.DISCUSSION...A dry cold front will push through the region this evening, with gusty winds and low humidities east of the Cascades. On Tuesday, cooler temperatures, slightly higher humidities, and slightly stronger winds east of the Cascades are expected. After a dry, near-normal day Wednesday, below normal temperatures and widespread shower chances are expected Thursday into the weekend. A few thunderstorms may be embedded with showers Thursday and Friday.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Cooler temperatures and elevated relative humidity today will limit growth potential on the Chilcoot and Ridge fires. Backing and flanking fire with isolated torching will occur in heavy concentrations of timber litter.

Excellent overnight recoveries and cloudy conditions will lead to an abbreviated burn period. Expect heavy fuels to actively burn between 1500 and 1900. With frontal passage expect elevated NW winds in the afternoon. These winds should be light in sheltered areas of the fire but could surface more strongly on exposed ridgetops. Isolated torching should be expected as winds increase, but the lichen will not be an available fuel through today's burn period.

Expect surface fire with Flamelength <1.5 ft and Rate of Spread up to 2 ch/hr in the heavy timber litter. Fire activity could be somewhat higher in sheltered stands of dense timber. ERC is forecast at the 81st percentile falling on the average trend line for this part of the fire season.

SPECIFIC:

DIVS E:

The brush and fine fuel component on exposed slopes and in the timber understory will not burn independently with the elevated humidity. Some growth is expected in the brush fuel type in areas where heavy dead and down can transfer heat to the adjacent fuels. The young plantations that lack logging slash will not carry fire. Backing fire is expected on the south side of the Division where contiguous areas of heavy dead and down exist.

DIVS H:

Elevated humidities will provide an excellent opportunity to hold and improve existing containment lines throughout the Division. Where contiguous areas of heavy dead and down exist on the south portion of the Division above Hipower Creek, backing and flanking is expected.

DIVS S/W:

The Ridge fire will be most active on the north side in the heavy timber litter. Sheltered fuels under the canopy will burn throughout the day.

Night:

Overnight recoveries will be excellent. Expect wet surface conditions late in the shift. Winds will be light. Very low fire potential throughout the shift.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Prevailing E winds that have impacted visibility on the fire will shift to NW with frontal passage. This will bring some improvement to visibility in the afternoon, but regional smoke impacts will continue to hamper aviation operations.

FIRE BEHAVIOR SAFETY:

Green trees can hold heat in the bole for many days before becoming weak enough to fail. Avoid complacency, don't loiter in bad locations, look up, look down, look around.



Hazards & Risks

Heat Related Illness: Warm temperatures are forecast for the fire. Know the signs and symptoms of heat related stress. Staying well hydrated throughout your entire shift is essential. Good nutrition, fitness level and drinking plenty of electrolyte-replacing fluids along with frequent rest breaks will help reduce the chances of becoming sick. Understand that **heat stroke** is a life-threatening condition!

Review the signs & symptoms and patient treatment guidelines found in the IRPG.

Hazard Tree Safety: Hazard tree indicators include:

- Trees burning for any period of time
- High risk tree species known for rot or shallow roots
- Numerous dead & downed trees
- Dead, broken, or burning tops & limbs overhead
- Accumulations of downed limbs around the base of the tree
- Absence of needles, bark or limbs
- Tree leaning or hung up

Look for these indicators not only in the fire area, but in the green too. Scout out your work area and identify these hazards prior to going to work.

Are You Fatigued? Know the Signs:

- Falling asleep and head nodding
- Feeling restless and irritable with people
- Having difficulty focusing on simple tasks
- Feeling apathetic – having a lack of motivation
- Trouble grasping complex situations
- Cannot keep track of the current situation
- Inability to think about several things at once
- Cannot assess risk or anticipating consequences
- Cannot control mood - exhibiting inappropriate behavior
- SOLUTION: Rest, good hydration and balanced nutrition


