

Strategic Framework:

The Morgan Fire is utilizing full suppression strategies and tactics that provide the highest likelihood of success while mitigating risks to responders. Values at risk include human safety, industrial timber lands, active timber sales of federal lands, range allotments, private property, and recreational resources.

Management Objectives:

- Ensure the safety and well-being of emergency responders and the public by making timely risk-informed decisions that align with values at risk.
- Protection of private timber lands, private property, range allotments, and recreational resources.
- Foster good relationships with local cooperators, industrial timber land and range allotment stakeholders, and the public by providing coordinated, accurate and timely information.
- Treat each other with dignity and respect and act in a professional manner on the fire and in the community.
- Manage cost commensurate with values at risk by coordinating with the Agency Administrators and Incident Business Advisor.

Control Objectives:

- Defend successful direct suppression line to protect structures, private land, and active logging to the north.
- Keep fire contained to the roadless area to protect industrial timber, active logging operations and private land to the south.
- Implement a full suppression strategy that minimizes acres burned utilizing direct attack when feasible to do so.

DISCUSSION...An upper-level low will move away from the fire on Friday, allowing winds to be less in general on Friday. Humidity values will also trend lower Friday and Saturday. Overnight conditions will be chilly with frost likely overnight and good humidity recoveries. Winds will increase on Saturday and will be gusty. Then, a broad Pacific trough will impact the fire starting late this weekend through early next week, with increasing chances of wetting rain and gusty south winds.

INCIDENT Morgan Fire DATE: September 22, 2023 SHIFT: Day/Night

- **Driving Hazards:** Transportation routes include rough, narrow roads with limited pull-outs and blind curves. Heavy equipment and transports on or near roads can slow travel times. Cattle can be present on road systems. Many roads are not signed adequately. Public traffic is present on roads in the fire area. **Mitigations-** Watch your speed. Slowing down is the best way to buy time to allow for avoiding hazards. Drive defensively, turn on your headlights, and fasten your seatbelt! Be able to stop within half of your sight distance on non-paved roads to avoid head on collisions. Be mindful of school zones and speed limits in the community of Lakeview.
- **Steep Terrain**: Rocks may be loose and coming down in the burn area. Being hit with even a small rolling rock can result in serious injury. Falling trees in the burned area can travel long distances downslope. Slips trips and falls can happen when rocks roll out or soil shifts under your feet. Falls that include a downhill roll can be especially dangerous. **Mitigations** Keep scanning the area uphill of your location to watch for rolling hazards. Pay extra attention to your footing. Call out observed hazards. Don't walk while distracted. Don't work below operating equipment. As you move and start work in a new location, think about where you will go if a roller comes down at you. Mind your spacing as you work and move.
- **Heavy Equipment:** Heavy equipment poses significant risk to personnel and vehicles in the area. Heavy equipment operators have limited visibility, especially in steep terrain with dense fuels. Equipment can knock rocks, trees, and other material loose. **Mitigations**-Ensure communications are in place with equipment operators before work begins. Use HEQBs for accountability and communications. Maintain a minimum of 100' exclusion area around working equipment, and increase to 2 ½ times tree height when in timber.
- **Risk Management:** Have you looked at hazards up, down and around? Is the risk you and your personnel are taking worth the reward? Have you thought about the consequences if something goes wrong? Have instructions been given and understood? Are strategies and tactics working? Have you reviewed the medical plan? Is there a better, safer way to accomplish the task at hand?
- **Be Ready For An IWI:** Practice your Incident within Incident response. Know your role in it. Expect the unexpected. Long response times can be encountered on this incident. Know where your line medics, ambulances, and potential landing zones are before you need them.

Coping With Stress

- Take breaks from watching, reading, or listening to news stories, including those on social media. It's good to be informed but hearing about the traumatic event constantly can be upsetting. Consider limiting news to just a couple of times a day and disconnecting from phone, tv, and computer screens for a while.
- **Take care of yourself.** Eat healthy, exercise, get plenty of sleep, and give yourself a break if you feel stressed out.
- Take care of your body.
 - Take deep breaths, stretch, or meditate.
 - Try to eat healthy, well-balanced meals.
 - Exercise regularly.
 - o Get plenty of sleep.
 - o Avoid excessive alcohol, tobacco, and substance use.
 - o Continue with routine preventive measures.
- Make time to unwind. Try to do some other activities you enjoy.
- **Talk to others.** Talk with people you trust about your concerns and how you are feeling. Share your problems and how you are feeling and coping with a parent, friend, counselor, doctor, or pastor.
- Connect with your community- or faith-based organizations.
- Avoid drugs and alcohol. These may seem to help, but they can create additional problems and increase the stress you are already feeling.
- Recognize when you need more help. If problems continue or you
 are thinking about suicide, talk to a psychologist, social worker, or
 professional counselor.


