GENERAL:

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Probability of Ignition=100% during peak weather conditions. Fine Dead Fuel moisture= 2%

Light, flashy fuels are carrying the fire.

Combination of low relative humidity, dormant fuels and very low fuel moisture increase potential for rapid fire growth from any new starts.

Primary fuels are dead grass and leaf litter. Riparian bottoms have heavy grass thatch and lots of dead and down logs. Further away from the river, the grasses are shorter and there are agricultural fields that will slow the fire spread.

Past: Neither fire had any perimeter growth or active burning. There were still some dead and down logs burning throughout the day.

SPECIFIC:

All Divisions: Expect minimal activity in the morning with low temps and higher humidity. Starting mid morning, it is possible to see smokes from dead and down logs throughout the burn area.

Any ember into unburned fuels will have rapid rates of spread and flame lengths of 10+ ft depending on the fuels. No perimeter spread is expected.

.DISCUSSION...

Critical fire weather conditions have been slow to develop today but a couple hours of westerly winds 10-20 mph will be possible through early evening. Winds will decrease overnight but will pick up again on Friday. The question will be if winds will be strong enough to warrant a Red Flag Warning. Conditions may be close, but for now, a Fire Weather Watch remains in effect for Friday as we hone down the details of the position and timing of a cold front which is expected to push through the area at some point on Friday. For now this front looks like it will bring a northeast wind shift into the fire area around 8 PM.



It can take up to 72 hours to process.

Weedwash

There is no weedwash station available at the incident.
All vehicles that left paved roads must go through a commercial car wash.

Crew Swaps & Extensions

All crew swaps and extension requests must be initiated through your fire supervisor at least 72 hours prior to your scheduled demobilization.

Demob Steps

1. Return all supplies, radios, etc. that were checked out.
2. Submit time for all personnel and equipment to finance.
3. All vehicles that have been to the fireline must go through a car wash.
4. Receive a copy of your OF-288 and/or other financial documentation from Finance.
5. Complete the Demob Checkout Sheet using the QR Code located on the IAP cover.
6. Once you submit the Demob Checkout Sheet you are released and may travel home.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY NON-TRANSPORT INCIDENT:

Work through chain of command to report injured personnel to the Medical Unit Leader (MEDL).

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY:

Identify on-scene incident commander by name and position.

Announce "**MEDICAL EMERGENCY**" to initiate response from IMT communications / dispatch.

USE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS TO COMMUNICATE THE SITUATION TO COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH

- CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH** (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)
Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."
- INCIDENT STATUS:** Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.
Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
