Mixed conifer forests dominated by Douglas-fir, Western hemlock, red cedar, spruce, and alder. Low to Moderate herbaceous/shrub component. Moderate to high dead/down/duff component.

<u>Mature Conifer Forest</u>: Fuel Model: **TU5** – High Load, Dry Climate Timber-Shrub; and Fuel Model **TL9** – High Load, Conifer Litter. Herbaceous and live woody fuels are green and will not contribute to surface fire spread.

Second-growth Conifer Forest: Fuel Model: TL3 and TL9 - Moderate to High Load Conifer Litter.

After being notified by your supervisor of your tentative release date:

<u>Step 2</u>. Submit time for all personnel and equipment to Finance per directions in IAP. Ensure all Final CTR's and Shift Tickets have been submitted to Finance the night before your demob day.

Step 3. Once you receive confirmation from FINANCE with a copy of your OF-288 and other financial documentation you are free to complete Step 4 and travel home.

<u>Step 4</u>. Complete Demob Checkout Sheet using QR code on the cover of the IAP. If unable to use, see demob. Once demob receives confirmation from Finance and your demob checkout sheet has been electronically submitted, you will be released in the system.
