As weather and other factors limit the viability of field work, adjust the amount of resources assigned to the incident to the minimum required resources. 3. Follow COVID-19 CDC and established local, state, and national guidance to ensure a healthy work environment. Covid direction has been provided by the Forest. 4. Continue to patrol areas of recent heat, including the North Fork Slopover and the Pingree Park area as needed. 5. Prioritize the development of strategies and implementation of actions that protect communities above other resource values. 6. Communicate proactively with adjacent agency staffs, cooperators, permittees, and stakeholders by having effective and timely dialogs, meetings, and comprehensive information sharing.

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

An upper level system moving over the area Friday morning will bring another 1-2" of snow in upslope flow. The snow will taper off in the evening as winds switch to westerly. Another quick moving system will pass overhead Saturday bringing slightly colder temperatures and more snow. This system is stronger compared to Friday's system, however flow over the fire will stay westerly which tends to lessen the chance for bigger snowfall. Conditions should dry up Saturday evening with skies clearing as well as a ridge pushes in for warmer and drier conditions Sunday. Westerly winds will increase Sunday and especially Monday as another weak system pushes in from the NW. Gusts may be in the 35-45 mph range Sunday night into Monday night. From Tuesday onward, an overall northwesterly flow remains over the area through the rest of the week, keeping mostly dry conditions and near average temperatures.

WEATHER: Light snow in the morning and early afternoon, diminishing into the evening. Snow accumulation up to 2 inches.

CAMERON PEAK COVID EXPECTATIONS AND PROCEDURES

As we approach landing this incident and a lot of people traveling back to their home unit, and their actual homes, there may be some questions.

Should I get a test before I Demob?

Sure. It is highly recommended.

When can I get tested?

Daily at our COVID testing location in the Ram Conference room in the Hilton in Fort Collins. 0800 to 2000

TESTING WILL END AT 2000 on Sunday 12-13-2020

No appointment necessary . . .just come on in.

Will I be notified with the results?

If you test positive to COVID19 through a test on this incident you WILL be notified by phone. Even after you leave the incident.

If you test negative you will not be notified.

How long will it take to get result back from my test?

Right now it takes approximately 24 hours to receive results but varies with lab delivery times.

If I do not receive information from my test can I find out if I tested negative for COVID19?

Yes. The lab that processes the tests will have record of the results of your test and you can call the Arapaho & Roosevelt National Forests Safety Manager to request them.

Can I just call the COVID 24 hour number?

Nope . . .it aint operating anymore. Dave Canning (231-878-5919) is the COVID Mitigation Specialist and will be available until Monday (12-14-2020) morning.

Am I safe traveling home?
