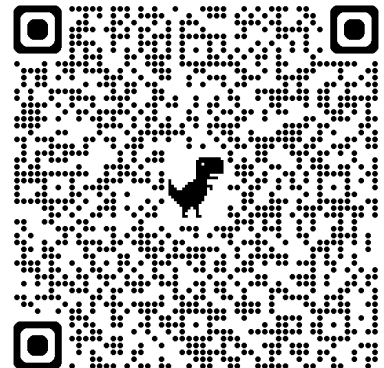

4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:		
Work to maintain strong positive relationships with local cooperators and private landowners. Ensure clear communication with all resources and cooperators. Ensure accountability of all resources.		
General Situational Awareness:		
Consider the potential for long transport times in case of injuries when developing work assignments. In many cases, especially on the west side of the fire ground transportation times will exceed the "golden hour". In case of yellow or red incidents, order the Guard Hoist aircraft immediately.

DISCUSSION...Mostly clear skies into Sunday afternoon. Minimum humidity for Sunday will be 10 to 13 percent. Southerly winds between 5 and 10mph for overnight before increasing to 11 to 14mph by 1pm. Winds gusting to 17 to 20mph during the afternoon hours. Southwest winds 9 to 12mph expected Monday. Showers and storms are not expected either day.
