

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Cool and cloudy conditions continue with intermittent light rain or showers continue through this afternoon or evening. A transition to a warming and drying trend begins Friday and lasts into at least early next week.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly Cloudy. A 60% chance of rain, ending by early evening. Areas of smoke.

TEMPERATURES: Lower-50s on ridges to 60s slopes/valleys.

HUMIDITY: 60 to 80 percent, highest on ridges.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West to Southwest 4 to 8 mph with gusts 10 to 15 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - West 3 to 6 mph. Afternoon gusts 8 to 12 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 3 (Very Low)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion lifting between 1000 and 1400 hrs.

OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT: Mostly Cloudy. Any remaining light rain ending by mid-evening. Minimum temperatures 47 to 52 degrees. Maximum humidity 90 to 100 percent. West to Northwest wind 2 to 6 mph becoming East to Northeast around midnight.

OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY:

WEATHER: Decreasing clouds through the morning. Sunny in the afternoon. Areas of smoke.

TEMPERATURES: Lower-50s on ridges to 60s slopes/valleys.



Incident: Bolt Creek

Date: 9/29/2022

Operations: ALL

Major Hazards and Risks: Driving, Hazard Trees, Steep Terrain, Rolling Materials, Rugged Access, Heavy Equipment Operations, Cumulative Fatigue.

Driving: Watch your speed and Drive defensively turn on your headlights and fasten your seatbelt!

Steep Terrain: Watch footing to avoid slips, trips and falls. Beware of people working below you.

Communications: As the operational complexity increases or decreases, (who you talk to) and depth (what you talk about and level of detail) of communications. Communicate face to face for critical messages and conversations.

Mission over safety: Make deliberate decisions about how much risk to take-risk vs benefit. Share your thoughts with chain of command, get buy-in and share risk.

Be Ready: Practice your Incident within Incident response! Know your role in it! Expect the unexpected. Know where your Line Medics and Dutch Creek Points Protocol points are.

Wildlife: Yellow Jackets and Bees are still active, avoid where possible. Flag hazard sites and pass the word.

Personal Hygiene Issues: Take some time for you! Wash your hands and shower when you get a chance and get adequate rest.

Hydration: Drink fluids **before** you are thirsty. You need mostly water with some electrolytes (Gatorade etc.) as well.

Powerlines: Working around any powerlines is high risk with potentially deadly consequences.

Keep safe working distance from live lines. ALL lines are live until you are notified by utility company or direct chain of command.

Choosing to apply safe practices, all the experience available to you, massive amounts of common sense, and all your tools as you perform your missions in a dangerous environment are the signs of the professional wildland firefighters you all are.
