#### .DISCUSSION...

Monsoonal moisture has returned to the area but some changes have popped up in the latest forecast runs. The deepest moisture looks to remain to the west of the wildfire through much of the forecast period. Having said that, chances remain for some showers and thunderstorms to fire each afternoon and evening. Some gusty outflow winds and brief, heavy rain will be the biggest concerns.

#### . SATURDAY . . .

Sky/weather......Partly sunny (45-55 percent). Slight chance of showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon.

Max temperature....70-75.

Min humidity.....20-30 percent.

Wind (20 ft)......Upslope/Up valley 8 to 12 mph. Ridgetop winds will be southerly 10 to 12 mph. Gusty and erratic winds expected near thunderstorms in the afternoon.

Smoke dispersal....Good.

Haines Index.....3 or very low.

LAL..... until 1200, then 3.

Mixing height.....5400 ft AGL increasing to 7400 ft AGL in the afternoon.

Sky/weather......Partly cloudy (30-40 percent). Slight chance of showers and thunderstorms in the evening.

Min temperature....47-52.

Max humidity......64-69 percent.

Wind (20 ft)......Downslope/Down valley 2 to 6 mph. Gusty and erratic winds expected near thunderstorms in the evening.

Haines Index.....3 or very low.

LAL.....3 until 2100, then 2 until 2400, then 1.

Mixing height......5300 ft AGL decreasing to 600 ft AGL overnight.

#### .DISCUSSION...

Monsoonal moisture has returned to the region but the deepest moisture remains well to the west. Little change by tomorrow so while some showers and storms may fire over the San Juans, the wildfire should not see any of this activity. For Sunday, daytime heating and a slight uptick in available moisture WILL allow some afternoon convection to form so chances for a quick shower or storm increase. Biggest concerns will be gusty outflow winds and brief, heavy rain.

**Primary** This is your primary plan.

**A**lternate If your primary plan is compromised.

**C**ontingency If your alternate plan is compromised.

**E**mergency Action if the overall mission is compromised. This is the last resort.

- Three major planned events are now impacting the general area. The Four Corners Folk Festival, Colorado's Ride, and the Four Corners Motorcycle Rally. Major influx of people recreating for the weekend.
- Ensure your vehicles and personal items are secured. Visible valuables are a magnet for theft.
- Thunderstorms are possible the next 2 days with strong outflow winds.
   Potential for strong West/Southwest winds Monday. HEADS UP!
- As replacement resources arrive, give them the high quality briefing you would expect. Set them up to succeed and carry on your hard work!
- Remember your physical and mental health is most important. Take care of each other as well as yourself.
