- ~ Assess your new work environment! Is LCES in place? Are communications solid before engaging?
- ~ When aviation assets are working in your area, make sure you are aware of the hazards they create. Have communications with the pilot when working directly with the aircraft.
- ~ Never underestimate Mother Nature! Even highly trained and very experienced firefighters (you) can underestimate fire behavior, keep an eye on the weather.
- \sim While performing strategic suppression activities, be assertive in speaking up to your supervisor and expressing your thoughts about any safety concerns you may have.
- \sim Review the Medical Incident Report and IWI procedures, so you are prepared to use them.

The 10 Standard Fire Orders and the 18 Watch-Out Situations will guide our tactical decisions, and implementation of LCES is expected before engaging in all fireline operations.

FUELS:

Division A – The fuels consist of open stands of juniper at the lower elevations transitioning to more Ponderosa Pine with scattered Aspen groves at the higher elevations. Sagebrush and short grass along with pockets of heavy dead and down can be found on the surface.

Division Z – The fuels consist of a mixed stand of Subalpine Fir, Lodgepole, Ponderosa and Aspen with heavy loads of dead and down material on the surface. In the open areas, sagebrush and grass are present. Grasses and forbs can be found along Cow Creek.

Scattered areas of dead standing timber can be found on both divisions

Fuel conditions have moderated since reaching historic highs a week ago. The current ERC-Y is in the 70th percentile, which is just above average for this time of year. However, the 100- and 1000-fuel moisture content are at 13% and 12% respectively. At these moistures, expect the Sagebrush and heavy fuels to contribute to fire intensity

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

General:

Another warm, dry day will allow fire behavior to be active in areas still holding heat. Expect light to moderate surface fire activity in the heavy fuels. Single tree and or group tree torching can be expected. If roll out occurs and the fire becomes established, short uphill runs are possible.




