follow the 10 standard fire orders and mitigate the 18 situations that call watch out as needed.
- **Driving-** Nighttime driving is especially dangerous particularly in areas you haven't seen the daylight. Scout in daylight if you can.
- **Dehydration-** Talk about Heat Exhaustion during your DIVS breakouts. Utilize the buddy system and watch for signs and symptoms. Drink plenty of fluids. Water to Gatorade ratio of 2 to 1. Take frequent breaks. Familiarize yourself with Medical Incident Report and practice when you have time.
