**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** The upper-level low will remain off the NorCal coast through Sunday night...then shift off to the east. Abundant moisture will wrap around the low and into the region Saturday and Sunday. This will result in a good chance of showers and embedded thunderstorms both days. Temperatures will be below normal and relative humidity well above normal. Winds will be variable...from easterly at night to westerly during the day but mainly below 10 mph. A weaker weather system on Monday will keep some mention of showers in the forecast. The coming week looks like it will be on the cool side with additional weak disturbances moving through the region.

Continued cool temperatures and the chance for showers and thunderstorms.

#### **FUELS:**

Fuels in the fire area are primarily composed of *Timber Litter*, and *Timber Understory with moss/lichen present in most stands*. Mature conifer stands with western hemlock and Douglas fir present, generally with heavy surface fuel loading. 30 to 50+ year old second growth conifer stands contain needle litter and some down woody debris. Brush and reproduction present in areas with less dense canopies. Brush and understory species include huckleberry, ocean spray, vine maple, ceanothus, and manzanita.

Today's Forecast ERC= 56st percentile 100-hr fuel moisture 21% 1000-hr fuel moisture 17%

#### **OUTPUTS**

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR GENERAL:

With yesterday's moisture and expected additional moisture over the fire area today minimal fire behavior is expected with little to no perimeter growth. Continued smoldering in duff and larger down logs and forest debris. Roll-outs on the steep slopes could carry burning debris outside fire perimeters into available fuels.

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR SPECIFIC:

**Dinner, Grizzly, and Brice Creek Fires:** With yesterday's moisture and today's forecast for additional moisture, minimal fire activity is expected with little to no perimeter growth. Areas of heavy dead and downed fuels will continue to consume along with ground fire in the duff. Burning standing dead trees will continue to be consumed creating aerial hazards. The moistened soil will increase the chance of burning and rolling debris carrying fire across containment lines. Even though these spotfires may not grow with the high fuel moistures there is a possibility they may when conditions return to a drying trend.

**Initial Attack:** In the event resources respond to a new start, recognize that fuels and topography may be different than areas you have previously worked in. Update your situational awareness to any new location or task

AIR OPERATIONS: Low clouds and fog may prohibit air operations over the fires.

#### **SAFETY**

Continue to watch for fire-weakened trees and snags. Potential for roll-outs of larger material on steep slopes.

# RESOURCE ADVISOR MESSAGE



Cottage Grove has a rich mining history and many of these activities are still on the landscape. Adits (horizonal), shafts (vertical), and small pits can still be encountered in the forest. Although many of these have been closed or covered, there may be unknown mines out there. These features can contain poisonous air, deep pools of water, and the constant risk of cave ins. If you come across these, stay out, flag nearby, take GPS points, and bring to SITL so the hazards can be shared. Avoid working in unknown ground at night when you might not see adits as readily.



# **Virtual Demob Instructions**

#### **DAY BEFORE YOUR DEMOB**

Contact FINANCE 24 hours to advise departure, turn in any outstanding CTR/Shift Tickets. Make sure they are SIGNED. Confirm there are no missing financial documentation.

# ANY OR ALL OF THE STEPS CAN BE COMPLETED THE NIGHT BEFORE TO SPEED UP THE DEMOB PROCESS

#### **DAY OF DEMOB - STEP 1**

Contact Demob at 509-432-6143 to determine your specific next steps since we are pre-clearing resources that do not have any supplies or communications equipment checked out. Honor you assigned Demob time as best as you can.

#### STEP 2 (When Set Up)

All line resources that went off-road must go through the weed wash (see IAP for locations) after your last shift. Weed wash station staff should give you a ticket after completion.

#### STEP 3 (If directed by Demob)

GROUND SUPPORT – Return incident rental vehicles; <u>ALL</u> contractors need inspection. SUPPLY – Return issued gear and leftover supplies. COMMUNICATIONS – Return any communications equipment. SITUATION UNIT – Return any issued I-Pad or GPS devices.

#### STEP 4

Proceed to FINANCE to complete closeout process, review/sign OF-288.

#### STEP 5

Proceed to CHECK-IN to turn in any Unit Logs or Evaluation documentation. Contact the Training Specialist if needed.

#### STEP 6

Once steps 1-6 are complete, finish the Demob process by calling 509-432-6143 with departure time, final destination and destination arrival time.

#### **ALL AIR TRAVELERS**

Submit your request 72 hours prior to flight date through the QR Code on the IAP Cover. Call 509-432-6143 for any questions or assistance.

#### NIGHT SHIFT PERSONNEL

All night shift personnel coming off the line will be required to meet work/rest requirements before starting the Demob process.

#### **EXTENSIONS AND CREW SWAPS**

All extension and crew swap processes <u>should</u> be done <u>at least 48 hours</u> before your last working day to help facilitate Operational resources and the Demob process.

# EMERGENCY PLAN INCIDENT WITHIN AN INCIDENT

#### ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER

In the event of an accident or medical incident of any size, your primary responsibility is to ENSURE that the victim(s) receive prompt and effective Triage, Treatment, Extrication and Transport.

- ENSURE THE MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORT IN THE INCIDENT ACTION PLAN IS BEING USED AND FOLLOWED- \* IF DETERMINED TO BE A GREEN, DO NOT DECLARE EMERGENCY TRAFFIC AND ONLY COMPLETE LINE 1-4 ON MIR\*.
- Conduct size-up of the incident, including nature of accident, number type of resources involved, latitude and longitude location (DD° MMM.MM format). Notify incident communications center and supervisor. Request assistance as needed.
- Order and coordinate medical and support response to the accident.
- Evaluate special needs (law enforcement, haz mat, etc.).
- Clear the command frequency if medical emergency. Coordinate with incident communications and air attack for air medical transportation needs.
- Preserve and photograph the scene for accident investigation.
- Remain aware of surroundings and the status of the main incident (delegate personnel to monitor the main fire) to ensure safety of medical treatment personnel.
- Until relieved, supervise and manage all personnel involved at the incident scene.
