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### ... A chance of showers and thunderstorms...

<u>Weather Discussion:</u> Moisture associated with the low pressure system will linger for one more day...then quickly exit Wednesday evening. This will result in scattered showers and a few thunderstorms through Wednesday evening. The shower and thunderstorm potential will get shifted north and east of the fire area for a return to dry and still warm weather. There will be the possibility for gap winds along the Cascades each afternoon.

**SKY/WEATHER:** Variable clouds. A chance of steinshowers and thunderstorms.

### **INPUTS**

WEATHER SUMMARY: See attached spot weather forecast. Chance of showers and thunderstorms, LAL 2. - Temps near 97. Min RH near 20%. Winds- Southeast 8-10 mph with gusts to 20 mph in the afternoon. Winds gusty and erratic near thunderstorms.

FUELS: Cow Canyon - grass and brush with timber and brush stringers in draws with larger pockets of timber on northern aspects. Note-Fuel loading in grass fuels is much higher than recent years. Fuel moistures are dry with herbaceous estimated to be partially cured but dry enough to carry fire in most areas. Woody fuels are dry enough for fire spread.

Vantage Highway – Grass fuels are cured and brush fuels are mostly cured. Note- fuel loading in grass fuels is much higher than past years.

Energy Release Component for the area fires are near the 90th to 95th percentile.

### **OUTPUTS**

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Elevated fire behavior potential continues. Chance of area thunderstorms with gusty and erratic winds in the fire area which may impact our fires with increased potential for flare ups with spotting across fire lines. Additionally, potential exists for new fire starts from the passing storms and with any winds, new fires could experience rapid fire growth.

In the event the passing storms miss our fire area, expect smoldering fire behavior. With afternoon wind gusts to 20 mph, pay attention to wind/slope alignment. Slight potential for flare ups in areas of dirty burns will continue. Torching with spotting is still possible. Adjacent fuels are very receptive to spots and any spot fires will initiate quickly and spread rapidly. Most spotting should be short range with max spotting distance near 0.4 miles. Probability of ignition is 80 %.

Head fire rates of spread in the grass/sage will be approaching 60 feet/minute. In the timber fuels, rates of spread will be near 20 feet per minute with single and group torching.

### SPECIFIC:

<u>Cow Canyon:</u> Expect smoldering fire behavior. Chance of thunderstorms in the area that may impact the fire with gusty and erratic winds which could cause flare ups and spotting. Additionally, fire weakened trees could become overhead hazards. Pay attention to the potential for wind/slope and/or wind drainage alignment channeling winds.

<u>Vantage Highway</u>: In the event thunderstorm winds hit the fire, potential for flare ups and spotting increase.

<u>Initial Attack:</u> In the event resources respond to a new start, update your Situational Awareness by observing the fuels, weather, and topography where the new fire is located. Any new start in light flashy fuels (grass/brush) will see rapid rates of spread.

AIR OPERATIONS: Potential for gusty and erratic winds near thunderstorms.

### **SAFETY**

Heads up for chance of thunderstorms with lightning and gusty and erratic winds- good time to review thunderstorm safety on page 17 in the IRPG.

This year's grass crop is way above average and most is fully cured. Spot fires or new starts will initiate quicky and rapidly spread.

Continue to watch for fire weakened trees to be sensitive to increases in wind and can become overhead hazards.

### **TOPICS:**

### MANAGING THE MAYDAY

While the Emergency Plan is a useful tool, the four (4) W's are simple, easy and provides you with a guide to establish most of the pertinent information needed to successfully manage the Incident Within an Incident (IWI).

The four (4) W's of size up:

"W"hat do I have?

"W"hat am I doing?

"W"hat do I need?

"W"ho is in command?

We call this the 30 second blueprint for success. While it may not answer all the questions needed, it certainly gets you off on the right foot.

### **COMMON BARRIERS TO EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION INCLUDE (Part 2 and 3):**



Lack of focus. You can't communicate effectively when you're multitasking. If you're checking your phone, planning what you're going to say next, or daydreaming you're almost certain to miss nonverbal cues in the conversation. To communicate effectively, you need to avoid distractions and stay focused.

**Inconsistent body language.** Nonverbal communication should reinforce what is being said, not contradict it. If you say one thing, but your body language says something else, your listener will likely feel you're being dishonest. For example, you can't say "yes" while shaking your head no.

# FROM: DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

# SUBJECT: WORKING AROUND OFFENDERS/DNR KITCHENS

- NO PERSON SHALL BE ALLOWED TO CARRY FIREARMS IN THE AREA WHERE
  OFFENDERS ARE WORKING. (It is acceptable to secure weapons in vehicles while entering
  into the working vicinity of offenders)
- **DO NOT GIVE OR TAKE ANYTHING FROM AN OFFENDER.** (Offenders are identified by red ball caps or red hard hats.)
- DO NOT TAKE PHOTOS OR INTERVIEW OFFENDERS WITHOUT APPROVAL FROM DNR INMATE LIAISON. (Signed consent forms required.)
- **DO NOT DO ANY FAVORS FOR OFFENDERS.** (Examples passing on a message, giving tobacco, asking for change, mailing a letter, using a phone, etc.)
- PROMPTLY REPORT ANY SUSPICIOUS ACT TO THE SUPERVISOR, DOC STAFF OR INMATE LIAISON. (The most innocent act/favor can have consequences that could negatively affect an offender for years.)
- USE OF TABACCO PRODUCTS IN KITCHEN AREA IS NOT ALLOWED. (Offenders are not allowed to use any tobacco products.)
- HARRASSMENT OF ANY KIND WILL NOT BE TOLDERATED. (All harassment allegations involving offenders will be reported to Human Resources and the involved agencies representatives.)
- OFFENDERS ON DNR CREWS ARE RATED AS MINIMUM CUSTODY.
- TREAT OFFENDERS WITH RESPECT, BUT PRACTICE THE CORRECTIONAL DISTANCE. DON'T GET PERSONAL. (Offenders generally feel good with being part of the fire suppression effort, treat them with the same respect and dignity as other fire fighters but DON'T GET PERSONAL.
- OFFENDERS ARE TRAINED IN WORK ETHICS AND JOB SKILLS. (Offenders are trained and experienced in their job assignments and work ethic. They are held accountable for job performance and behavior.)

ACKNOWLEDGE CREWS FOR A JOB WELL DONE, OFFENDERS DO GOOD WORK AND APPRECIATE THE RECOGNITION. Offenders need good professional role models as part of their rehabilitation process, consider their presence and set good examples by the context of your conversations and choice of language used.

# **COVID-19 Mitigations for Cow Canyon/Vantage Road Fires**

- Masks are not required indoors unless working in a county with a HIGH COVID-19 community level. Currently, Kittitas County community level is LOW and Yakima County is MEDIUM (masking indoors is optional).
- Conduct daily verbal screening checks within crews, report any COVID-like symptoms to your direct supervisor. Supervisors should report any positive symptoms to the Medical Unit for next steps.
- Observe social distancing standards while waiting in line for food and limit contact with others outside of your crew in the food service line. If possible, send crew representatives to pick up meals.
- Practice good personal hygiene, wash hands frequently and disinfect hightraffic areas on a regular basis.
- Limit close contact between firefighters and the public as much as possible to prevent exposure and spread.







# EMERGENCY PLAN INCIDENT WITHIN AN INCIDENT

## ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER

In the event of an accident or medical incident of any size, your primary responsibility is to ENSURE that the victim(s) receive prompt and effective Triage, Treatment, Extrication and Transport.

- ENSURE THE MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORT IN THE INCIDENT ACTION PLAN IS BEING USED AND FOLLOWED- \*IF DETERMINED TO BE A GREEN, DO NOT DECLARE EMERGENCY TRAFFIC AND ONLY COMPLETE LINE 1-4 ON MIR\*.
- Conduct size-up of the incident nature of accident, number type of resources involved, latitude and longitude location (DD°MMM.MM format): notify incident communications center and supervisor, request assistance as needed.
- Order and coordinate medical and support response to the accident.
- Evaluate special needs (law enforcement, haz mat, etc.).
- Clear the command frequency if medical emergency, coordinate with incident communications and air attack for air medical transportation needs.
- Preserve and photograph the scene for accident investigation.
- Remain aware of surroundings and the status of the main incident (delegate personnel to monitor the main fire) to ensure safety of medical treatment personnel.
- Until relieved, supervise and manage all personnel involved at the incident scene.
