WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Expanding high pressure from the east will result in considerably lower rainfall chances today, and a decrease in relative humidity. A brief period of RH in the upper teens isn't out of the question for the lower elevations in the afternoon. Prevailing south winds will continue, likely 1-3 mph stronger than yesterday. Some highs clouds will build in the afternoon.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Today will be warmer and drier with more sunshine and wind. Chances for precipitation are reduced 20%. Winds will be out of the south to 10-15 mph with gusts to 25 mph on ridgetops. Any isolated thunderstorms will produce gusts to 30 mph.

FUELS SUMMARY:

Fuels in the fire area are composed primarily of timber with understory (mixed conifers with heavy litter and aspen stands). Heavy fuel concentrations of standing snags and large down dead are common in timbered areas. It is likely for fire to spread in concentrations of surface dead and down fuels which is promoting torching and spotting into receptive surface fuel beds. Aspen stands are currently retarding fire spread. Live surface fuels of grasses and forbs and brush are not promoting spread.

Strong winds and gusts from outflows can topple snags.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

General:

With warmer and drier conditions, where fire has held in concentrations of heavy dead fuels, fire activity will increase and creeping spread will be possible where there is fuel continuity. Live fuels will inhibit spread as will stands of aspen. Fire in these areas of heavy dead fuels will promote single and group tree torching which can produce spot fires in receptive fuel beds. Rates of spread will be moderate at best.

Specific:

On the Quartz Ridge fire, the highest potential for spread will continue to be on the west side of Quartz Creek in the southeast corner of the fire in areas of heavy concentrations of surface fuels. Spot fires on the east side of Quartz Creek still have heat showing in them and may begin to spread at a slow rate.

On the Bear Creek fire the potential for spread to the east and downslope towards Weminuche Valley still remains low. The highest potential for spread remains on the northwest side of the fire in Bear Creek towards the Little Sand and Shaw Creek trails.

SAFETY

Situational Awareness is a continuous process that is best accomplished with group input. Invariably others will recognize factors that you may overlook, and communication will be key. Use all your available tools to gather information to increase yours and your crews' awareness.

Fire fighter safety comes first on every fire, every time



MAJOR HAZARDS

- ✓ **Overhead Hazards** snags, widow makers, green trees weakened by fire, aviation drops in work area.
- ✓ **Driving** Stay vigilant with highway traffic. Turn headlights to be seen by others. Reduce speeds and watch out for non-fire traffic outside and within the fire area
- ✓ **Temperature Related Illness** Changing temperatures; drink fluids and monitor yourself throughout the shift.

Be Bear Aware!!

There have been reports of bears around the perimeter of fire camp.... here are a few tips to make sure you stay safe, and keep the bears safe as well.



- Ensure you don't keep any food or things that smell like food in your tent. Bears don't care...even tents look like food packages to them.
- Keep trash cleaned up and deposited in appropriate receptacles around camp.
- Don't feed the wildlife! They may look cute and cuddly, but you will be inviting trouble by inviting bears and other critters around and into camp.
- Bears tend to come back when they know food is available, keep a clean area around your vehicle and your campsite.

Something to consider..... Are you monitoring your health and the health of your crew?

- As the days get shorter and temperatures drop at night and we experience damp and wet conditions at the beginning of the day, make sure you are taking steps to stay dry. Allergies, asthma, and migraines can be exacerbated by damp and cold weather.
- On the opposite end of the spectrum, we are also experiencing hotter and drier weather during the middle of the day. Are you anticipating needing to stay hydrated? Don't let temperatures in the morning throw you off for the hot and dry weather in the middle of the day!

Please make sure you are taking care of yourself and your crewmembers, remember you are the most important asset out there!
