

A highly amplified upper ridge is developing across the Inland Northwest today and will remain in the region through Friday. Hot temperatures and a deep layer of dry air will allow for unstable conditions favorable for the growth and spread of fire. Though winds will be relatively light and terrain-driven, relative humidity will be low, with poor recovery during the overnight hours. Haze and smoke from local and regional fires will likely be present at times. A strong system will move through the region early this weekend, leading to higher relative humidity but stronger winds on Saturday.

Supervisors are required to go over this list each morning with assigned resources.

Self-Awareness / Screening. How are you doing?

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- Camp Crud (not feeling well)

- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Rash/Blisters
- Itchy/Scratchy
- Diarrhea

Supervisors if you have a member not feeling well/sick or symptomatic: Safety Officer.

- Review expectations on maintaining a healthy environment:
- Masks are optional, unless otherwise directed.
- Modules (e.g. crews, engines) should send representatives to pick up meals, attend briefings and any other needs for the entire group: 1 person for engine crews, 1-2 people for 20 person crews.
- Observe 6-foot social distancing during briefings and while standing in line for meals, and any other time you are near people outside of your module.
- Limit closed contact between firefighters as much as possible, use crew representatives to pick up supplies, fuel, etc.
- Keep clean sanitized hands
- Maintain clean and sanitized workspace/eating/sleeping areas.
