Low relative humidity values in the teens and gusty southwest winds of 10 to 15 mph with gusts up to 28 mph will result in critical conditions Tuesday afternoon. A Red Flag Warning has been issued for the area for Tuesday afternoon into Wednesday. A cold front moves through Wednesday with winds shifting to the northwest. The next chance of precipitation will come late Wednesday night into Thursday morning with rain changing to snow.

Drive defensively to the fire area. Yield to other motorists and think ahead. - Slow down!


Steep and Slippery Terrain – Watch where you step!




