<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> A cold front will move through northern Washington with just the tail end

brushing the Umpqua fires. This will result in some morning fog and stratus, slightly cooler temperatures, and possibly increased gusts on the ridgetops. High pressure will follow on Wednesday and strengthen through the end of the week. This will result in a rapid warming and drying trend with well above normal temperatures and low relative humidity.


Fuels in the fire area are primarily composed of *Timber Litter*, and *Timber Understory with moss/lichen present in most stands*. Mature conifer stands with western hemlock and Douglas fir are present, generally have heavy surface fuel loading. 30 to 50+ year old second growth conifer stands contain needle litter and some down woody debris. Brush and reproduction are present in areas with less dense canopies.

BRANCH I: Forecast for today-ERC 77<sup>th</sup> percentile. Yesterday's obs. 1hr-13%, 10hr-14%, 100hr-15%, 1000hr-18% BRANCH II: Forecast for today-ERC 78<sup>th</sup> percentile. Yesterday's obs. 1hr-11%, 10hr-14%, 100hr-15%, 1000hr-18%

#### **OUTPUTS**

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR GENERAL:

On shore flow will continue today bringing similar temperatures and humidity values as seen yesterday. This will keep fuel conditions mostly the same until the warming and drying returns Wednesday. Fire spread potential should remain mostly the same as what was seen yesterday. Creeping and smoldering in surface fuels will be the most common fire behavior in areas burning. The potential for mature timber stands to experience fire climbing single trees where lichen are present still exists, which could create spotting potential when near the fires edge. Lichen availability should remain more isolated due to higher humidity.



Fire behavior potential and fuel availability is expected to increase significantly in the second half of the week.

#### **FIRE BEHAVIOR SPECIFIC:**

#### **BRANCH I and II**

Surface fire will continue to be smoldering and creeping. Fire spread potential will still be largely dependent on location aspect and exposure/sheltering. Southern aspects may see areas where 1hr and 10hr fuels become available to carry fire.

Areas of heavy dead and downed fuels will continue to consume along with ground fire in stump holes and duff.

Standing trees with fire in them will continue to burn, contributing to overhead hazards.

Fires with black edge up to containment features should experience minimal fire behavior and isolated to interior portions of the fire.

**Initial Attack:** In the event resources respond to a new start, recognize that fuels, topography and conditions may be different than areas you have previously worked in.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Clouds and fog in the morning then partly cloudy through the afternoon

#### **SAFETY**

Ensure that today's actions are consistent with the overall strategy and account for the forecasted changes to weather and fire behavior.

NW6 will shadow and transition at 2000 today. Transition is a time that can be marred by extreme success or failure. Ensure positive relationship-building and open lines of communications. Take a few extra minutes to get to know new personnel and provide a good briefing of actions taken up to the transition.

### WARMER WEATHER/INCREASED FIRE BEHAVIOR

Temperatures will be on the rise this week. Pay close attention to unburned pockets of fuel for rate of spread and spotting potential. Maintain awareness of fire behavior on new starts if supporting local IA. Many fatalities and injuries occur during weather pattern changes where increased fire behavior is observed in light fuels.

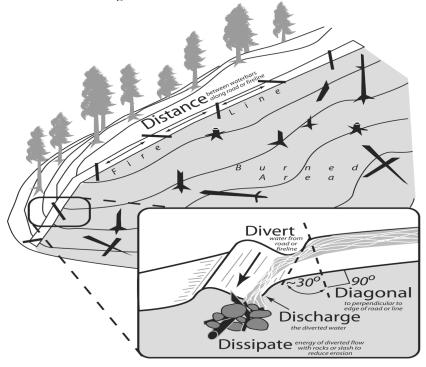

**Back-haul** all trash, un-needed flagging and signs. Please leave safety flagging in place. **On Firelines, waterbars** should be installed as described below, fire line covered with slash, and entrances blocked.

- DEPTH AND WIDTH: Waterbars need to be cut into surface, do not simply push up soil.
  - Waterbar depths for **dozer lines** should be at least 6 inches; total height from bottom of ditch to the top of the waterbar should average at least 18 inches and not exceed 24 inches.
  - Waterbar depths for **hand lines** should be at least 4 inches; total height from bottom of ditch to top of waterbar should average at least 8 inches and not exceed 12 inches.

In the event of an accident or medical incident of any size, your primary responsibility is to ENSURE that the victim(s) receive prompt and effective Triage, Treatment, Extrication and Transport.

- ENSURE THE MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORT IN THE INCIDENT ACTION PLAN IS BEING USED AND FOLLOWED- \* <u>IF DETERMINED TO BE A</u>

  <u>GREEN, DO NOT DECLARE EMERGENCY TRAFFIC AND ONLY COMPLETE</u>

  <u>LINE 1-4 ON MIR\*</u>.
- Conduct size-up of the incident, including nature of accident, number type of resources involved, latitude and longitude location (DD° MMM.MM format). Notify incident communications center and supervisor. Request assistance as needed.
- Order and coordinate medical and support response to the accident.
- Evaluate special needs (law enforcement, haz mat, etc.).
- Clear the command frequency if medical emergency. Coordinate with incident communications and air attack for air medical transportation needs.
- Preserve and photograph the scene for accident investigation.
- Remain aware of surroundings and the status of the main incident (delegate personnel to monitor the main fire) to ensure safety of medical treatment personnel.
- Until relieved, supervise and manage all personnel involved at the incident scene.
