- 8. Do you understand that it is both your responsibility and your right to say no to orders that cannot be accomplished without compromising one or more of the Standard Fire Orders or without mitigating each of the Watch out Situations?
- 9. Can you describe the fire environment you are going to operate in?
- 10. Are you prepared to engage, monitor the fire environment, be proactive, and make adjustments?

Strong Gusty Winds as a Cold Front Approaches

FUELS:

Division A – The fuels consist of open stands of juniper at the lower elevations transitioning to more Ponderosa Pine with scattered Aspen groves at the higher elevations. Sagebrush and short grass along with pockets of heavy dead and down can be found on the surface.

Division Z – The fuels consist of a mixed stand of Subalpine Fir, Lodgepole, Ponderosa and Aspen with heavy loads of dead and down material on the surface. In the open areas, sagebrush and grass are present. Grasses and forbs can be found along Cow Creek.

Scattered areas of dead standing timber can be found on both divisions

Fuel conditions are starting to rebound. The current ERC-Y has rebounded back to the 90th percentile, which is above average for this time of year. With the predicted weather today. This could be short lived. The last live fuel moisture measured in Sagebrush was 122%, and the 100- and 1000- fuel moisture content are at 13% and 12% respectively. At these moistures, expect the Sagebrush and heavy fuels to contribute to fire intensity

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

General:

Predicted cooler temperatures, higher minimum relative humidity's will work in our favor tomorrow, however predicted winds may become problematic, at least until the fire line of showers come through in the afternoon. Expect areas of unburned pockets in DIVZ to continue to see surface fire with single tree and or group tree torching. Pay attention to the handline on the southeast side. With the forecasted winds, spotting could still be a problem. DIVA will continue to see creeping and smoldering in the heavy fuels.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Gusty winds could hinder air operations today

SAFETY:

Stay alert, don't become complacent! Small changes in fuel and weather conditions can equal big changes in fire behavior.







Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY NON-TRANSPORT INCIDENT:

Work through chain of command to report injured personnel to the Medical Unit Leader (MEDL).

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY:

Identify on-scene incident commander by name and position.

Announce "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" to initiate response from IMT communications / dispatch.
