.DISCUSSION...Cooler, unsettled weather with widespread wetting rainfall is expected to start Thursday morning and last through Friday night. An isolated thunderstorm is possible are expected Friday and Saturday, but there is higher confidence that thunderstorms will remain along and east of the Cascade Crest. Even if storms form in the Cascades, watch out for outflows traveling down the Umpqua River Basin. An outflow following this path could create a windy-gyre along the western side of the peak this fire is settled to the west of.

.THURSDAY...

Sky/weather.....Cloudy (90-100 percent). 80% chance for rain showers all day.

Max temperature....53 to 56 degrees.

Min humidity.....68 to 80 percent.

Eye level winds....Northeast to east in the morning at 1 to 3 mph becoming northwest at 2 to 4 mph in the afternoon.

Wind (20 ft).....Northeast to east in the morning at 1 to 4 mph becoming northwest at 3 to 7 mph in the afternoon.

Winds may gust as strong as 15 mph in the general wind and faster (20-25 mph) in the outflow around stronger showers.

Mixing height.....1100 ft AGL.

Transport winds....South around 5 mph.

CWR.....60 percent (0.1"). Chance for 0.25" is 20%.

Sky/weather.....Cloudy (85-95 percent). 80% chance for rain showers.

Eye level winds....Northwest at 2 to 4 mph lowering to north at 1 to 3 mph after midnight; possibly turning northeast before morning.

Wind (20 ft).....Northwest at 2 to 6 mph lowering to northeast at 1 to 4 mph after midnight

Mixing height.....800 ft AGL.

Transport winds....Northwest around 6 mph.

Sky/weather.....Mostly cloudy (75-85 percent). 70% chance for rain showers through noon, lowering to a 45% chance in the evening. The chance for an isolated thunderstorm is 25%.

Eye level winds....Slight northeast component at 1 to 3 mph in the morning becoming north at 2 to 4 mph through most the day.

*Winds may not follow a uniform direction for long if rain showers are active. Erratic winds may also be present in the outflow from thunderstorms.

Wind (20 ft).....Slight northeast component at 1 to 4 mph in the morning becoming north at 3 to 6 mph through most the day. North winds may gust up to 12 mph, and stronger near heavy showers and thunderstorms.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

A closed cold front over the fire area will usher in a prolonged period of cooler and wetter conditions. Forecast precipitation with some confidence in 0.25 inch will significantly reduce fire activity around the full fire perimeter today. Precipitation potential and elevated RH will continue to hamper fire activity through the holiday weekend. Fine dead fuel moistures will quickly climb to 17-20% and 10 hr fuels will follow. At higher elevations, the brush component has only begun the curing process and is likely to reverse trend, temporarily increasing live fuel moisture with the influx of available moisture.

Conditions are unlikely to support fire spread in fine dead and live fuels. Expect minimal fire growth confined to jackpots of heavy fuels under closed canopy timber. Falling snags and rollout from continued consumption are likely to come to rest in unreceptive fuels.

Surface fire only in jackpots and fully sheltered canopy confined to <1ft. Rate of Spread <1ch/hr in large downed logs. Fire activity -could be somewhat higher in sheltered stands of dense timber.

ERC (North Umpqua FDRA – Grandad and Toketee RAWS) Forecast below the 75% today, below 50% tomorrow.

SPECIFIC:

Chilcoot: Minimal fire activity. Monitor and take note of any rollout to the bottom of the slope that may be of concern when warmer and drier conditions return.

Ridge: Minimal fire activity. Trees may continue to consume on the interior of the bole and within the roots. Trees falling over containment lines could pose a risk when warmer and drier conditions return.

Night: Foggy conditions may accompany overnight precipitation and severely impact visibility, especially when combined with smoke. Rollout and falling snag hazards may threaten underslung lines.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Areas of smoke in the morning. Heavy clouds and rainfall are likely to negatively impact aviation operations. Precipitation will be lighter in the afternoon but persistent throughout the daylight hours.

FIRE BEHAVIOR SAFETY:

Vegetation on steep slopes can hold material such as rocks, boulders, and large logs to the slope. When this vegetation is consumed in a fire, it can allow these materials to break loose and head downhill. Today's wet conditions will add to this phenomenon by creating highly viscous conditions.

Hazards & Risks

Working around and with Heavy Equipment: Dozers, Excavators, Feller-Bunchers and other assorted logging equipment are working on the fires. Remember the limited visibility of the operator. If you can't see his or her face, chances are they can't see you. When working directly with Heavy Equipment, maintain a safe distance and eye contact with the operator. Sometimes radio communications can be challenging with the noise levels in the area. Conduct a briefing with the operator before getting to work and have a plan. Reference the IRPG for specific guidance.

Distracted Firefighting: Radios, cell phones, texting, conversations, eating, drinking, reading maps, looking at the fire.....the list goes on. It is easy to get distracted from the very task you are supposed to be focused on. Make every attempt to avoid these distractions whether you're driving or engaged in the fire fight; a brief nano-second of distraction can have disastrous results.

Wildlife & Livestock Encounters: Watch for wildlife and livestock within the fire area and along roadways. Bears are in the area. Avoid leaving food and trash in sleeping areas, along the fireline or at drop points. Secure your vehicles with windows up when parked in the field. Animals tend to be most active during the dawn and dusk hours when visibility is reduced on the road. Drive at "deer speed".

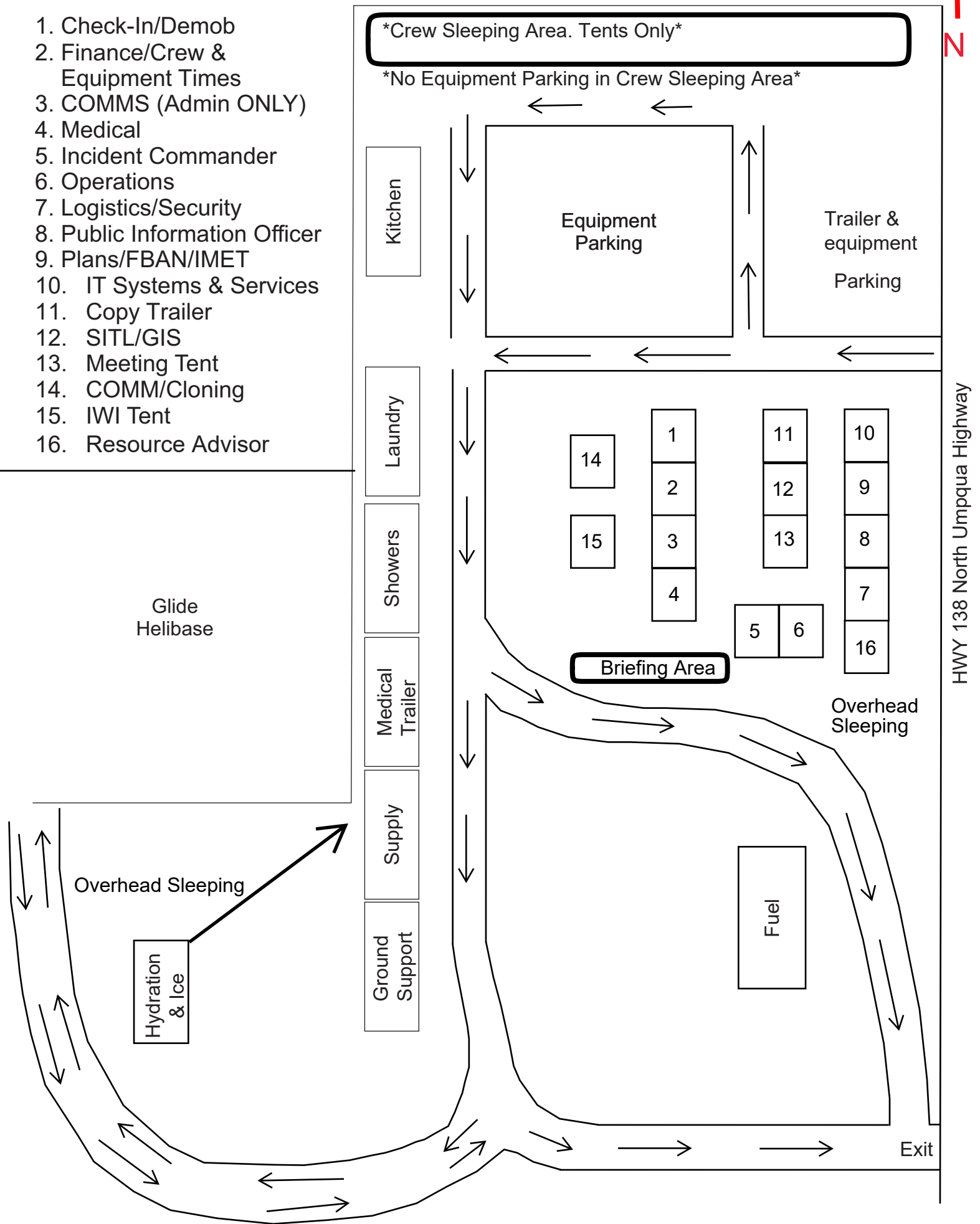
Chilcoat Base Camp Map
