Smoke dispersal.....Poor until 1000, then fair until 1700, then poor.



SAFETY MESSAGE

Fire fighter safety comes first on every fire, every time

We say we will never forget, but how do we do that.

On July 25, 2008, 18-year-old National Park Service wildland firefighter, Andy Palmer, was fatally injured in a tree falling accident on the Iron Complex burning on the Shasta-Trinity National Forest in California. Three hours and twenty-six minutes after he was injured, emergency medical personnel pronounced Andy dead at the Redding Airport. He never made it to a hospital. Let's honor Andy Palmer by Planning for a Medical Emergency. Ask 3 primary questions:

- 1. What are we going to do if someone gets hurt?
- 2. How will we get them out of here?
- 3. How long will it take to get them to a hospital?

Take time to review the medical plan (ICS 206) and medical incident report (MIR or 8 Line) and know where the closet medical equipment, Paramedic or EMT, ambulance and helispot is. Take some time today and train on an Incident Within an Incident (IWI). Honor Andy Palmer today!!

Big Changes

The weather has created the need to reevaluate the current strategy and there will be a change. Demobilizations will begin and folks will be heading to another fire or going home. Some will continue to support the La Plata Fire as we begin to downsize and I ask that you continue to maintain your situational awareness and deliberate risk decision making.

Remember, your assignment does not end till you get home, so stay engaged and drive to your next assignment or home safely.
