

High pressure over the area will make for quiet and clear weather through at least early next week. Breezy winds will subside by the end of the day, leading into gradually warming conditions through the weekend. Winds will then become light and terrain-driven, however RH recoveries will become poor under warmer and drier conditions.


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



SAFETY MESSAGE

Incident: South/Roza Slope Date: September 14, 2023

Major Hazards and Risks:

Rattlesnakes Roads Steep Ground Bees Powerlines

Dehydration Traffic/public Dry Accountability/Communication

Maintain good hydration, hydrate early and stay hydrated. Know the signs of heat related injury and treatment (PG 110 IRPG)

Practice your defensive driving skills. Keep your speed down, lights on, seat belts on, and give the other person the right of way. Wash your windows and lights routinely and keep vehicle interiors free of trash and litter. SR 821 is a traffic corridor.

Be aware of overhead hazards. Know your surroundings and where your smoke is going.

Communications: Ensure communications are in place and all personnel know frequencies. Ensure all personnel have received instructions and they are understood. Ensure all personnel know operational assignments and emergency procedures.

Steep and rocky terrain make foot travel hazardous.

Critters: Rattle Snakes, Bees, wasps, hornets are all here! (Incident within an Incident protocols)

Hydration

Drink fluids throughout operational period (water and sports drinks) Avoid Energy drinks.

Follow work/rest guidelines.

Set a reasonable work pace and allow adequate rest breaks.

Use buddy system to monitor personnel of heat related and fatigue issues.

For heat related injuries refer to the IRPG page 110 and initiate IWI protocols as necessary.

Ensure adequate caloric intake.

Directing Helicopter Bucket Drops

⇒Give general location on the incident.

- ⇒Finalize location with: Clock direction straight in front of the aircraft is 12 o'clock; the right door is 3 o'clock; the tail is 6 o'clock; and the left door is 9 o'clock. When giving directions, remember that helicopters generally orbit in a clockwise pattern. Describe prominent landmarks don't say "I'm wearing a yellow shirt", "I'm by a big tree", etc. Use a signal mirror (a compass works fine) or a 2-3 foot piece of flagging tied to a long stick. Stand in drop location (when safe) for ID, then move away before the drop.
- ⇒Visualize what the pilot sees from the air and describe the target.
- ⇒Describe the target from your location and explain the mission. The pilot will decide drop technique and flight path, or you can ask the pilot for a hover drop or line drop in a given direction.
- ⇒Assure pilot that all personnel are safe and they know the aircraft's intentions before the drop.
- ⇒Give feedback to the pilot about drop accuracy. Be honest and constructive. Let pilot know if drop is early, late, uphill, downhill, etc. The pilot wants to provide you with the best support possible.

Remember: The Pilot Has Final Say On Drops

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON-SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.
