Hot and dry conditions will be compounded by warm overnight lows in the mid to upper 60s and poor humidity recoveries to around 40 percent at best. Expect relatively light northwest winds around 5 to 10 mph Sunday afternoon, with winds turning more northerly Sunday evening and then easterly around 5 to 10 mph overnight Sunday. Winds will shift back to the northwest around 5 to 10 mph for Monday afternoon, with slightly higher gusts on nearby ridges. In addition to the hot, dry, and breezy conditions, also expect increasingly unstable conditions each of the next few afternoons. A Red Flag Warning will go into effect at midnight Saturday night and remain in effect through Monday evening for Willamette National Forest to account for these critical fire weather conditions.</p>



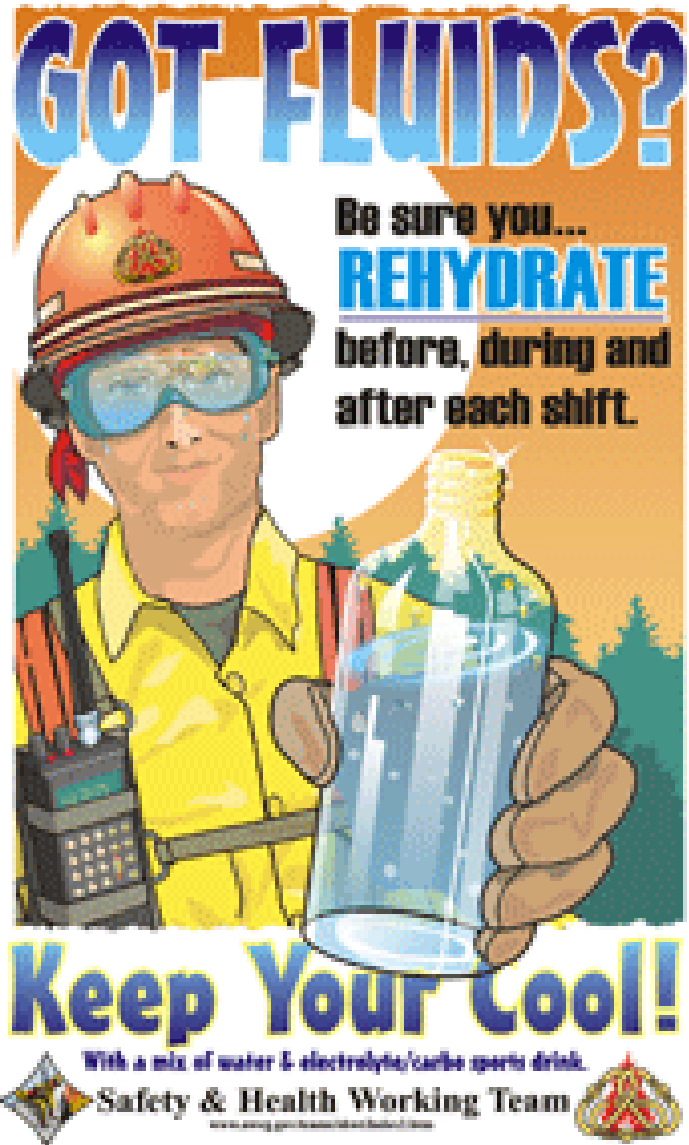

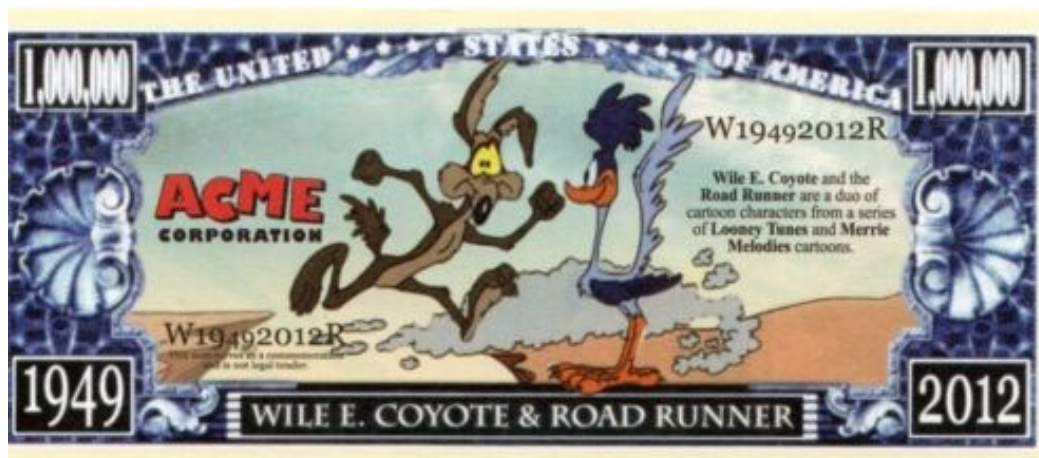

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
