

This forecast is valid for Saturday, September 30 for fires on the Cowlitz Complex. For elevation reference based on the latest available IR imagery, the Grassy Fire was ~2600-4150 ft, the Bear Creek Fire ~5100-5400 ft, the Jackpot Fire ~2500-3250 ft, and the Mission Fire ~4000-4600 ft.

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** A ridge high pressure will continue to build into the Pacific Northwest, allowing for additional drying and a quick warming trend.

**FORECAST FOR TODAY:** Mostly Clear (25%) and dry.

**OUTLOOK FOR SUNDAY-SUNDAY NIGHT:** The upper level ridge of high pressure will remain overhead. Patchy morning fog is expected Sunday morning over the Cowlitz River Valley, dissipating around 0900. The sky will become partly cloudy (40%) in the afternoon. Sunday looks to be the warmest day through at least Tuesday, with highs in the 60s with a few 70 degree readings across the lowest elevations. During the day, relative humidity values will fall to 40-49%. Winds will remain light, mainly out of the northwest during the day at 3-9 mph, with a few gusts nearing 15 mph above 4000 feet and on exposed ridges. The Chance of Wetting Rain (CWR>0.25") is 0% through Sunday night.

**OUTLOOK FOR MONDAY-WEDNESDAY:** The upper level ridge of high pressure is expected to flatten out with another trough swinging through the fire area Monday into Tuesday. This will bring low chances of showers for Monday, diminishing on Tuesday. Forecast uncertainty increases significantly Wednesday. At this point, another warmup is anticipated through the rest of the week, with little to no additional rain.

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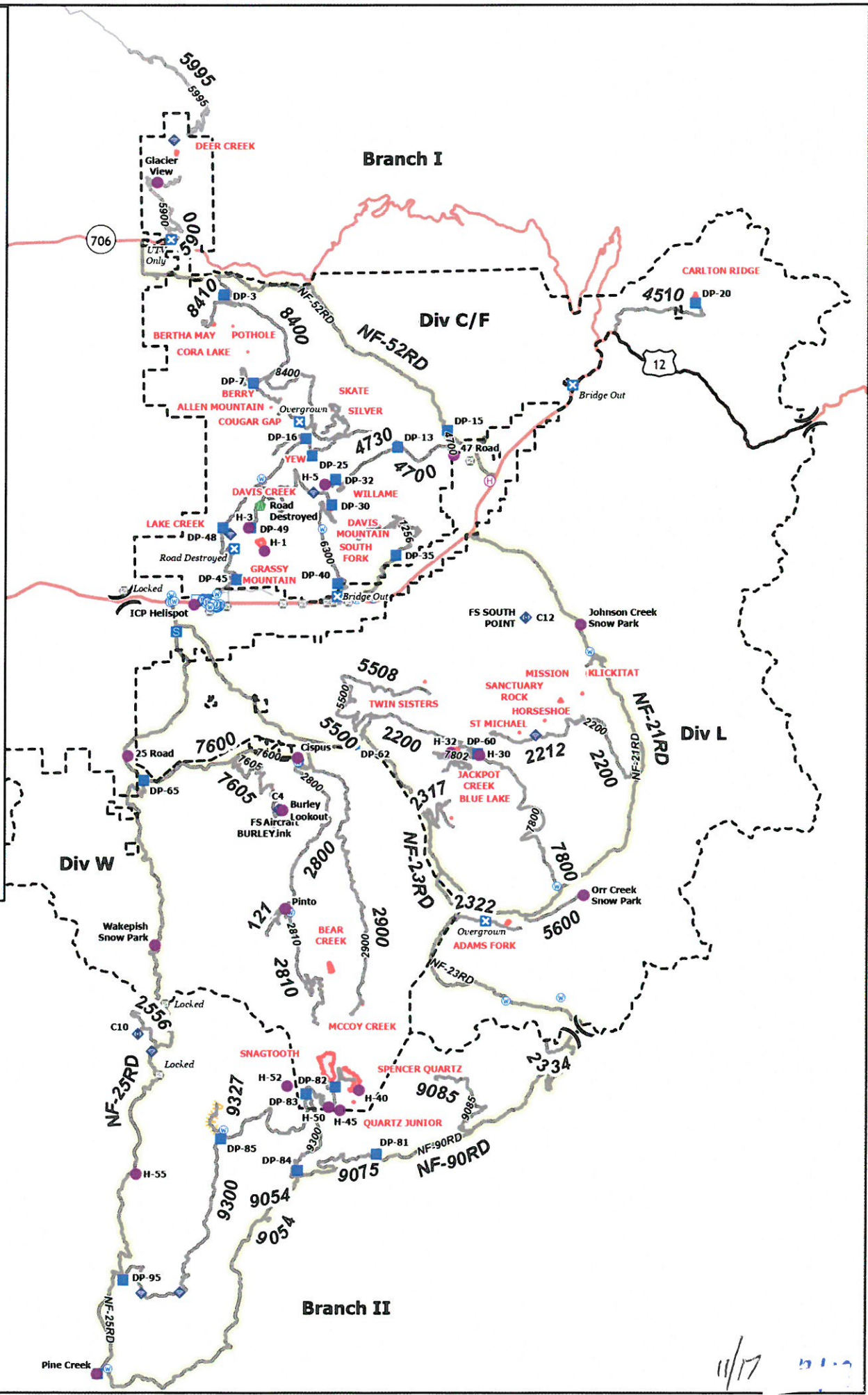

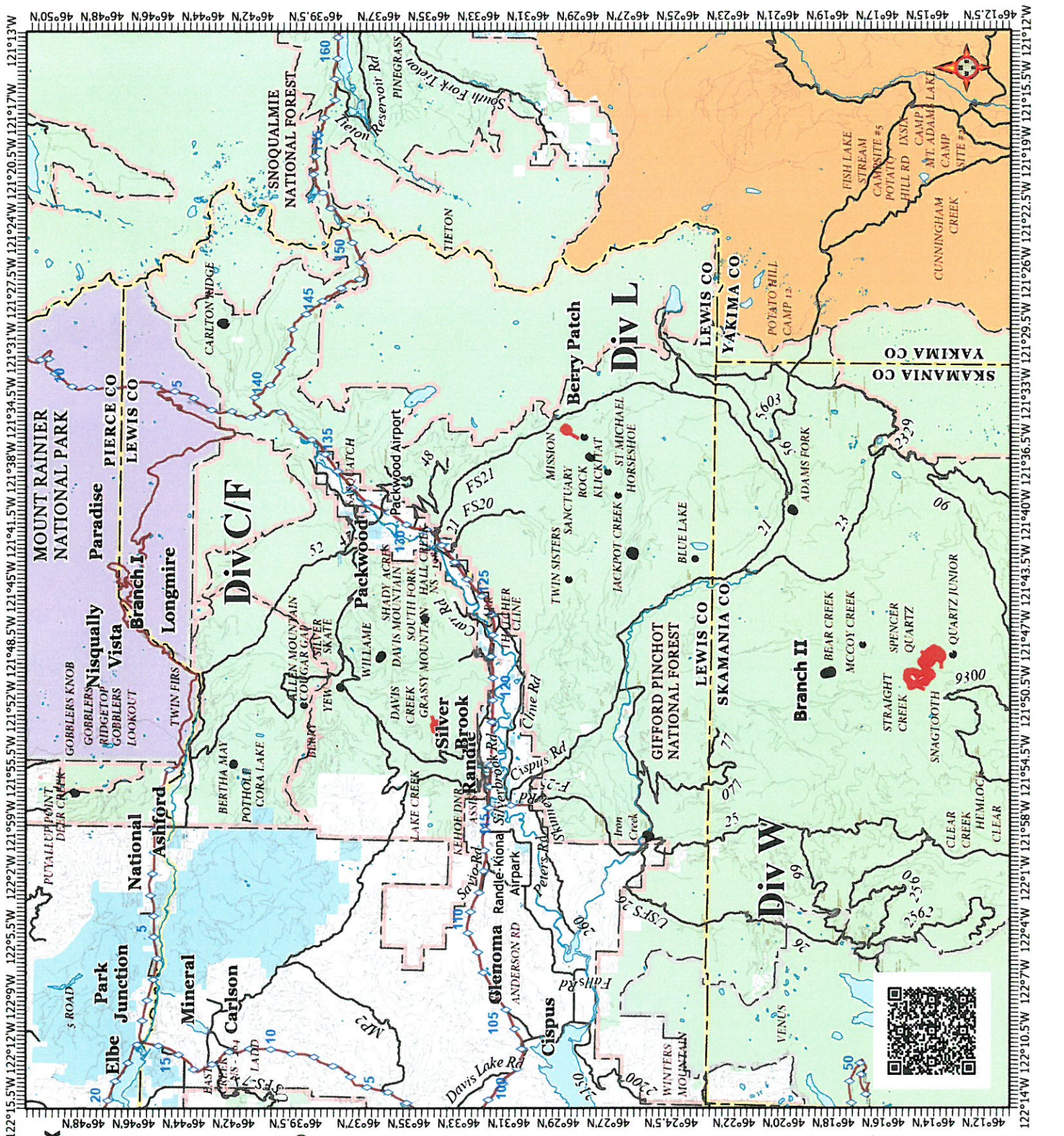

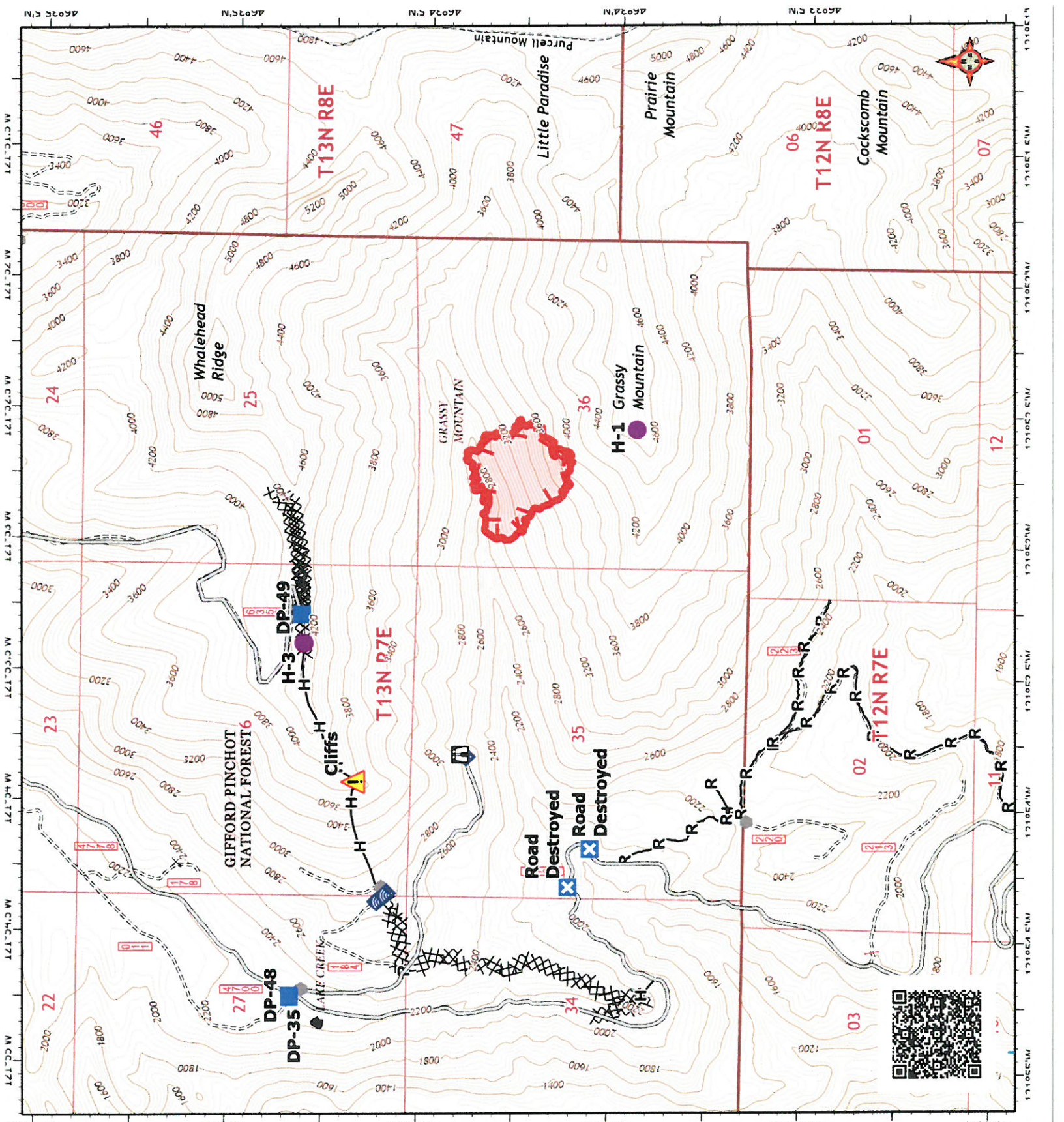
