With the change to sleeping accommodations, make sure your vehicles and personal items are secured.

When felling trees please review Procedural Felling Operations in the IRPG.

As this incident continues to evolve, make sure to manage fatigue. Hydrate, eat, and insure that you are getting enough rest. Pace yourself and take rest breaks as needed!

Remember your physical and mental health is most important. Take care of each other as well as yourself.
