FUELS:

Division A – The fuels consist of open stands of juniper at the lower elevations transitioning to more Ponderosa Pine with scattered Aspen groves at the higher elevations. Sagebrush and short grass along with pockets of heavy dead and down can be found on the surface.

Division Z – The fuels consist of a mixed stand of Subalpine Fir, Lodgepole, Ponderosa and Aspen with heavy loads of dead and down material on the surface. In the open areas, sagebrush and grass are present. Grasses and forbs can be found along Cow Creek.

Scattered areas of dead standing timber can be found on both divisions

The current ERC-Y is tracking just above the 90th percentile, above average for this time of year. The last live fuel moisture measured in Sagebrush was 122%, and the 100- and 1000- fuel moisture content are at 13% and 12% respectively. At these moistures, expect the Sagebrush and heavy fuels to contribute to fire intensity

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

General:

Unburned pocket of fuel will continue to burn out on in unburned interior pockets. Surface fire with an occasional torching tree may be observed as this happens. Other areas of the fire will see minimal fire behavior, mainly creeping and smoldering in the heavy fuels.

Demob Instructions

Paperless and electronic demobilization will be utilized to the extent possible for all resources.

DEMOB: This should be done virtually; All Finance documents will be emailed and signed virtually.

- 1. Ensure all Final CTR's and Shift Tickets have been submitted to Finance the night before your demob day. Project final work day and travel. If any questions, please contact Finance directly: 2022.sugarloaf.finance@firenet.gov
- 2. On demobilization day, please return any checked out items and visit weed wash (located in Rock River, WY, near ICP in the parking lot of Shawna's Café).
- 3. Please use the QR code on the front of the IAP to fill out the demob form. For any question, please use contact information provided below.
- 4. If you are demobing and wanting to be reassigned, please see the contact information below.

AIR TRAVEL - All resources requiring air travel to their home unit MUST notify DEMOB 48 hours in advance of their scheduled departure date in order to schedule flights to their home units.

WORK/REST GUIDELINES - All resources must be able to arrive at their home unit prior to 2200 hours unless specifically approved by the Incident Commander. Changes, delays and limited flight availability created by air transportation schedules will be taken into consideration. 


