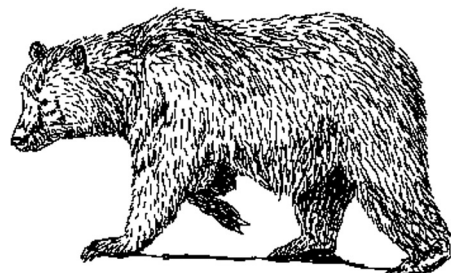

Weather Discussion: An upper level low pressure system will linger over the region through Friday and kick east and out of the region on Saturday. Conditions will remain dry with a slow increase in afternoon temperatures. Winds will shift to a more north or northeast direction through the day on Friday. High pressure will return Saturday night through Monday and we can expect temperatures to climb well into the 90s by the first of the week. More active weather is expected over the region beginning late Tuesday and possibly lingering into Wednesday.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: See attached spot weather forecast. Max temp near 83. Min RH near 17%. Winds; North Northeast 8 to 12 mph.

FUELS: Cow Canyon - grass and brush with timber and brush stringers in draws with larger pockets of timber on northern aspects. Fuel moistures are dry with herbaceous estimated to be partially cured but dry enough to carry fire in most areas. Woody fuels are dry enough for fire spread.

Vantage Highway – Grass fuels are cured and brush fuels are mostly cured.
Energy Release Component for the area fires are near the 95th percentile.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: With north to northeast wind in the forecast, the tendency for the fire to spread to the south and west exists. southern and westerly flanks of the fire have potential for Expect fire spread to continue in areas that are unlined or where fire lines are indirect. In timber fuel types expect torching and in areas where there is wind/slope alignment, potential for upslope runs exists. In grass and brush fuels, expect higher rates of spread and moderated difficulty to contain. Potential for spotting exists with any torching. Most spotting should be short range with max spotting distance near 0.3 miles and a probability of ignition of 70 to 80 %.

Fire will have the potential to cross un-supported fire lines where smoldering fire is adjacent to adequate surface fuels.

Rates of spread in the grass/sage will be approaching 90 feet/minute and with wind/slope alignment rates of spread can exceed 150 feet/minute. In the timber fuels, rates of spread will be near 40 feet per minute. With single and group torching.

SPECIFIC:

Night Shift: Expect unlined areas to continue to spread with winds. Fire will remain active in the mid to upper slopes in the thermal belt. Conditions will support burnout. Spotting potential will diminish after dark.

AIR OPERATIONS: Expect areas of smoke haze in the morning

SAFETY

Light grass and brush fuels are very sensitive to slight changes in wind and or slope and can be smoldering one minute and running the next with 6 to 8 feet flame lengths.

Spot fires can initiate quickly and spread rapidly.

EMERGENCY PLAN INCIDENT WITHIN AN INCIDENT

ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER

In the event of an accident or medical incident of any size, your primary responsibility is to ENSURE that the victim(s) receive prompt and effective Triage, Treatment, Extrication and Transport.

- **ENSURE THE MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORT IN THE INCIDENT ACTION PLAN IS BEING USED AND FOLLOWED- *IF DETERMINED TO BE A GREEN, DO NOT DECLARE EMERGENCY TRAFFIC AND ONLY COMPLETE LINE 1-4 ON MIR*.**
- Conduct size-up of the incident nature of accident, number type of resources involved, latitude and longitude location (DD°MMM.MM format): notify incident communications center and supervisor, request assistance as needed.
- Order and coordinate medical and support response to the accident.
- Evaluate special needs (law enforcement, haz mat, etc.).
- Clear the command frequency if medical emergency, coordinate with incident communications and air attack for air medical transportation needs.
- Preserve and photograph the scene for accident investigation.
- Remain aware of surroundings and the status of the main incident (delegate personnel to monitor the main fire) to ensure safety of medical treatment personnel.
- Until relieved, supervise and manage all personnel involved at the incident scene.
