

All firefighters are public information officers when they are out in the community. Please share the following stats and talking points if you are asked questions by the public.

Quartz Ridge Stats

Start: Lightning started on August 5, 2023

Location: approximately 3 miles into the South San Juan Wilderness, 13 miles northeast of Pagosa Springs Acres: 2850

Rainfall since Sept. 10: 2.26"

Bear Creek Stats

Start: Lightning started on July 31, 2023

Location: approximately 2.5 miles west of the Weminuche Valley Acres: 1093

Rainfall since Sept. 10: 2.64"

- Firefighters are still actively engaged in monitoring both fires and will take action where/when needed and safe to do so.
- The fires are expected to produce smoke during dry and/or windy periods for the foreseeable future. Affected
 communities should remain aware of smoke advisories and conditions. For the latest air quality visit,
 https://www.airnow.gov/?city=Arboles&state=CO&country=USA
- The precipitation has been beneficial in slowing fire activity, but the fires are NOT out! Fire activity can and will quickly increase when the sun and/or wind dry out the fine fuels.

- As conditions permit, prescribed fires are taking place around the forest.
