#### **FIRE BEHAVIOR**

**GENERAL:** the primary feature driving the fire is the Columbia River and its interaction with the topography within and adjacent to the fire. Gusty westerly winds are common in the foothills and accelerate when combined with the daily diurnal flow to higher terrain to the north and deep north-south oriented drainages. Fine fuels dominate the fire area and are quick to respond to changes in relative humidity and wind. Patchy oak savannah is also present within the fire perimeter.

#### Today's Fire Behavior

Find Dead Fuel Moistures will be in the 2-3% range. Spot fires or new starts will be very resistant to control. Mechanized and/or aerial resources are likely to be needed for direct attack where decadent brush is present with grass or ungrazed coarse grass exists and is exposed to 20' winds. Watch the channeling effect of wind and drainage alignment! Several past large fires have been the result of drainage and diurnal/wind alignment.

#### Specific

<u>Div. A and Div. G to DNR land in section 36:</u> Watch for thermal belt/inversion setup. Fire behavior can pick up rapidly upon transition from a stable airmass to an unstable environment.

The rest of Div. G/M and Div. W: conditions are favorable for holding and mopup. Have lookouts monitor the transport wind direction today.

AIR OPERATIONS: Gusty afternoon winds may impact light aircraft.



- RECOGNITION Stress Sizeup
- MITIGATION Stress First Aid

Watch for indicators that you or your crew are stressed. Also, these daily strategies can help us keep stress at bay:

- Take good care of your body each day. Eating right, exercising, and getting enough sleep help your body handle stress much better.
- Stay positive and practice gratitude, acknowledging your day's or life's good parts.
- Accept that you can't control everything. Find ways to let go of worry about situations you cannot change.
