#### 3. Objective(s):

Objectives for Firefighters and Public Safety

- Reduce risk to incident personnel and the public through a strategic risk management process and subsequent risk analysis, which includes conversations on tradeoffs with Agency Administrators, partners, and stakeholders.
- Minimize the spread of COVID-19 and other infectious diseases by following CDC guidance and practicing good personal hygiene practices.

Objectives for Protection of Values at Risk

- Minimize impacts to residences, commercial properties, critical community infrastructure, the communities of Halsey and Thedford, ranches, livestock, watering wells, pastures, electrical infrastructure, Bessey Nursery, Bessey Ranger District Compound, Bessey Recreation Complex, railroad, and highways.
  - Utilize cost containment principles by managing costs commensurate with values at risk.

Objectives for Information and Relationships

- Provide timely and accurate information to Agency Administrators, cooperators, stakeholders, the public, County Sheriff's Office/Emergency Operations, and the media.
  - Maintain and enhance relationships with adjoining agencies, cooperators, stakeholders, permittees, and local communities.

## 4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:

- 1. Manage risk to firefighters by ensuring hazards are identified, assessed, and mitigated, where possible. Be prepared to accept residual risk when values threatened warrant it and the probability of achieving objectives is high.
- 2. Utilize strategies and tactics that commit responders only to the operations where and when they can be successful, and under conditions where important values at risk are protected with the least exposure necessary.
- 3. Coordinate and communicate with residents, local cooperators, stakeholders, and media regarding the fire situation using media, press releases, social media, and personal contacts.
- 4. Utilize direct and indirect tactics to keep the fire north of the Dismal River, east of Highway 83 and west of Halsey. Limit fire growth on the north side of Highway 2.
- 5. Mop-up to the extent necessary to prevent the escape of the fire to prevent additional spread or damage to other values within the perimeter.
- 6. Implement practices that reduce the potential for spread of COVID-19 and other infectious diseases to firefighters, support personnel, and the public by ensuring the introduction of additional firefighting forces do not become vectors for the spread of disease among resident populations.

## General Situational Awareness:

- 1. Be aware of surroundings and mitigate hazards. Railroad crossings, rough roads, rugged terrain and sandy soils can pose concerns to firefighters.
- 2. Be prepared for changing weather conditions and constantly monitor conditions.
- 3. Prevent transmission of infectious disease by practicing good personal hygiene and following COVID-19 protocols.

High pressure will move into the state leading to mostly sunny skies throughout the day. High temperatures will be in be in the lower 70s—very close to seasonal norms. 

This fire season has been challenging especially in Nebraska, it is likely that you may be experiencing significant stressors. These stress reactions are completely normal and nothing to be ashamed of. It is important to acknowledge these stress reactions as normal and the importance of managing them through self-care and peer support. Taking care of yourself now enables you to be effective warrior, spouse, mom, or dad, brother, or sister.

Self-care is not an indulgence it is a discipline, it requires tough mindedness and a deep understanding of your personal priorities.

- O Self-care is saying "no" to something that you don't want to, even if people become upset.
- Self-care is allowing other people take care of themselves.
- Self-care is taking care of what really matters you.

Be honest with yourself and your family with open communication about your need for and the importance of self-care. Acknowledge which stress zone you are in daily and work to move to the green zone, resources are available, and you are not alone.

The state is working with local officials, responders, and the community to offer an opportunity for Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM). More information to follow as it becomes available.
