#### **MAJOR HAZARDS**

Overhead Hazards — Snags and widow makers are a priority hazard. Review in the IRPG.

Traffic & Roads- Drive defensively! UTV traffic is heavy. Hunting season is open. Watch speed on washboard roads. Be aware of people, pack animals, etc off the roads. Remain alert for road construction.

Fatigue- This one's a marathon not a sprint! Don't lose focus on the overall mission. Mental fatigue can contribute to poor decision making. Take the time to rest yourself both PHYSICALLY and MENTALLY!

- Inspect your vehicle before heading to the line as well as right before you reach the pavement. Tires, signals, lights. Check your duals for rocks!
- The weather is trending cooler with possible thunder storms. Be prepared for changes in fire behavior.
- Drink plenty of fluids. Dehydration and overexertion can occur regardless of temperature.
- Be heads up for hunters and target shooters. Archery season just opened.
   Remain alert for target shooting towards roads around camps.
- Remember your physical AND mental health is most important. Take some time to decompress and relax when returning home. You've earned it!
