3. Objective(s):

Leaders Intent: Protect human life. Firefighter and public safety will be given the highest priority at all times. Risks to firefighters and the public will be managed utilizing a risk-based approach to decision making.

Incident Objectives:

- Keep firefighters risk at reasonable levels necessary to meet objectives through aggressive risk management.
- Minimize negative impacts of identified values, utilizing point protection and full suppression strategies and area closures.
- Protect sensitive habitats and cultural resources by limiting fire suppression activity that may cause adverse impacts. Probabilities analysis and mitigation strategy identified.
- Provide for Public information using all available distribution methods, including social media options.
- Mop up to the extent necessary to lessen the likelihood of escape. Ensure administrators are informed and engaged on process.
- Maintain positive working relationships with the community, cooperators, and incident personnel.
- Observe fire progression in relation to M.A.P.S. provided in the long term management strategy, take action as necessary

General Situational Awareness:

Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees.

.DISCUSSION...

An upper low pressure system passing by to the south will draw some much needed mid and high level moisture up into the area for both Tuesday and Wednesday. Temperatures both days will be similar to those realized over the weekend and Monday, but an increase in cloud cover is expected along with better overnight RH recovery. Afternoon minimum RH readings should bottom out in the 20 to 25% range.

Plan on lighter downslope winds through the morning, then upslope/up valley flow developing by midday with gusts to 18 mph possible through mid to late afternoon.

Hazards and Risks: Driving, Hazard Trees, and Heavy Equipment

Hazard Trees: *Work is shifting into new areas of the fire. Check these new areas for snags and mitigate them before engaging in work. Some of these snags are not visible from roads but could easily reach you if they fall.*

Driving: *New work assignments may take you on new roads with hazards you have not seen before. Some of the incident roads are narrow with limited visibility and few pull-outs. Be sure to contact Division Sup before entering their Division to ensure road is clear before proceeding. Adjust your driving for smoke, dust and traffic. Watch out for wildlife and livestock.*

Heavy Equipment: *Dozers, are working on this incident. Don't approach heavy equipment until you are certain they have seen you and signaled for you to continue. Give them sufficient space on roads and in work areas.*

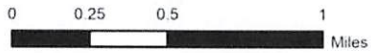

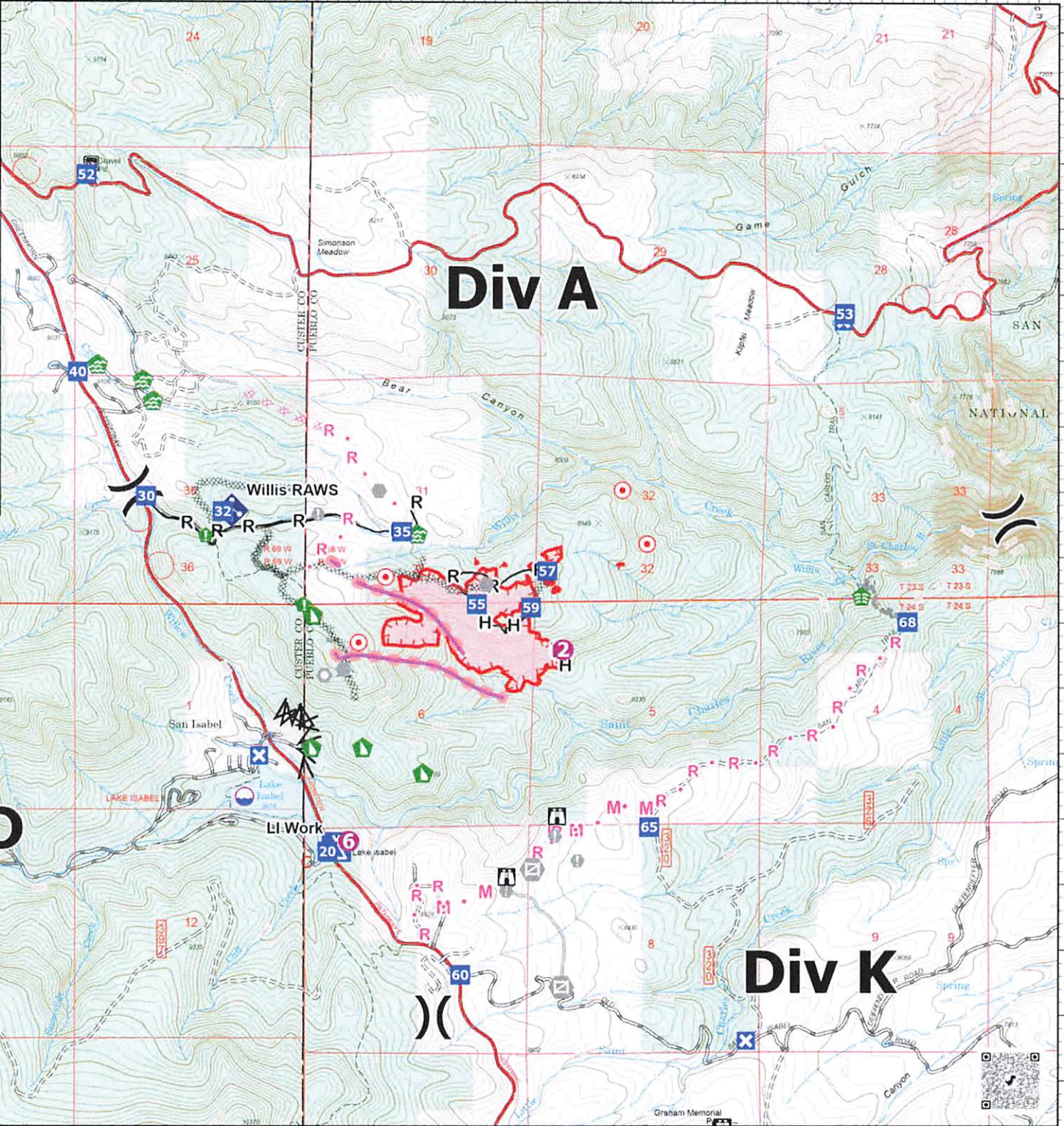
