

WEATHER DISCUSSION

High pressure continues to hold across the western US into the upcoming weekend, keeping mild temperatures in place across southwest Colorado. Highs along the fireline will reach the mid to upper 50s each day, while lows in Pagosa Springs fall into the mid to upper 20s. The air will remain dry through the period, with overnight recoveries only reaching near 50 percent, before falling to 20 to 30 percent each afternoon. Winds will remain light through Friday, with slight southwest winds returning for Saturday. Sunday and Monday will see a more pronounced southwest winds develop, with gusts 20 to 25 mph on Sunday and around 20 mph on Monday. Cloud cover will be limited through the weekend. with mainly high cirrus each day through Monday.
