

**Prioritize Safety:** Ensure firefighter and public safety by implementing tactical operations that align with the values at risk, offer a high likelihood of success, and deploy the appropriate mix and quantity of resources to achieve mission objectives effectively.

**Strategic Suppression:** Guide fire behavior toward natural or constructed barriers, or into areas with more favorable fuel conditions, to minimize threats to private property, communities, infrastructure, watersheds, and other critical assets. When appropriate utilize the Incident Strategic Alignment Process to determine priorities and to create a longer term strategic plan.

#### 6. WEATHER FORECAST (Y/N)

Tuesday: Showers and storms will wane into the early morning hours, with another round of showers and thunderstorms expected to pick up in the late morning. Main impact concerns will be heavy rainfall with the chance for flash flooding over low-lying terrain, as well as the potential for debris flow in particularly steep or vulnerable areas. Temperatures will be similar to today, with highs in the low-60s. RH will drop to around 60 percent, thanks to ongoing monsoon moisture. Winds will generally be out of the southwest, with gusts of 10 mph or less. However, like today, a few embedded thunderstorms will be possible with the general rain showers, and if a stronger storm manages to form over the nearby terrain, gusty outflow winds and locally heavier rainfall will be possible.

Wednesday Onwards: Temperatures will warm a few degrees on Wednesday, staying consistent through the rest of this week. Winds will increase, with prevailing gusts out of the west 10-15 mph orso, though showers and storms may vary that slightly at times. The area will dry out slightly as the week goes on, with minimum humidity values dropping from 50-60 percent down to 35-40 percent by this weekend. Overnight RH recovery should be about to 55-60 percent or so. Showers and thunderstorms are expected each afternoon through the rest of this week and into the weekend, primarily over and near the mountains. Main impact concerns will be continued moderate to heavy rainfall, as well as previously mentioned flash flooding risks. A few stronger to possibly severe storms will be possible, particularly later in the week.

After being notified by your supervisor of your tentative release date:


Step 1. Return all supplies, radios, etc. that were checked out. If you have no items to return, you can complete Finance and Demob virtually.
