3. Objective(s):

Management Objectives and Commanders Intent:

- · Our foremost priority is to always provide for firefighter and public safety.
- Utilize deliberate risk management to balance fire suppression with minimizing exposure to hazards. This will include following local and agency guidelines to inhibit the spread of COVID-19.
- Maintain positive relationships with all stakeholders and ensure the continued open communication with local agencies and landowners to deliver timely and accurate dissemination of information.
- Prioritize suppression strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and that limit firefighter exposure to hazards. Utilize existing roads, trails, and natural barriers to keep the fire footprint as small as possible. Consult with resource advisors when developing plans for suppression and repair activities.
- Monitor fire behavior and smoke impacts, and respond appropriately to protect life, property, infrastructure, improvements, recreation, cultural and natural resources.
- Manage human resources assigned to the incident in a manner that promotes a positive work environment and ensure that
 everyone is treated with dignity and respect.
 - Manage the fire cost effectively, commensurate with the direction of the Agency Administrators and values at risk.

4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:

- Coordinate with Lewis County Emergency Management, Lewis County Fire Department and Sherriff's Office, and the Cowlitz Ranger District on evacuation planning and dissemination of information.
 - · Continue daily to assess road and area closures and provide recommendations to implement or rescind as appropriate.
- Maintain a presence in the community of Packwood, Upper and Lower Timberline, and Goat Rocks Communities. Continue
 to share accurate information with the community to maintain positive relationships.
 - · Prioritize the protection of structures, infrastructure, communities, and cultural and critical habitat.
 - Suppression actions in wilderness will follow MIST guidelines, and are limited to chainsaws, pumps, and aircraft.

Suppression within inventoried roadless areas must be approved by the Agency Administrator and Regional Forester.

- Continue repair and clean-up of forest roads that have been used for control lines and implement suppression repair for any control lines that are no longer needed.
- Coordinate with assigned agency resource advisors to ensure that all tactical actions meet agency specific objectives. Utilize
 weed wash station prior to going to the line and before demobilization.
- Ensure accountability of resources and continually evaluate and mitigate hazards as well as fire behavior. Implement team IWI process in the event of accident or emergency and include medical plan in daily IAP.

General Situational Awareness:

- Steep and rugged terrain, rolling material, and unstable footing.
- Enhanced hygiene (especially handwashing), PPE, and monitoring practices help limit the infection rate of the first responders.
 - Reduced workload leading to complacency, taking actions to ensure job readiness.

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

High pressure will continue across the fire area today bringing slightly warmer and drier conditions. Highs will generally be in the 70s with minimum relative humidity in the 20 percent range. Dispersion will be poor with smoke trapped below the inversion through mid afternoon. Winds will generally be light and terrain driven.

WEDNESDAY:

WEATHER: Smoke trapped below the inversion will lift after 1400. Smoke and haze lingering through the afternoon, Few clouds.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE: 2500-3500 feet. 72-78°

79° at ICP

MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 20-30%

20-FOOT WINDS:

- Ridgetops: South to southeast 2 to 4 mph, becoming southwest 4 to 8 mph in the afternoon.
- Div A: South to southeast 2 to 4 mph, becoming west to southwest 3 to 6 mph in the afternoon.
- Div W: East to southeast 2 to 4 mph, becoming west to northwest 3 to 6 mph in the afternoon.

EXTENDED OUTLOOK:

The upper ridge over the Pacific Northwest will begin to break down Thursday with onshore flow redeveloping bringing cooler temperatures and higher minimum relative humidity. A series of weather systems to move across the fire area beginning Friday afternoon and continuing into next week that will bring beneficial rainfall, much cooler temperatures, and high humidity.

<u>Fuels</u>: Mix conifer timber, TU5 and TL9, with Douglas-fir, western hemlock, and scattered western red cedar. Duff is around 6 inches deep. North slopes are denser timber and higher fuel moistures. Scattered plantations of Doug-fir regeneration are represented GS2.

General Fire Behavior

The fire is terrain and fuel driven under low humidity and continues to back into the wind and downslopes easily. Moderate to occasional active fire behavior is expected this afternoon with surface fire spread and single-tree torching. Spotting distance up to 1/10 mile can be expected. Shading from smoke may limit overall fire activity throughout the day.

Specific Fire Behavior

- <u>Div A</u>: The fire will continue to actively back downslope from the Three Peaks ridge and will likely continue to impact forest road 041. With southern winds the flanking fire will become aligned with the slope and make run upslope towards Three Peaks Ridge on the east flank. Limited fire spread is expected with smoldering and creeping along the rest of the Division.
- <u>Div W</u>: Moderate fire activity with surface spread on the north part of the division. The rest of the division should see limited fire activity with smoldering and creeping.
- <u>Div Z</u>: There is potential for the fire to make an upslope run from Coal Creek to Bear Grass Butte on the eastern part of the Division. Otherwise expect to see minimal fire behavior with backing and creeping.

Structure Group: Limited fire activity is expected within the structure group.

Air Operations

Low level inversion and smoke lingering in the valley will limit the use of aviation throughout the day.

Safety

There are many areas on all divisions that have unburned fuel between the fireline and fire, be alert to the fires location to your position.

SHORT-HAUL OPERATIONS

CAPABILITIES

- During an operational Short-Haul the helicopter is capable of inserting Short-Haulers into an area with tight canopy cover and/or technical terrain.
- Haul line lengths range from 100 feet to 350 feet.
- Short hauler and/or medical gear can be delivered to the medical scene even if extraction by short-haul is not necessary.


ORDERING


- EMT or Medical Incident IC determines medical extraction is required.
- Follow local established procedures and/or Medical Incident Report (MIR) in the IRPG.
- Confirm aircraft type, call sign, estimated time of arrival and frequency.
- Give site selection information when ordering: hazards (i.e. ash, smoke, snags, aerial), tree height, terrain, and patient transport configuration (supine or seated position). Repeat hazards and give updated weather conditions as well as brief patient update to responding helicopter.

PROCESS: The helicopter will fly to the coordinates provided. They will make contact with ground personnel on scene with the patient using an identified air-to-ground frequency. The helicopter will complete a short-haul recon and size up, gather patient update information and then fly to a landing zone (LZ) to configure for short-haul operations. The helicopter will be monitoring the appropriate air-to-ground, air guard and victor frequencies. From this point, ground resources should only contact the helicopter in case of an emergency. During the insertion and extraction process ground personnel must be clear of the area.

ON SCENE - EXPECT THE FOLLOWING

- 1 or 2 rescuers (at least one qualified as an EMT or higher)
- Backboard (if needed and not already on scene)
- All equipment necessary for patient extraction





Incident within an Incident (IWI)

On Scene at location of the patient with significant injury

Upon occurrence of a "Medical Emergency" within the incident involving significant injury, complex situation or fatality, the highest qualified person on-scene shall take control of the situation as the On-Scene Incident Commander and declare Medical Emergency on the incident Command Channel to Goat Rocks Communications.

The nearest Division/Group Supervisor or Operations Chief, Safety will respond to the scene to support IWI.

- On Scene Incident Commander or Goat Rocks Communications will take immediate action to clear all radio traffic on the incident Command Channel by broadcasting "Emergency Traffic Only".
- On Scene Incident Commander or Division Group Supervisor or Operations Chief will notify Air Attack of IWI and provide GPS location incident and extraction point.
- On-Scene Incident Commander will complete Medical Incident Report (MIR) as soon as possible and relay to Incident Communications. At no time during the incident will the name of the patient(s) be used over the radio.
- **Information Officer** will manage external communication. All information released from the incident shall be through the **Information Officer** with the approval of the **Incident Commander**.
- The **Incident Commander** will contact the **Agency Administrator** and local **Duty Officer** who will contact appropriate officials of the agency.

If the incident involves a fatality, the **Agency Administrator** will be responsible for implementing Agency specific protocols.

For non-serious (green) incidents that do not require transport to medical facility **On Scene Incident Commander** will notify **Division/ Group Supervisor** and **Safety**. These incidents do not require immediate notification through Goat Rocks Communication.
