5. Strategic Framework and Leaders Intent

Strategic Framework:

Implement suppression strategies that minimize impacts to identified values at risk, and that ensures firefighter and public safety are the top priority

Specifically manage risk to firefighters by ensuring hazards are identified, assessed, and where possible mitigated. Be prepared to accept residual risk when exposure is commensurate with values threatened and the probability of achieving objectives is high.

Leaders Intent:

Engage in all work assignments with a high degree of professionalism and provide excellent customer service to all parties involved with the incident. All assigned personnel should:

- * Exhibit professional behavior
- * Ensure effective communication
- * Manage personal safety and the safety of others
- * Conduct effective fatigue management and implement work/rest cycles

6. Management Objectives and Requirements

Implement operational plans that establish holding features across the entire perimeter of each fire resulting in minimized duration and physical extent of each, and maximizing the protection of:

- * Highway 138 corridor
- * Private timber lands
- * Bohemia Mining District, Fairview Comm Site, Chilcoot Repeater, and other infrastructure
- * Active USFS timber sales
- * Natural and cultural resources

Coordinate all fire suppression and repair work with Resource Advisors to protect natural and cultural values.

Maintain effective relationships by ensuring timely information between the IMT, affected agencies, and the public.

7. Operational Period Command Emphasis

MISSION CREEP. This point in an incident, when active fire behavior has died down, mission creep is a real problem. What can seem innocent and justified can become unnecessary risk. Clear direction has been given as to mop-up standards and other workloads so, if you aren't directed to go do an activity, don't put yourself and others at risk. IMT 6 has developed a deliberate and strategic risk plan that depends upon avoiding mission creep in order to maintain firefighter safety. This incident has an excellent safety record and IMT 6 would like to maintain that record to the finish so everyone can get home safe and healthy.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Low pressure will carve into the Northwest today. The fire will be on the southwest quadrant of the low with increasing northwest to north winds. Winds will remain breezy on the ridgetops overnight and into Thursday but look to decouple on the mid and lower slopes. Wind direction will waver from north/northeast to north/northwest by Thursday afternoon. The initial northwest push on Wednesday will usher cooler low-level marine air inland with broken low clouds through midday before scattering in the afternoon and mostly clear skies overnight.

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy. Slight chance for drizzle before 1000 becoming partly sunny in the afternoon. Breezy.

FUELS:

Fuels in the fire areas are primarily composed of *Timber Litter*, and *Timber Understory with moss/lichen present in most stands*. Mature conifer stands with western hemlock and Douglas fir present, generally have heavy surface fuel loading. 30 to 50+ year old second growth conifer stands contain needle litter and some down woody debris. Brush and reproduction present in areas with less dense canopies.

Brice, Grizzly- Forecast -ERC 89th percentile. Yesterday's obs. 1hr-16%, 10hr-19%, 100hr-11%, 1000hr-14% Chilcoot - Forecast -ERC 90th percentile. Yesterday's obs. 1hr-14%, 10hr-21%, 100hr-12%, 1000hr-15%

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR GENERAL:

Good overnight humidity recoveries with cooler and wetter conditions combined with less sunshine is shrinking the burn period. Conditions will be cooler and wetter today. The 1000-hr fuel moisture remains constant, making them available and receptive to consume. Expect lichen to be unavailable to burn with little potential for torching from the lichen as the RH will be above the critical 30% threshold.

One and 10-hour fuel moistures are higher today and won't be available to burn until later in the burn period and they're in

of any of these factors can greatly increase fire behavior: 20' Wind Speed over 13 mph, RH less than 25%, Temperature over 85, 1000-Hour Fuel Moisture less than 12%

exposed stands. The 100-hr fuels in exposed stands will be available to carry fire at low rates of spread. Creeping and backing will be the most common surface fire behavior observed in areas with active burning.

FIRE BEHAVIOR SPECIFIC:

Brice, Grizzly, Chilcoot

Div J can expect up to 2' flame lengths and less than 6 ch/hr ROS where there is active fire. Fire spread potential will be largely dependent on location, aspect, and exposure/sheltering. Expect moderated fire behavior in the sheltered stands near DP 304 than along the eastern edge of fire towards DP 300. Smoldering is expected on **Div E** with less than 2' flame lengths. There is a low chance of isolated torching on **Div A** with creeping fire behavior through unburned pockets of fuels.

Expect minimal fire behavior and smoke on the Ridge and Dinner divisions, E & A respectively as active burning and smoke would be limited to isolated interior areas of the fire today. Expect another day with backing fire and a moderate level of smoke production on **Div S/Z** as the heavy dead and down consumes. Fire will back towards the Champion Ck Rd and fill in unburned islands of fuels. If fire crosses Grizzly creek to the east, wind/slope alignment would push fire ESE towards the Noon Day Road, 2212 at 6ch/hr. The area would exhibit up to 6'FL without suppression actions.

Spotting distance up to 0.2 mi, Probability of Ignition- 50% shaded and overnight; 75% unshaded

Initial Attack: In the event resources respond to a new start, recognize that fuels, topography, and conditions may be different than areas you have previously worked in.

Leadership

The most essential element of successful wildland firefighting is competent and confident leadership. Leadership means providing purpose, direction and motivation for wildland firefighters, working to accomplish difficult tasks under dangerous, stressful circumstances. In confusing and uncertain situations, a good operational leader will:

- ✓ Take charge of assigned resources.
- ✓ Lead by example.
- ✓ Motivate firefighters with a "can do safely" attitude.
- ✓ Demonstrate initiative by taking action in the absence of orders.
- ✓ Communicate by giving specific instructions and asking for feedback.
- ✓ Supervise at the seen of action.

Supervisors must set a personal example of safe practices and procedures. Personal actions describe safety more effectively than written plans or rulebooks. Firefighters' actions tell what they consider important.

Environmental, Factors

- Wet weather is coming. Cover your gear, tents etc. Make sure you have a dry place to sleep, and dry clothes to change into
- Road will become slick and muddy, be aware of soft shoulders
- Mining hazards-Hazmat may be present, especially in the vicinity of the grizzly fire. Shafts, Adits, old MSDS chemicals etc. Maintain SA
- Watch your footing, even in camp, uneven terrain can cause a misstep and injure oneself



Extensions and Crew Swaps – NW 6

This is the Team Standard Operating procedure based on national policy

- · Resources may be demobed, regardless of crew status, if it is no longer needed.
- Contract Crews are generally not extended unless replacement resources are scarce.
 Crews may swap crew members if needed by utilizing the crew swap form at the QR code below.
- Resources ordered on 'O' numbers cannot swap crew members (exception some medical resources). These resources can extend depending on availability and needs of the incident. See Plans for a resource extension form.

Contracted Fireline Equipment Crew Swap Procedure

- Contract equipment may stay on the incident until it is no longer needed, a maximum dollar amount is reached, or replacement crew members cannot be provided.
- ➤ It is the responsibility of the contract owner to track their crew members and ensure they maintain proper work/rest ratios. The IMT assumes contracted equipment will swap crew members as needed to provide adequate rest for their employees.
- Non-fireline equipment personnel (like hand wash stations) are not tracked other than a current onsite contact.
- ➤ If replacement crew members cannot be provided, this must be documented on an ICS-213 and provided to Operations and Plans at least 72 hours prior to the 14th workday. The resource will be demobed after 14 shifts OR an extension form may be completed based on operational need, see Plans for this form.
- ➤ Crew swaps <u>MUST</u> be tracked through the below QR code form as soon as known, <u>no later than 1800</u> on the day prior to the swap. If the new crew member is the primary operator and any information in the IAP is incorrect, correct information <u>MUST be provided</u> to the Division Supervisor immediately following the operational briefing/division breakout.
- > We prefer all members of a resource swap at once if possible. The crew swap form will need to be filled out for each individual crew member.
- > Replacement workers must provide proof of current annual training upon request.
- > The IMT will NOT track a last workday for these resources in the IAP unless:
 - It was determined to be excess to the needs of the incident and will demob
 - A resource was unable to provide replacement workers and will demob



- 2. Contact **Chilcoot Communications** and declare a "Red medical" (critical), "Yellow medical" (serious), or "Green medical" (minor). Request emergency radio traffic if needed.
- 3. Give location of patient and best access for initial responders.
- 4. Describe injury(s): Are they bleeding? How much? Are they conscious? Can they talk? Do they know what's going on? How many people are hurt.
- 5. Gather information for MIR and relay to dispatch as soon as practical (see MIR back page)

Sharps Basecamp

- 1. Life threatening emergency, call 911
- 2. Call Chilcoot Communications on your Command Channel.
- 3. Contact (go to) the medical tent.
- 4. Call the medical tent 310-780-4296

Strader ICP

- 1. Life threatening emergency, call 911
- 2. Call Chilcoot Communications on Command or 949-648-1591
- 3. Non-life-threatening go to blue medical trailer located between lunch trailer and laundry trailer
