Safety Starts Here

Safety : Transition

Risks to fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer/transition periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident. Many fatalities, serious injuries or incidents with potential have occurred during transition periods. Be proactive in mitigating the risks by proper implementation of LCES—Lookout, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones.

Factors for increased risks to fireline personnel during transition periods include:

- No, or poor, briefing of incoming personnel
- Lack of fire weather and behavior information, both forecast and observed
- Communications; face-to-face briefings may not be possible and radio frequencies may be overextended and/or changing due to the increased demands on the system.
- Initial attack resources may not have checked-in and the Incident Commander may not be aware of the number, type and location of all resources.
- Location of safety zones and escape routes may not be known and communicated to all resources.

Mitigation actions to take:

- Lookouts: Post and maintain your own lookouts.
- Communications: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources while you are developing communications with incoming adjacent resources and your new supervisor.
- Escape routes and safety zones: Identify escape routes and assure incoming resources are aware of their locations; be aware that your original escape routes and safety zones may no longer be accessible due to changing fire behavior or your increased distance from them.

Safety

Your safety, and the safety of the public, is our primary commitment. All activities must reflect this commitment. The commitment to and accountability for safety is a joint responsibility of all team members, managers, and administrators. As a member of Team Black you are part of the overall team safety.

Engagement/Disengagement

Team Black will focus on safe, efficient, and cost-effective incident management leadership. The 10 Standard Fire Orders and the 18 Watch-Out Situations will guide our tactical decisions, and implementation of LCES is expected before engaging in fireline operations.

.DISCUSSION...

Red Flag conditions are expected to continue across the burn site through the rest of the afternoon, as the expected wind shift to gusty westerly winds has helped to mix down drier air across the area. A few showers will be possible across the burn site as well through 4 pm, though any precipitation would be light and produce more gusty and erratic winds.

The gusty westerly winds look to diminish through the early evening becoming light generally easterly into the overnight hours. However, gusty westerly winds are expected to develop once again late Thursday morning and into the afternoon, with another Red Flag Warning in place across the burn site on Thursday.

GENERAL:

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Probability of Ignition=100% during peak weather conditions. Light, flashy fuels are carrying the fire. Conditions of low relative humidity and dormant fuels and very low fuel moisture increase potential for rapid fire growth from any new starts.

Primary fuels are grass and leaf litter. Riparian bottoms have heavy grass thatch and lots of dead and down logs. Further away from the river, the grasses are shorter and there are agricultural fields that will slow the fire spread.

Past: Both fires did not have any perimeter growth. There were dead and down logs burning for most of the day. The fires were tested by strong winds through the afternoon and stayed in the black. Rate of spread was low and flame lengths were less than a foot.


SPECIFIC:


All Divisions: Expect minimal activity in the morning with low temps and higher humidity. Starting mid morning, if the red flag conditions develop, expect to see smokes from dead and down logs throughout the burn area. Any ember into unburned fuels will have rapid rates of spread and flame lengths of 10+ ft depending on the fuels. Expect dead and down fuels to burn out through the day and night. Most fire activity is through dead and down fuels. Little perimeter spread is expected.

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications / dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
