

DISCUSSION...

A ridge of high pressure to the north and a trough to the east will keep the wildfire under northeasterly flow Monday with some gusts reaching around 20 mph in the afternoon. Moisture then begins to increase from the south late Monday night bringing a chance for scattered showers and storms Tuesday afternoon. The increased moisture will cause daytime humidities to increase. Some of the showers and storms will also bring heavy rain and some gusty surface winds. Afternoon showers and storms will be common for the rest of the week.
