FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Drier conditions today and temperatures 10 degrees warmer than yesterday will cause fire activity to increase throughout the fire area. Gentle breeze from the north may increase fire intensity on the north edge of Chilcoot and Ridge but backing into the wind will limit fire growth potential. On the south perimeter of the fires, northerlies will preheat downwind vegetation, testing containment features and increasing fire growth. Fire will be most active where timber litter is contiguous. Expect limited activity in brush and young timber stands lacking timber litter.

Excellent overnight recoveries and cloudy conditions will lead to a late start to the burn period. Expect heavies and jackpot fuels to begin active burning between 1400-1600. Relative Humidity rebounds from lows in the 30 percent range after 2000. Group torching should be expected in areas where terrain features align with north winds. This may lead to downwind spotting up to 2/10th of a mile. The lichen may come into play today allowing for vertical fire spread up the tree boles, but will not aggressively burn at RH above 30%.

Expect surface fire with Flamelength 1-3 ft and Rate of Spread up to 3-5 ch/hr in the heavy timber litter. Fire activity -could be somewhat higher in sheltered stands of dense timber. ERC is forecast at the 86st percentile, trending average for this part of the fire season.

SPECIFIC:

DIVS E: Afternoon winds will align with Hipower Bluffs on the SE side of the fire. Expect the fire to continue to move toward the south. Rollout may occur toward the bottom of Swash Creek and threaten slope reversal.

DIVS H: Expect active fire in the afternoon along Hipower Creek where wind aligns with the N-S drainage. Rollout and flanking have the potential to position the fire to make small duration uphill runs.

DIVS D: Fire in the Division will actively back downslope pushed by a north wind. Spotting may occur up to 2/10ths of a mile from the fires edge. Uphill runs from the bottom of Hipower Creek can cause group torching and associated spotting.

DIVS S: The west flank of the fire in the Division is likely to be most active. Watch for spotting across containment lines to the south.

DIVS W: The east flank of the fire in the Division is likely to be most active. Watch for spotting across containment lines to the south.

Night: Overnight recoveries will be excellent. Expect wet surface conditions late in the shift. Winds will be light and diurnal. Very low growth potential throughout the shift. Any significant activity will be due to rollout.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Areas of smoke in the morning. Conditions likely to improve in the afternoon as N winds begin to increase. Ridgetops and higher elevations will clear first, followed by increased visibility in the drainages.

FIRE BEHAVIOR SAFETY:

Steep slopes can pose fire behavior issues for suppression resources. Heavy fuels are likely to rollout causing issues for underslung line and cuptrench. Fire ignited at the toe of slopes can move quickly uphill.

Hazards & Risks

Ash Pit Hazards: Stump holes are abundant in the fire area. Use caution when using water to mop up and avoid straight streaming directly into the ash pit as scalding steam can suddenly erupt from the hole and burn you. Things to LOOK OUT for:

- Extensive root systems of trees and shrubs.
- Deep duff or peat, the organic layer covering mineral soil.
- Landscapes that have once been cultivated or manipulated by heavy equipment, old dozer piles, sawmills, timber sale yards, or decking areas.
- Small rodent holes that have become filled with decadent, combustible debris, beaver holes near dams and stream beds, badger and coyote dens.
- White ash is sometimes an indicator of ash pits as are swarms of hovering insects.
- With the sun behind the suspected ash pit, look for small nearly translucent smokes that dissipate quickly above the ground.
- Ash pits often give off the smell of incomplete combustion or of creosote burning.

Helicopter Extraction Operations: The intent of a helicopter extraction operation is to insert qualified personnel into inaccessible areas to extract a patient for transport to the nearest medical facility. These operations are not meant to be a medical transport resource but a way to move the patient off the fireline and bring to a waiting air or ground ambulance for direct transport to a medical facility.

Some considerations:

- Establish communications with aircrew. Provide information regarding known hazards (on approach path or in LZ), terrain, wind speed & direction and patient updates.
 - Choose the extraction site away from the fireline or black edge.
 - Ensure the area is clear of debris and nonessential equipment or personnel.
 - Rotor wash may affect overhead hazards and blowing dust can create “brown out” conditions. Protect the patient from blowing dust.
 - Aerial supervision is valuable for coordinating aviation medevac missions.
 - The aircrew makes the final decision regarding the safety of the mission.
- Always have a contingency plan in case the helicopter cannot be used.**
- Don’t get caught up in the urgency of the situation and disregard basic fireline and aviation safety procedures.
