Day Operations: 0600-2000

Management Objectives:

Ensure Firefighter and Public Safety.

- Protection of Property and Wildland Urban Interface.
- Protection of Utilities and Critical Infrastructure.
- Protection of Natural Resource Values.
- Collaboration with the community, local cooperators, stake holders, and media regarding fire activities and status updates.
- Manage incident costs commensurate with the values at risk. Coordinate and communicate costs with the Agency Administrators and Incident Business Advisors.

Control Objectives:

- Minimize fire growth to existing fire perimeter, providing for firefighter and public safety.
- Mop-up to minimize the potential of damage to any remaining structures within the fire area.
 This can be achieved by an IR evaluation of a 150-foot perimeter of "no heat" around remaining structures. In areas where this is not practical due to hazardous conditions, identify and map those areas so that they can be monitored and a consumption strategy can be utilized.
- Maintain public roadways and travel corridors.
- Continue hazard and damage assessments within the fire perimeter.

<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION</u>: Steady rains will impact the fire through midday and taper off in the afternoon. This will promote much cooler temperatures and high humidity values. Winds will remain steady out of the southwest throughout the day with the strongest speeds during the morning and slowly coming down in the afternoon and evening. Be cautious of fire weakened trees given the projected wind speeds. Drier conditions return Wednesday evening but clouds will be on the increase overnight with light showers spreading toward the fire early Thursday morning.

WEDNESDAY:

WEATHER: Cloudy with rain. Breezy southwest winds through the day. Rain tapering off in the afternoon.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE: 65-68°

MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 50-54%

20-FOOT WINDS:

• Southwest 10 to 18 mph with gusts 25 to 30 mph decreasing southwest 8 to 13 mph in the afternoon.

CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN (≥ 0.10"): 70% before 1300 hours

LIGHTNING ACTIVITY LEVEL: 1

HAINES INDEX: 2 (1 – stability, 1 – dryness component)

MIXING HEIGHTS/INVERSIONS: Little to no inversion in the morning mixing to 3400 feet in the afternoon. **AVIATION:** Gusty and persistent southwest winds through midday with gusts near 25 mph. Rain with ceilings as

low as 1100 feet in the morning lifting to 4500 feet in the afternoon.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy. Chance of light showers after 0300 hrs.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURE: 54-58°

MAXIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 80-90%.

20-FOOT WINDS:

• Southwest to south 9 to 13 mph gusts to 18 mph.

CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN (≥ 0.10"): 5%

LIGHTNING ACTIVITY LEVEL: 1

MIXING HEIGHTS/INVERSIONS: Little to no surface inversions. Stable layer near 600 feet in the evening lifting to 1600 feet overnight.

EXTENDED OUTLOOK: A trough of low pressure will become established over the Northwest Thursday and sag southward into Oregon by the weekend. Cooler than normal temperatures will continue on Thursday with heavy cloud cover and a 50% chance for light showers. Temperatures will remain in the 60s. Rain chances decrease closer to 10% or less by Friday and Saturday with temperatures warming back into the 70s.

FUELS:

GENERAL: Primary fuel types are timber with grass understory and scattered riparian areas with aspen stands. Agriculture fields include standing wheat, wheat stubble, and irrigated grass/hay. Timber litter is fluffy. Grasses are mostly to fully cured. Fine dead fuel moisture (FDFM) levels have risen significantly, currently well above critical levels. Thousand-hour fuel moisture remains static around 13%.

Local fire danger index ERC is below the 80th percentile and is trending lower.

TOPOGRAPHY:

GENERAL: The area in and around the fire is generally flat with ~300 feet elevation changes across the landscape. Small rocky ridges, low-lying riparian areas, and small lakes are scattered throughout the fire.

General/Potential Fire Behavior:

TODAY: Observed fire behavior will likely be at minimal levels today. Probability of ignition is low; however, minimal spread potential remains for fuels in dry areas such as under tree canopies, matted grasses, and dense riparian vegetation.

SPECIFIC:

ALL DIVISIONS: Remaining pockets of interior heat with continued creeping, and smoldering are possible. Ground fuels (sub-terrain) will continue to smolder. Breezy conditions may be strong enough to cause fire weakened trees to fall at various times during the day.

NIGHT SHIFT: Fire activity should remain at minimal levels overnight. See fire weather forecast for timing of wind and chance of precipitation.

AIR OPERATIONS:
