5. General Objectives:

Implement a FULL suppression strategy for Chilcoot, Grizzly, Brice Creek, Dinner and Ridge fires:

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard identification and application of a shared risk management process.
- Coordinate public information to provide timely updates to agency partners, cooperators, and the public.
- Coordinate suppression and repair activities with READs to minimize impacts on the landscape.
- Effectively manage and track costs for all five incidents.
- Coordinate with agency leadership/administrators to ensure effective and efficient management of firefighting resources.

Chilcoot, Grizzly:

- Chilcoot: provide full incident containment through suppression actions. Grizzly: monitor and evaluate conditions that could lead to fire growth, identify
 and validate strategic indirect lines.
- Coordinate with ODF-DFPA, as needed, for changing conditions specific to fire progression potentially impacting private lands.
- Repair indirect lines not currently identified as potential containment features, identify primary line repair options as applicable.
- Evaluate a PACE model for the Grizzly fire, develop near-term and long-term modeling based on future potential.
- Work with partner/stakeholders (Sierra Pacific) to access, manage private lands within fire perimeter.

Dinner, Ridge, Brice Creek:

- Achieve full containment with suppression actions and ensure adequate mop-up is conducted to reduce the threat of escape.
- Immplement full repair on all indirect line construction.
- Evaluate repair needs for primary line construction.
- Monitor access routes "Ingress/Egress" and minimize impact to road systems.
- Backhaul all equipment as applicable.

5a. Incident Requirements

- Provide Agency Administrator updates and briefings on incident status as conditions evolve.
- Firefighting operations will implement tactics that offer the highest probability of success to minimize impacts to the landscape and minimize unnecessary exposure to firefighters.
- Priority values are firefighter and public safety, critical infrastructure, private land and natural resources.

5b. Leaders Intent

- Safety: Firefighter, public, and aviation safety will be addressed through hazard/exposure risk mitigation processes.
- Risk Management: Utilize an aligned risk assessment process that mitigates exposure to firefighters through evaluation of conditions during the duration of the incident.
- Communication: Keep Agency Administrators and firefighters informed of strategic actions, accomplishments, and challenges.
- Operations: Make informed strategic/tactical decisions suppressing the fire in the right geographic locations with the appropriate resources having the highest probability of success.
- Stakeholders: Collaborate with local partners, officials, and landowners to provide situational updates pertinent to the fire.
- Logistics: Provide support ensuring food, water, and shelter for incident responders.
- Human Resources: Ensure that all incident personnel are treated with dignity and respect, while having zero tolerance for harassment, alcohol, or illegal drug use.
- Public Information: Provide timely and accurate information through media outlets, trap lines, briefings, community meetings, and social platforms.
- Finance: Monitor and communicate incident cost associated with meeting incident objectives.
- Planning: Provide incident documentation, resource tracking, and accurate data management.

<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION</u>: An upper level trough will drop south along the coast today and into northern California tonight. This will bring showers, cooler temperatures, and high humidity to the fires today and tonight. Rainfall totals of 0.2"-0.7" are expected. This system is relatively weak and will strengthen south of us, meaning winds will not be strong through the event. Showers will decrease by Saturday morning as the trough pulls away to our south.

A slight chance of showers will return on Tuesday, but wetting rains are not anticipated. A warming and drying trend is likely Wednesday into the end of the week as a ridge of high pressure builds overhead. Expect afternoon wind gusts 15-20 mph from the northwest on ridgelines each day Saturday through Wednesday.

Fuels: Fire areas are primarily composed of *Timber Litter* (TL5), and *Timber Understory* (TU5) *with moss/lichen present in most stands*. Mature conifer stands with western hemlock and Douglas-fir, often have heavy surface fuel loading. 30 to 50+ year old second growth conifer stands contain needle litter and some down woody debris. Brush and reprod are present in open stands of mature timber.



General: Fire activity will be minimal given current precipitation pattern. 100 and 1000 hour fuels will continue to consume, especially in timber stands under a dense canopy.

Potential: Chances are remote but fire could find a path to make an uphill run. Short durations of sun light can provide enough solar radiation to dry out fuels but only in exposed areas. When drying occurs lichens and other fine fuels will be first to dry out.



Air Operations

Inversion and cloudy conditions expected to impact aviation operations throughout the day.

Safety:

Standard Firefighting Order # 2 is emphasized today: Know what you fire is doing at all times. Although this fire has exhibited little activity in recent days, it is not completely out. Hot stump holes, creeping duff fire, and fire-weakened snags remain. Remain alert for these and other potential hazards.

Extensions and Crew Swaps – NW 13

This is the Team Standard Operating procedure based on national policy

- · Resources may be demobed, regardless of crew status, if it is no longer needed.
- Contract Crews are generally not extended unless replacement resources are scarce.
 Crews may swap crew members if needed by utilizing the crew swap form at the QR code below.
- Resources ordered on 'O' numbers cannot swap crew members (exception some medical resources). These resources can extend depending on availability and needs of the incident. See Plans for a resource extension form.

Contracted Fireline Equipment Crew Swap Procedure

- Contract equipment may stay on the incident until it is no longer needed, a maximum dollar amount is reached, or replacement crew members cannot be provided.
- ➤ It is the responsibility of the contract owner to track their crew members and ensure they maintain proper work/rest ratios. The IMT assumes contracted equipment will swap crew members as needed to provide adequate rest for their employees.
- Non-fireline equipment personnel (like hand wash stations) are not tracked other than a current onsite contact.
- ➤ If replacement crew members cannot be provided, this must be documented on an ICS-213 and provided to Operations and Plans at least 72 hours prior to the 14th workday. The resource will be demobed after 14 shifts OR an extension form may be completed based on operational need, see Plans for this form.
- ➤ Crew swaps <u>MUST</u> be tracked through the below QR code form as soon as known, <u>no later</u> than 1800 on the day prior to the swap. If the new crew member is the primary operator and any information in the IAP is incorrect, correct information <u>MUST be provided</u> to the Division Supervisor immediately following the operational briefing/division breakout.
- > We prefer all members of a resource swap at once if possible. The crew swap form will need to be filled out for each individual crew member.
- > Replacement workers must provide proof of current annual training upon request.

Resource Advisor Message

<u>Objectives</u> – One objective of the fire suppression is to repair areas disturbed by fire suppression activities into a condition that does not negatively affect natural and cultural resources and will not create excessive erosion on the landscape. <u>Without compromising public</u> and firefighter safety:

- Reduce the potential for soil erosion and sedimentation.
- Repair roads and drainage structures to a functioning condition.
- Avoid driving any kind of machinery on severely burned soils.
- Reduce the visual impacts of fire line as well other suppression activities when feasible.
- Avoid dragging large trees across soils, especially severely burned soils.
- Avoid driving machinery on moist soils.
- Avoid bucking up large, downed wood. Leave logs in as long of piece as possible.
- Leave no trace. Pack out trash if cans are overflowing, avoid leaving trash next to overflowing trash cans.

General Road Rules

Roads can be damaged easily during rainfall events. Signs of road distress include the following:

- Surface deformities such as: potholes, soft spots, ruts, etc. greater than 2" deep
- Pooling water, indicating drainage not functioning as designed.
- Slurry or conditions that causes loss of traction.
- Utilize 4-wheel drive on gravel roads in order to reduce impacts to the road surface.

Roads with signs of distress should not be driven on. Work with REAFs to implement erosion control measures.

General Water Bar Specifications:

- Facing the slope, standing at the bottom of a repair feature or existing water bar, the next water bar constructed should be placed at eye level.
- Water bars should be constructed into compacted soil and not constructed by simply pushing up loose soil and duff.
- Water bars should direct runoff away from the burned area where possible (into the green).
- Water bars should have out-sloped trenching at 30-45 ° from perpendicular to the fire line.
- Assure that the downslope end of the water bar is open and has adequate length to allow free flow of water off the line.
- Logs can be incorporated into water bars if they are embedded or anchored in a trench.
- Slash can be placed below outlet of water bar to help slow runoff and help collect sediment.




